

AFFILIATION

The Club is affiliated with the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (South Australia State Centre).

OBJECTIVES

The Objectives of the Club are:-

- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and apparatus.
- (b) To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.
- (c) To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in life saving.
- (d) To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other Public Bodies in imposing facilities for bather.
- (e) To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property rights or privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure that I present for your consideration and adoption the 29th Annual Report and Financial Statement of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

My first year on the Committee after an absence on six years and what a shock the first Committee meeting was. Looking around I saw only 3 others who were on the Committee in season 1981/82 - Peter Sutton, Kev Watt and George Hann. What a turnover in personnel - no Mick Shead, no Peter Wooden, no Simon Linden and what's more there were 3 positions not filled. Matters got worse as we had 3 resignations from the Committee and the Treasurer and Social Secretary left for warmer climes due to employment transfer. Such an unsettled Committee and a few people sharing the heavy work load would have destroyed some clubs but to South Port's credit, members rose to the occasion, took up the vacant positions and the responsibility that goes along with it, and by State Titles time we had all positions filled but one and a young and enthusiastic Committee working well - surely this is a good sign for future seasons.

We did suffer a small decrease in membership again but this seems to have slowed and with the increased enthusiasm in our Junior area, there seems to be an indication of Club stability in membership. A letter drop was organised to seek new members in the Port Noarlunga and Seaford area with little response. I guess the idea that most members are brought into the movement by existing members still holds true.

Finances caused a great deal of concern early in the season but some judicious belt tightening and some hard work in the Canteen and Bar areas together with generous support from our many sponsors enabled us to reach a sound although not prosperous position by the seasons end. Clothing donated for sale by Sponsors K & W Soil Sampling, West End and U.V. generated much needed funds at the right time and Gavin and Colin Stagg's donation of the I.R.B. enabled us to have a piece of equipment which early in the season seemed an impossible dream. Thanks must go to Libby Maxwell for stepping into the Treasurer's position at short notice and coping so well with such a difficult job.

The power supply saga continues and after major submissions to the Department of Environment and Planning, the Noarlunga Council has now been made overseer of the project. Because E.T.S.A. has up-graded specifications the Council has had to seek tenders again and the project has bogged down again. The Club still has no official information on costs or grants available but at this stage is committed to supply labour for trenching. Maybe for next season????

The work demands on Committee members has certainly increased over the last 5 years and I urge all members to assist them in carrying out their tasks. I would also like to urge members to attend social functions which help raise money for the club. How many of the following functions did you attend? - Bingo night, New Years Eve Show, Games night, Surf and Stomp night and the Club Picnic Car Rally. All were great fun at a reasonable price so try to support the Social Committee next season.

I personally would like to thank Dave Watt, George Hann and Dick Olesinski for their assistance to me throughout the year and to congratulate the club on turning what initially looked like being a disastrous season into a year which was most successful and a step to future improvement.

Thanks must also go to our various Sponsors for their support during the year.

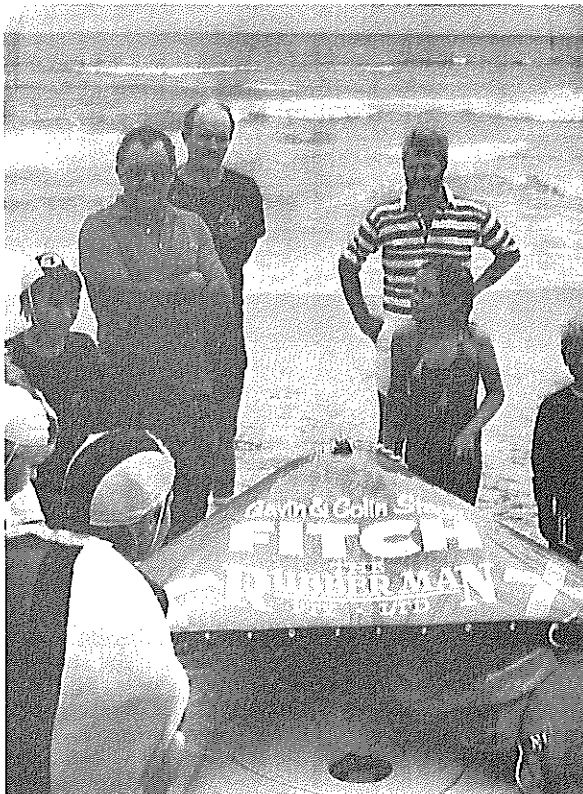
Congratulations to all Members who competed in State and National Titles and who helped keep the South Port S.A. name at a high standard.

I had and still have, a lot of respect for this guy, who was quiet in nature but did what he had to do and did a bit extra as well. Thanks once again Kev.

Congratulations must go to S. Hobbs on gaining the Most Patrol Hours for season 1987/88 - 95.25 hours. Fantastic effort "Shaz" you are the first woman in this Club to win this award and I hope you stick at it because you'll be a vital person in this Club in years to come.

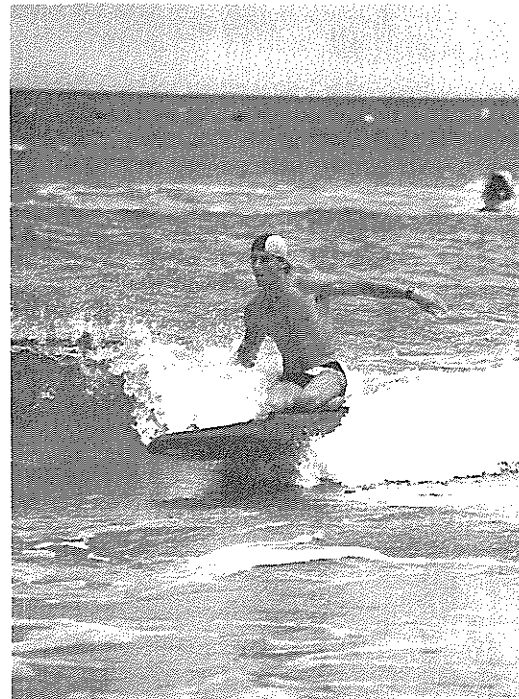

Thanks to Murray Symonds for looking after the repairs on our Junior boards.

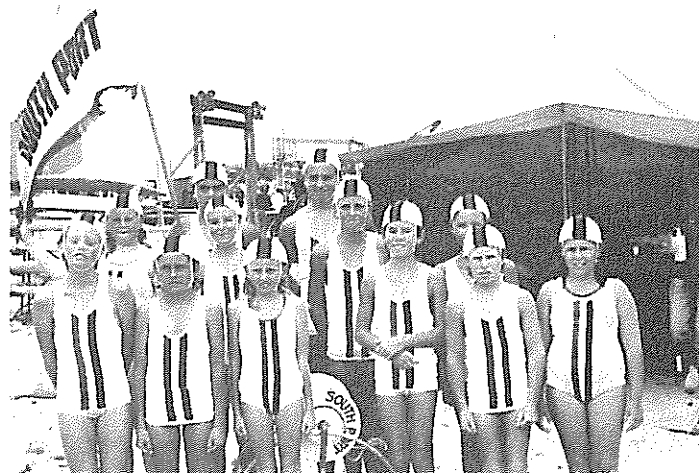

Like most years things started off a bit slow, but we all soon became enthused and achieved good results with two new bronze squads being qualified. Congratulations to both squads for the standards they achieved and for the co-operation I received during their instruction.

One of my more rewarding jobs was to work with three keen dads, Chris Hegarty, Martin (Chil) Chilman, Murray Symonds who trained with the children and qualified for the Surf Life Saving Certificate then three weeks later qualified as Bronze holders, they are now qualified to help with all junior instruction which will make the Chief Instructor's job easier next season, thanks and well done. I would also like to thank Ray Martin for training all of the children for their resuscitation certificate.

To the patrols well done in the five patrol inspections with 100%, 97%, 96%, 87% and 56%. These are the best results we have had for a while with the only bad one being 56% for First Aid which should be the best as it is the one skill we are more likely to use, looks like we will have a bit more First Aid training next season. COMPETITION OFFICER'S REPORT

After a slow build-up to the 1987/88 competition season, largely due to the lack-lustre carnival programme offered, South Port members rallied as they traditionally do and by January/February there was a readily apparent atmosphere of camaraderie at the Club and in 'the tent'.

We lost several top competitors and the inflow of cadets was reduced, so overall the team was depleted but the percentage return per individual was very high.

The Long Swim was held under ideal sunny conditions with a light South West breeze and it's success was aided by the preparatory work of Andy Higgs who later in the season teamed with daughter Anita to take a Bronze in the State First Aid Competition. Club Championship day, however, was sabotaged by 2 separate patrol inspections which, in the end, helped ease the tension and the event became more a 'fun' day.

A South Port Team once again safely and successfully negotiated a traditional New South Wales safari to compete at Manly, North Wollongong (where we gathered 15% of the prizemoney on offer) and Freshwater where, in unusually kind surf, the Ski Relay team of Ian Rowling, Andrew Peacock and Bennett Maxwell recorded a highly competitive win. I am convinced that interstate competition is essential for a top club whose name then remains exposed beyond South Australian borders. Next season I hope to expand this trip but Sponsorship is becoming more difficult for such travel and the expense therefore comes back to the individual and the Club.

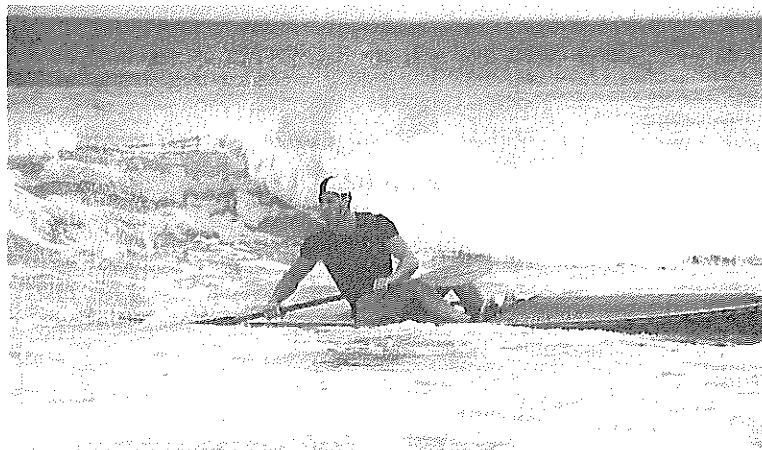
At State Titles, our Cadets dominated on craft and we maintained our overall control of the Ski events. Only a small team - expanded by March Past which finished a creditable 6th - competed at the Wanda Nationals but Martin Daniels survived to the final of the Under 15 Board and the Ski Relay Team also achieved 6th place. Our State Team representatives were Ian Rowling (Ski) and Simon Martin (sponsored Cadet).

I acknowledge the willing assistance of David Watt (Captain) and John Smith (Secretary) throughout the season and wish also to thank the intrepid 'Gear Trailer Men' - Brian Steel, John Daniels and Gerry Rowling.

We look forward to a re-vamped competition in this State next season - it is sorely needed with the emphasis being on assisting all-comers to compete rather than creating petty hurdles. Planned training sessions, open to any club, will continue and I hope, expand so that South Port becomes the 'open' craft club. At the same time, we will need to seek wider assistance in order to maintain top quality competition gear.

There has been criticism levelled at the standard of our competence. I am confident to say that we have an above average level of First Aid knowledge within our Patrols. It is to the benefit of every Patrolling Member to raise their own knowledge and skill. We have all become aware of the ever changing procedures within the areas of First Aid. South Port has gradually improved over the last season with the help of the Noarlunga Division of the St. John ambulance Brigade. In particular Mr John Parker and his Family and Mrs Heather Giles. These two and with many other Officers have helped our competition teams. Every year they have involved the Patrols on the days of training in casualty simulation and in rescue procedures. As I have been involved in all of these training sessions I can say that all the members of South Port SLSC have been hungry for knowledge. The teaching skills of the two above mentioned St. John Ambulance Members has been so high that members of our Patrols and the public have commented on the way we now can effect a rescue or accident with a minimum of fuss and disturbance to other beach users.

Since the inception of the First Aid Competition, South Port has never been lower than 4th and we have represented our State on one occasion when we came 4th in Australia. This season we came third at the State Competition.

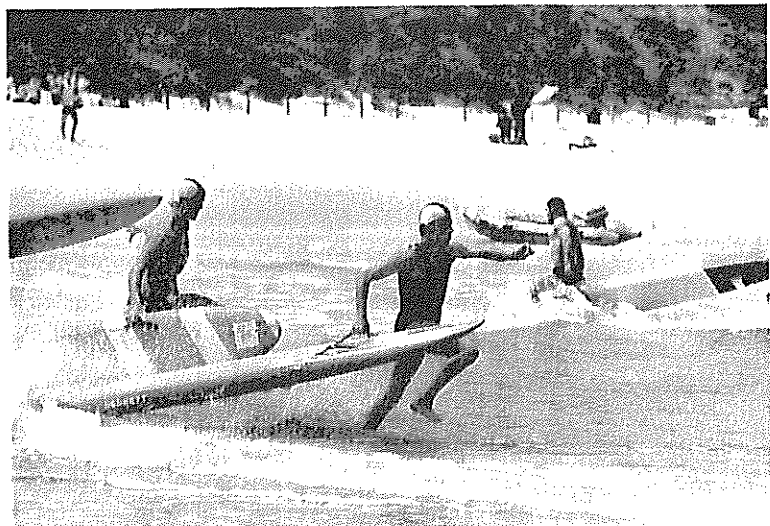
Simon Martin also won gold in the Malibu Board and Surf Race, and silver in the Run Swim Run, With Martin Daniels taking silver in the Malibu Board.

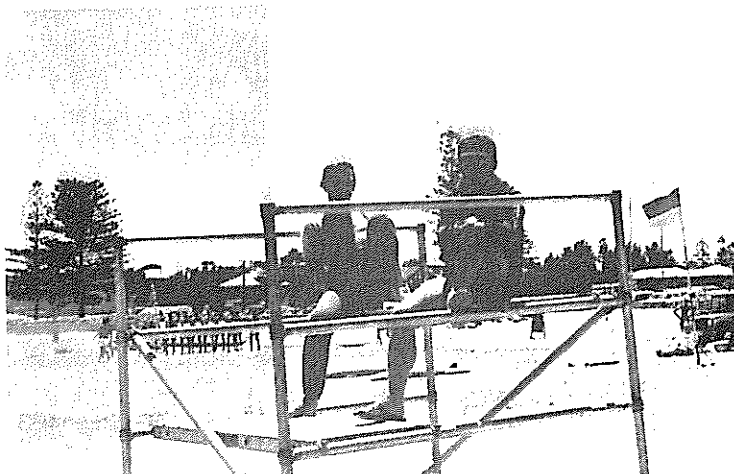
There was a regular group who assisted me at shows and during March Past commitments and I thank those people very much.

As I have only filled in this position near the end of the season, I was pleased we were still able to get a few things done.

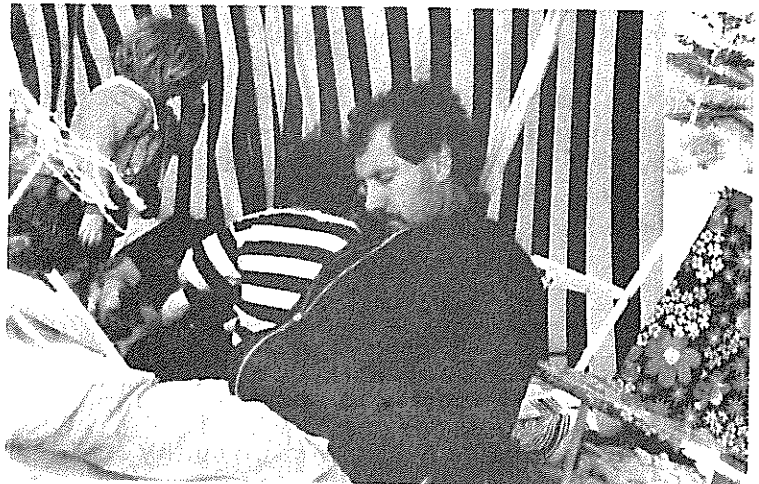
The Canteen and Bar areas had work done to them, also the water pipe to the Club has been repaired. Thanks to Muncha Campbell and his Gang.

Meanwhile, nine people have been saved from drowning at Southport beach so far this season.

Southport Surf Life Saving Club junior members Mark Chilton and Travis Neary, 13, of Port Noarlunga South added to the list recently.

Mark rescued a 12-year-old bodyboard rider who had been washed 100 m out to sea in a dangerous rip.

Only minutes later, Travis dashed into the surf and rescued a six-year-old girl who had been washed 50 m out to sea and was successfully towed back to her parents.

"Surf conditions at Southport this summer have again produced rips which, if the public are not aware of, can cause a potentially dangerous situation," club spokesman Dick Olesinski said.

"The public are again encouraged to swim between the red and yellow quartered flags for their own safety and protection."

The club also was fortunate to gain substantial corporate support in the recent launching of a new inshore rescue boat courtesy of Gavin and Colin Stagg of the Fitch Rubber Company and a Federal Government surf rescue gear grant.

The boat, which cost more than \$5000, will strengthen the club's mobile surf rescue patrols and back up on-beach facilities for effective rescues.

The Adelaide Refinery at Port Stanvac also recently donated two surf rescue malibus which will also assist in the training of the club's surf rescue patrols.

"The Southport club is constantly attending surfboard-related accidents and warns young board riders to ensure proper surf techniques are used in their surf enjoyment."

A young seven-year-old girl was also assisted from a potentially dangerous rip and swimmers should swim between the red and yellow flags for their own protection.

Southport also worked together with the Port Noarlunga club to find a very distressed four-year-old girl. Parents are also warned to watch their young children closely at the beach.

You can approach the Southport/ beach. Coke patrol shelter for advice on safe swimming and surfing techniques. New members are required in all groups, with a 2 p.m. day from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at a Noarlunga.

"The Southport club cannot survive without corporate support as a club activity generously given by the Fitch Rubber Company, together with the Adelaide Refinery donation," Olesinski said.

A LOCAL surf life saving club has warned people against diving from a ledge into the Onkaparinga River after a dramatic rescue at the site.

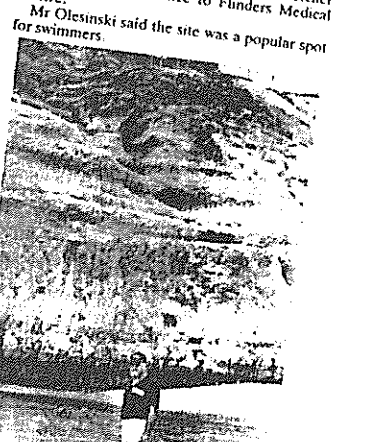
The South Port Surf Life Saving patrol rescued a 29-year-old man who had dived or had fallen into the river from a 6 m high ledge. The man was not seriously injured, receiving only a sprained ankle and spinal bruising.

But club spokesperson Dick Olesinski said it was only a matter of time before someone was killed or maimed.

"Our patrols are constantly reminding and warning people from diving off into the Onkaparinga River," he said.

The injured man was removed by stretcher and taken by ambulance to Flinders Medical Centre.

Mr Olesinski said the site was a popular spot for swimmers.

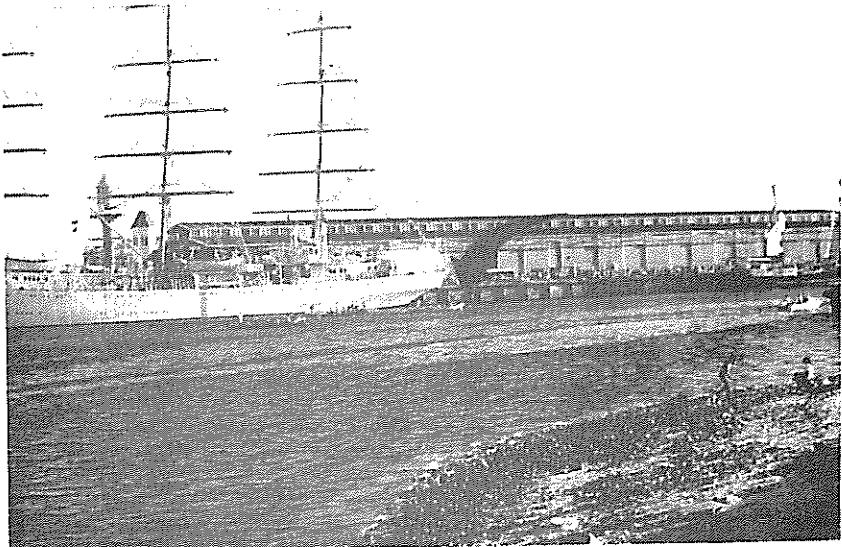

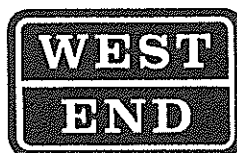

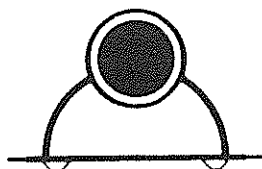
