





CLUB STATISTICS — 1989/90 to 1993/94





Carnivals at South Port are always good, but without the efforts of 'Beeper' and his


carnival patrol and Brian Steel, Tony Rushby (Seaford Rise) and John 'Devo' Devitt on the tractors, things just wouldn't happen.

SECRETARY'S REPORT (AND ANNUAL REVIEW OF CLUB ACTIVITIES)

Ladies, gentlemen and interested parties of the South Port SLSC, it gives me sincere pleasure in presenting this, the 35th annual report and financial statement.

As in previous years, you the members can be proud at what you have accomplished and I trust will continue to do so in season 1994/95.

The seasons activities and accomplishments in brief are as follows:

LIFESAVING

Season 1993/94 was an extremely busy year with many first aid cases; some very serious. Rescues were up on recent years, but still no lives lost.

South Port accredited itself very well through the on-going patrol efficiency testing and all members who participated should feel proud.

INSTRUCTION

As in previous seasons, 'Beeper' (John Nearmy) again provided the impetus for ongoing lifesavers to test themselves and new ones to find out how 'easy' it is to be a lifesaver.

Without John's tutelage our numbers for patrol would be ever decreasing and our skill levels easing. To those who help John and ultimately the public, thank you for your patience and I trust you will continue in this area of profound importance.

COMMITTEE

This year's group endeavoured to carry out those auspices handed down by last year's committee. The five year plan was instigated but is still in the embryonic stages and must be completed as a matter of urgency.

A proactive management style is now being shown by longer serving members, but this must be filtered down through those new to the committee and younger members. This year a fundraising area was separately set up and that end must be considered at least partially successful. They definitely learned a lot and I firmly believe must be a front running group within our organisation.

FINANCES

The 'Wood Duck' in his own professional style kept us to the task at hand, providing succinct economic appraisals of our condition.

This 1993/94 season saw significant spending with a cash flow through the club of approximately \$130,000. I trust Mark will continue in this position as his invaluable expertise is well appreciated.



Patrolling for season 93/94 was a good standard with some good results coming from the State Patrol Efficiency Competition. Travis must be commended for the work he has done with the patrols; no easy task given we rely on volunteers. Many thanks to all Patrol Captains and patrolling members for their efforts throughout the season — 'NO LIVES LOST' — that's what we are here for. Chris Burton must also be thanked for her work with the first aid room, first aid supplies and the seminars she ran throughout the season.

Our Chief Instructor (Beeper) once again had a busy season instructing instructors on all of the different awards, proficiency testing at the start of the season (John enjoyed that part of the year) and looking after carnival patrols while the rest of the club has the opportunity to compete at the local carnivals.

Competitor numbers are still low but nevertheless, I'm sure every competitor who put on the South Port cap competed to the best of their abilities. The March Past Team once again completed the season with wins in nearly all local carnivals and taking out gold at the State Titles. The Australian Titles saw them achieve a creditable 4th place, just missing out on a bronze medal by a countback. Well done fellas! The boaties worked very hard this year gaining placings in nearly every carnival and

achieving a bronze medal at the State Titles. There were also some very good individual performances throughout the season's competition. Notable here were:

Michael Hegarty — Finalist, Nutri-Grain U16 Ironman, and winner of seven medals at the State Titles; and

Di Wallace-Ward — Top Iron Woman in South Australia and Australian and World Masters Champion.

With young Michael Hegarty as Cadet Supervisor and Richard Olesinski assisting him, the cadets competed well all season. They also put in many patrol hours and provided water safety for the triathalons. Well done to all competitors!

Junior membership was once again quite promising with a lot of hard work done by Chris Mullins, the Junior Committee and age group leaders putting kids through their different awards and training them on weekends. To achieve a strong surf club which South Port has had over many years, there must be a good, hard working Junior Committee so I hope that keeps improving because "YOU", the parents and your children are the future of this Club.

Thanks to a lot of hard work, the bar and canteen have both been very successful this season. The improvement in bar profits has been especially noteworthy. Beau (Milky) Lyons did a great job setting up Friday night sippers which has proved to be both a financial and social success. 



It was generally pleasing to see the First Aid Room and equipment left tidy after each patrol. However there is always room for improvement, and let's not forget to fill out the casualty report forms for all incidents.

In conclusion, I would like to thank John Nearmy, Club Captain Dave Watt, Vice-Captain Travis Nearmy, all the committee members, all patrols and South Port Club as a whole for their support and help throughout this season.

Keep up the good work and let's make this club continue to succeed and prosper through future seasons.

The last wave saw the boat roll over - minor damage — a learning experience. Saturday was upon us. One hundred and forty-eight 'A' crews from around Australia. We made it through to the third round; that is, the final 48 crews. On the way in we were 4th, three go through. Along came this little wave so we took it, and dropped in late onto an almost dry sandbar. The result was a 24 foot boat standing on its nose. We fell; so did the boat. Wal and Dollar met up with the boat in the water, sustaining injuries. Thanks go to the Collaroy boat crew for help with Wal and the SA State Centre for looking after him.



to John Nearmy for examining both the Resuscitation and Surf Life Saving Certificate squads).

COMPETITION OFFICER'S REPORT

The expenditure on the new surf boat seems to have been justified by some excellent results in the boat area. For this piece of expensive equipment to be fully utilised, however, there is a need to encourage serious competition in the Reserve, Under 21 and Under 18 areas.

The March Past team, after a rather indifferent start, eventually settled down to its normal formidable style. New recruits, John Treacey and Stuart Orr, acquitted themselves well, both marching at the State and Australian championships. Thanks also to those members who did a "Melba" after announcing their respective retirements.

The Nutri-Grain series saw the March Past team competing at Torquay and Bondi. The seasons results: 1st in the State, 2nd in the overall point score at the Nutri Grain, 3rd in the final of the Nutri Grain and 4th in the Australian Titles.

As mentioned earlier, the Under 18 and Under 16 sections were the strong point of the Club and every endeavour should be made to ensure that these competitors are encouraged in every possible way.

South Port was also well represented in the women's events. Di Wallace-Ward had an outstanding season for the club, winning 4 gold medals at the World Masters, 2 gold medals at the Australian Masters and 2 gold medals at the State Titles, resulting in her being selected as Most Outstanding Competitor for this season. With the likes of Tash Couzner and Aisha Olesinski in the wings, and the possibility of a female boat crew, the women's strength at South Port seems equally assured for the future.








State Championships Medal Tally, 1968-1993

- (a) the attached accounts present fairly the results of the operations of South Port Surf Life Saving Inc. for the financial year ended 30 April and the state of affairs of South Port Surf Life Saving Inc. as at the end of the financial year; and
- (b) there are reasonable grounds to believe that South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc. will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL

If the accounts are anything to go by, then 1993/94 has been an extremely active year, with more than \$130,000 going though the books during the year. Unfortunately, while the Statement of Income and Expenditure indicates the Club recorded a financial surplus for the year of almost \$9,000, once expenditure on non-current assets is allowed for, the Club actually spent more than it raised.

SITUATION AND MATTERS

The new surf boat (\$12,600), a second set of carbon fibre oars (\$2,300), a new surf boat trailer (\$2,300), a new IRB (\$7,400) two IRB motors (\$2,593), 4 Nipper boards (\$1,560) and the shed to be erected on the Canoe Club site at Wearing Street (\$8,450) were the major items of expenditure that entered the accounts during 1993/94.

Other expenditures were generally as expected, though it was pleasing to see marked reductions in both our telephone and electricity bills. Repairs and maintenance were up, but this probably reflects some neglect in previous years. Printing and postage were also higher in 1993/94, reflecting greater use of the Snippets this season.

On the income side, the Club was fortunate to attract a number of major sponsorship deals this year (as discussed elsewhere in this Report). In total, these sponsorships delivered the club in excess of \$17,000, without which the Club could not have acquired the equipment it did this year. Olly, along with DD and Peter Sutton, should be mentioned for their efforts in securing these deals.

The other income highlight of the year has been the bar, which under the management of Beau Lyons, increased its profitability by 52 per cent. Well done Beau.

The Canteen also had a good year, with profits also up by a good margin (though the poor result in the previous season was partly due to stock loss.) Again, well done Kath (and your small band of helpers).

There were also a number of notable fundraising efforts. Chief and most successful among these were the Jurassic Park movie night, the 100 Club Lottery and the delivery of telephone books (included under Labour Services in the accounts). Nevertheless, given the amount of funds it requires to operate a Surf Club, the Fundraising Committee will need to consider increasing fundraising efforts next year, especially during the latter part of the season, when fundraising energies appear to be easily diverted.

Finally, I would like to thank Simon Linden for his invaluable advice and assistance in the preparation of the financial statements.

Accordingly, our audit has been limited to the amounts of cash receipts so recorded in the books of account of the Club.

Audit Opinion




Wal or Wally (David Watt) — Another straightforward derivation from the surname (but he was a bit of a 'wally' to break his leg at the Aussie Champs.]

Zee (Brian Johns) — From Johnzee! [Occasionally known as "Garfish" in tribute to his distinctive physique.]




