



MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

John 'Devo' Devitt

Another season has drawn to a close, and I'm happy to report "No lives lost" at South Port while we patrolled the beach. This season the SLSSA made a conscious decision to start patrols to tie in with the commencement of the junior activities on the beach for all Clubs. This was to allow for a concerted effort through the media for all Clubs in SA to have their season opening on the same day. Unfortunately it doesn't always fit in with the weather, that's something we cannot control.

The time for writing these reports comes around all too quickly these days, here we are on the verge of a new season, and the last one hardly seems to have finished. I'm very pleased that the extension is completed, thanks to the tireless efforts of Don Alexander. Don's time spent over at the Club during the works can't be overstated. In regard to the extension I would like to thank Facility Management Group (FMG) for the additional funds required to complete the job, this government funding is a godsend to clubs in the rebuild stage and all clubs are thankful of the funds provided by Safecom.

This funding is stage one of our rebuild; stage two is in the redevelopment of the Wearing street precinct. This has been on the Onkaparinga Councils planning table for some time now and is starting with the revamp of Saubier House that you can now see. I've seen the concept plans for the area and they look fantastic. It will be great to be part of the area. We have been allocated a 300sqm building comprising two stories that involves us storing all of our IRB equipment there for the State Emergency Services component of our funding. This will free up space at the Club as well. The building will incorporate our gym and include shower and toilet facilities. It will be in the approximate location our current shed is. Part of this building could also be used by SLSSA as a meeting/training area to lessen our costs overall as well.

There have been changes to the Junior Committee to try and streamline the operation. There is so much information now coming into play that it is difficult to try and disseminate before the next lot arrives. The crossover between junior and senior now is not so wide and we need to stay on top of things that apply to both levels of the Club. This is also something we need to consider for the senior committee, it is a work in progress, and if it doesn't work we can always change it back to the way it was, so I ask that we give it a try and see how it pans out.

This season a rewrite of the constitution was deemed necessary and Don Alexander and Michelle Copley have completed that, it is now in plain English no double speak legalese, even I can understand it. There is one change that you will have voted on at the AGM to bring us into line with the Australian Tax Office's request to get our Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) registration approved. This means is that we will be able to state that we are DGR charitable organisation on our invoices and receipts.

As usual there are a great many people to thank for their efforts through the season and I'm not going to attempt to name you all, because there is a real danger of missing someone out and that's not a good thing. I would like to thank all the members of both committees for their commitment throughout the year. It's a big job regardless of what role you have taken on, but there are a few who deserve mention; The bar takings and trade started out poorly during the winter, because of the renovations but as the season got under way with the influx of new members this soon turned around and finished well up on last season. This is an essential part of the financial existence of the Club and thanks go to David (Wal) Watt for his work there. The canteen is also a great source of income for the Club thanks to the efforts of Vonnie Olesinski. These two cash streams coupled with grants and various sponsorships are the reason we can exist as a Surf Life Saving Club and supply the equipment to members to be able to patrol and compete. Our thanks must go to Penny McKenzie for the effort put in writing grant applications for the season it is very much

appreciated. Dick Olesinski for the cash draws that he runs through out the year raise funds with the chance of cash prizes, and its always interesting to see what he comes up with next.




Some highlights of the season include:

TREASURER'S REPORT

The summarised report on income, expenditure and trading for the season 2014-15 have been taken from the 2015 Audit conducted by Edward Jeynes, which is included as Appendix "A".

Current Assets the end of the financial year totalled \$110,555.89, including \$91,870 cash, Non-Current Assets totalled \$322,540 and Total Assets \$433,096, with no Liabilities. Total Members Funds are \$433,096.

Our profit from trading continues improve with all three areas recording a positive result of \$56,173; this is an increase over the previous record year. Considering that there was almost no income during the winter period, due to the extension, this is an excellent result. Thanks again to David 'Wal' Watt, Club House Manager, for his contribution throughout the year, both in the bar and keeping the club house presentable: always a difficult task. Wal took some bookings for functions from non-club members, sometimes an issue, but with his control they all turned into positive events for the customer and the Club. Thanks to all members who gave their time to serve behind the bar and to all those who assisted at carnivals with the BBQ, Canteen and preparing meals for the carnival officials.

Yvonne Olesinski, returned another good result in the canteen. A special thanks to all members who donated their time to help behind the counter on the weekends and the carnivals, your assistance is much appreciated.

We are extremely grateful for her involvement over a number of years. Just for the record Vonnie has contributed \$86,600, since she took over running the canteen in 2001-2002: she was made a life member in 2007 and still continues to give her time to the Club.

Thanks to Katherine and Brad Vogt, took on the task of organising the clothing for the season, making a small profit, which in no way was equal to the amount of time and effort they put in to make sure members were satisfied. As we know clothing is a difficult area to control the expenses but hopefully they will stand again and improve the bottom line.

On the expenditure side, our total costs remained at a controllable level.

The Club received Grants from the:

- Kahini Pty Ltd (SLSSA Trust Fund) \$9,000
- Recreation and Sport \$5,000
- SLSA for Club Equipment \$5,000
- SLSSA disbursement \$5,000

I am pleased to report that the Club is solvent.

Well another season has passed, sitting at this end of it looks easy but as we all know there was a lot of hard work to make things happen.



- 16 x Perform CPR



I think the above is a heavy workload for a small team but when you consider that in addition to this we had 248 proficiencies achieved.


I'm looking forward to another season in this position as I plan to get the Club up and running with regular use of our new facilities (hopefully a new kitchen too!)

YVONNE WOODEN



**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015**

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1985. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following statements accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment less, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015**

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the entity and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Interest revenue

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depends on whether the outcome of the services can be measured reliably. If this is the case then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably measured then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.
