CAPTAIN'S REPORT

the 1979/80 season saw South Port continue in the successful vein of previous years with continuing improvement in all aspects of Surf Life Saving activities reflecting the enthusiasm and dedication of our members.

Our patrols once again provided an efficient service to members of the public who use South Port beach, with our position in the Bank of New South Wales Patrol Efficiency Competition evidence of the high standard of our members on patrol.

Our competitors once again proved that we are a force to be reckoned with by convincingly winning the Hancock & Henderson Trophy for board and ski competition and gaining second placing in the overall point score for the season (11 points behind Brighton) and the State Championships.

At the Australian Championships at Maroochydore, Qld, we were represented in five finals which produced one first placing, three fifth placings and one sixth place.

As usual the Championship produced some disappointments like Mark Wooden just missing the senior ski final and Scott Wooden's ski becoming snagged in the buoy ropes when leading in the junior ski final. These disappointments were however offset by the magnificent win by Scott Wooden and Ian Hodgen in the Junior Double Ski. This was the first gold medal to be won in South Port's history at Australian Championships and I would like to give my heartiest congratulations to these two excellent young competitors.

Our success in the competition arena is in no small way due to the efforts and support from the coaches, craft handlers, craft repairers, our Competitions Officer and Board and Ski Captain. On behalf of all competitors I wish to thank you for your untiring efforts throughout the season.

VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The patrolling of our beach in 1979/80 was once again accomplished fairly smoothly. There were however no major incidents to test the efficiency of our patrols and so members should not become complacent about this situation.

There was a general tightening up of Club policy on patrols in 79/80 and as a consequence probably saw a record number of patrol breaches incurred and a number of members were duly suspended. All active members must remember -- PATROLS COME FIRST. The penalties for patrol breaches formulated by the Committee earlier this year are as follows.

- Late attendance (without prior notice to the Patrol Capt.)
 - one penalty patrol
- Nonattendance (without arranging a substitute) -----
 - two penalty carnival patrols
- Second breach -suspension

To many, these penalties may seem rather harsh considering we are an organisation of volunteers but failure to abide by patrol rules could mean a life.

Congratulations should go to Foxtrot patrol for their win in the patrol competition, and in particular to captain Phil Mayo, and top club patrol member David Watt. At the time of writing this report, the WALES competition results were not known but I have reason to believe that the club performed fairly well and everyone should be commended.

Finally I would like to commend Simon Linden on a job well done in his first year as Club Captain and trust that he will continue the good job in the forthcoming season.

BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

SURF BOATS

This season as with previous seasons commenced with repairs to the "Evans" which was dry docked in Andy Diggs shed while the "boys" effected minor repairs after which it was handed to Graham King to get the boat seaworthy. Meanwhile Reynella Tyre Service supplied and fitted the boat trailer with tyres and B&B auto electricians worked on the lights.

With the boat and trailer ready to go all that was needed was Bob Mayo to give the boaties guidance. Three senior crews took to the water this season however more socially than competitively. Unfortunately no juniors took an active interest in rowing this year.

INFLATABLE RESCUE BOAT

With the permission of the donor, the Noarlunga Rotary Club, the Avon I.R.B. was repaired and sold in October 79 for \$1499 complete. With the news that the Noarlunga City Council had approved a grant for a new I.R.B., the Club purchased a Johnson 25 H.P. outboard motor, propellor guard and accessories.

Five members from the Club attended an I.R.B. school conducted by the association and held at the Port Elliot S.L.S.C. Two of these members, namely Peter Sutton and myself, later obtained their I.R.B. Drivers Certificate, another first for South Port.

Many thanks must go to Les Horne, now with South Port, and Paul Ransome of Port Noarlunga S.L.S.C. for allowing us the use of the Port Noarlunga's facilities and craft in order for both of us to achieve the award.

The new Zodiac I.R.B. arrived in March 80 and on the behalf of the club I sincerely thank the City of Noarlunga for its generous support. Reynella Datsun donated \$200 towards a comprehensive tool kit and spares for the 25 h.p. Johnson outboard motor. Thanks to Dave Pocock as well as to his company Reynella Datsun not only for their financial support but for the time given to the Club and the Surf Life Saving Association.

Addition to by-laws.-Duties of Officers

POWER BOAT CAPTAIN

1. Shall be responsible for the general maintenance and repair of the Boat and associated equipment.
2. Shall be responsible for the conduct of the power boat crew.
3. Shall be responsible for the manner in which the boat is used.
4. Shall organise training in conjunction with the Captain, Vice Captain and Chief Instructor.
5. Shall assist the Vice Captain in allocating power boat crews to patrols.

FINANCIAL YEAR (now 1st JULY to 30th JUNE)

Change (180) The Financial Year shall commence on the first day in May in each year and terminate on the last day in April in the next succeeding year.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES (mandatory by National Council)

- (b) Ten years Active Membership or eight years Active membership plus four years Reserve active membership in its self shall not entitle a Member to be transferred to Long Service Membership. War or National Service by any member will be recognised as continuous Membership.
- (c) For a period of at least fourteen days before an application is to be considered by the Committee, a nomination paper signed by the applicant and two other financial active members, shall be displayed on the Club Notice Board together with a notice to the effect that the Committee is prepared to consider from members' reasons submitted for or against the admission of the Member to the Long Service List.
- (d) Application for transfer to the Long Service Membership must be approved by a 2/3 majority of the Committee voting at a meeting thereof when such applications are considered.
- (e) The Committee may defer decision on an application for admission to the Long Service Membership until a sub-committee has enquired into and reported on the applicant's qualification.
- (f) A member who is transferred to the Long Service Membership shall be entitled to all the privileges of Active Membership but shall be exempt from all patrol obligations.
