

- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.



I am pleased to present for your Consideration and Adoption the 28th Annual Report and Financial Statement of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

Although the extraordinary contributions of certain individuals are, quite properly, singled out for recognition in the Reports that follow all of us can be proud of the enormous work load we all shared in the course of the season, the way that the non-starting summer disrupted our early seasons activities, added to the consequences of that Breach could have been disastrous, instead everyone rallied around for the final carnivals on our beach and we finished on a high note.

ASSOCIATION AWARDS

The lift in the number of Bronze Medallions is encouraging as it once again helps to offset our natural wastage however as my Report as Chief Instructor warns, the Club must adapt to changing Association procedures in order to maintain a constant supply of incoming actives.

MEMBERSHIP

A direct comparison with last years figures will be misleading as certain initiatives we have taken this last year will have distorted the picture, the fall in Associates is traceable to a small drop in Family registrations and there is evidence that last years total was not completely accurate.

The disappearance of our Reserve Actives was caused by our concern that any Personal Patrol Hours default among the more Senior March Past competitors should not jeopardise the rest of that Team or the competitive rights of the rest of our competitors, we simply moved them into the Long Service category of Membership to exempt them from Patrol obligations. Three of those involved received their 25 Year Awards this year and the rest will very soon qualify for the same Award so probably we have been remiss in not recognising length of service earlier.

Our improvement in Actives is bolstered by new bronzes and a few inward transfers, these people are responsible for manning the patrols on our beach and these are our prime justification for occupying our unique Club House location. So every effort must be made to ensure that our current numerical strength is maintained, or improved upon. There is a tendency to assume that any unexpected drop in numbers will be best countered by a Committee run Recruiting Drive, however a recent W.A. survey found that some 65% of life savers were introduced by friends or relatives so the suggestion is that if every current member brought in one friend and assisted them to qualify for Active service we would double our numbers and halve the workload in one fell swoop and everyone would incidentally improve their efficiency as life savers at the same time - thats the theory anyway!

PATROL HOURS

The 460 hours upward jump in Patrol Hours is not a misprint, it was achieved in part through an alteration to the Associations minimum hours requirement and by a determination of some of our cadets and seniors to increase their Patrol activity, as will be seen by the fact that twelve people put in in excess of 50 hours a piece, in addition four of our members have managed to clock up 200 hours Jet Boat duty for the Association, this magic figure of some 2,600 hours that we spent in actively protecting the general public at play in the ocean is a very creditable justification for our continued operations at South Port.

FINANCE

The attached Financial Statement shows that the on-going costs of servicing our Loans and further establishing ourselves in our new building together with those incurred through our normal life saving activities are considerable, once again the main contributors were the Bar, the Canteen and donations from various sources (listed elsewhere in the Report). The Club House Director reports that some projects were shelved through lack of time and money which is normal good housekeeping practice, however our method of financing the Gym equipment when we could not afford the outlay and the way the Hairmart donation was used to reduce our long term commitment, by reducing the principle of our Council Loan, shows that even in difficult times the Club can, by careful management of its affairs, continue to develop and prosper.

CONSTITUTION

As a preliminary step in over-hauling our Constitution the out going Secretary had circulated copies of the current Constitution for their comments, the resultant file was passed on for action however the suggested amendments were of such a minor nature that the need for the exercise was queried, it transpired that it had come to the attention of the Administrator that at least one club's Constitution contained irregularities that needed correction, hence the correspondence to clubs alerting them of their obligations in this area. Ours received the all clear from the Constitution Committee and our Committee elected not to proceed further, it was noted that at no time would strict observation of our Constitution excuse breaches of the law, specifically the relevant Licensing Acts and Road Traffic Acts.

POWER SUPPLY

Another carryover from last year was the unsatisfactory state of our water and power supplies, in the winter months a mass of fishing tackle and dead birds prompted approaches to the Noarlunga Council and Don Hopgood to attempt to determine the mechanics and costs of overcoming the problem, initial responses were not too encouraging but now we have been fortunate enough to contact Kevin Hamilton and Leith Jersey of E.T.S.A. and they are co-operating in the preparation of specifications for burying the supply, from this accurate costing can be calculated and ways and means of meeting these costs can be investigated, so hopefully the removal of this particular eyesore will be achieved shortly.

US AND THEM ??

Early in the year Bob Mayo circulated all clubs to explain his perceived role on the Board of Management and to outline how a more effective input into the decision making process of the Association could be achieved. Accordingly the Committee resolved to supplement our Delegates efforts with written submissions to the relevant State Officers, as Richard Olesinski reports our overall success rate was disappointingly small, but David Watt and I saw a glimmer of hope at the Club Captains Meeting where the Patrol Contract issue was aired, we found we were not alone in our concern at the grass roots impact of policies which were mysteriously being applied from above without due consultation. The suggestion that the situation was aggravated by poor communication at Club level was proven correct later in the year when State Centre Delegates surprised us by indicating that they were quite happy with the current processes, at least they were until they found the malaise had spread to National level and then their reaction to these initiatives was remarkably similar to ours ... the Biter Bit!!


The incoming Committee must now address itself to Bob Mayo's original question, if they really want to have a more effective say in the Administration of the Association last years campaign should be continued and probably expanded but they must be prepared to accept that overnight success will not be achieved, the alternative is to revert to a more passive acceptance of whatever transpires at State level.

My performance as Club Secretary was not to my total satisfaction mainly because I could not devote the time that this demanding and important position requires. Unfortunately there is no prospect of improvement in my work situation so I will not be standing for any Committee Office next year.

I must now record my personal thanks for the assistance of Peter wooden, Richard Olesinski, Alan Trewartha and Heather Parr, their help with the paper war was considerable. In conclusion I must sincerely thank my wife Maureen for the endless patience and tolerance she has shown me as I struggled through the year.




We have had some difficult times over the last few years and without the time and effort of people like this our Club may not have pulled through.



CHIEF INSTRUCTOR



Although we did not win any medals at the Australian Champion-ships we were well represented in many finals and picked up several fourth placings.







Thuys returned to the iron man competition last week and won an event at the South Port carnival.


At the weekend Thuys also was successful in the belt race for the fourth consecutive year.
