OBJECTIVES

The Objectives of the Club are:-

- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing efficient life saving patrols and apparatus.
- (b) To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.
- (c) To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in life saving.
- (d) To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other Public Bodies in imposing facilities for bather.
- (e) To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property rights or privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

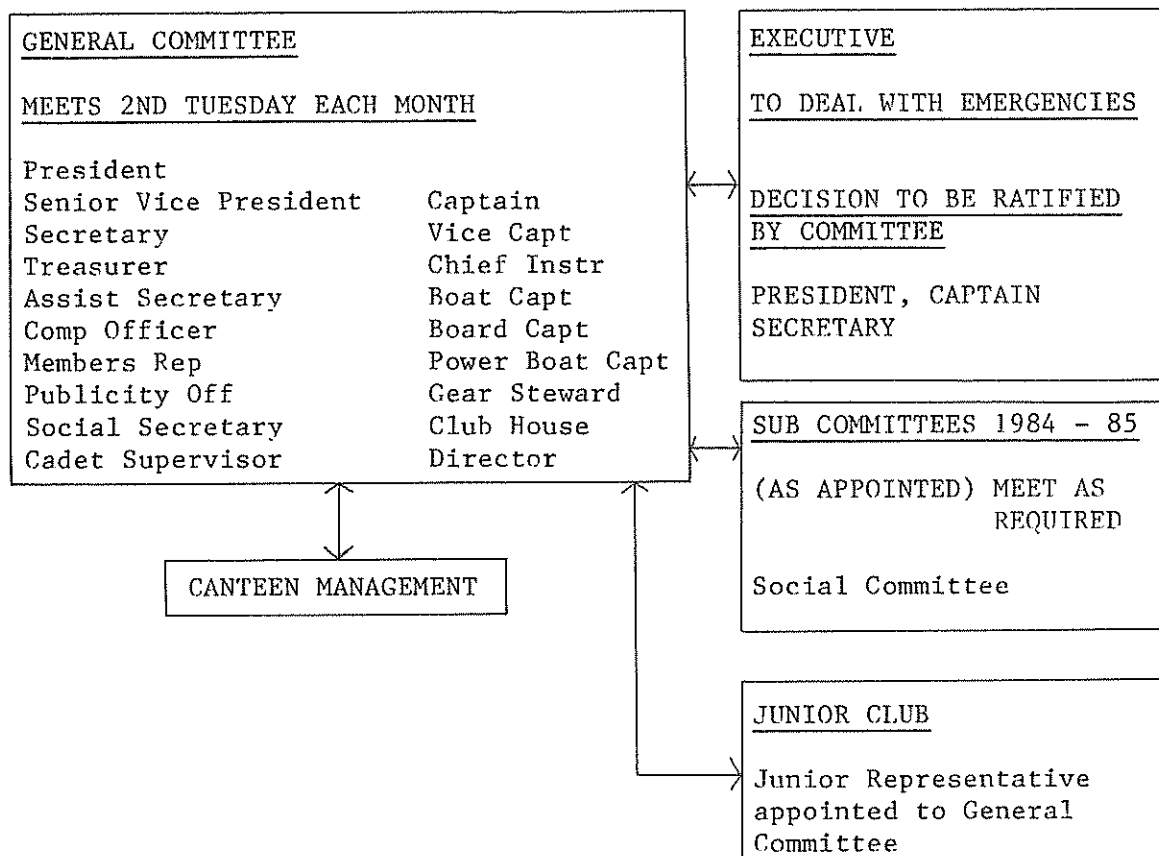

REVIEW OF CLUB ACTIVITIES

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen of South Port S.L.S.C.

It gives me great pleasure to submit for your approval this, our 26th Annual Report and Financial Statement.

A review of this Season is as follows:-

LIFE SAVING

(a) PATROLS

No lives were lost on our beach. Six rescues were effected bringing the total of lives saved at South Port to 336. Average hours per member were cut to 16.5.

(b) AWARDS

The total awards recorded this year totalled 53. This was an excellent result. The keenness shown was a credit to the members involved and to those that assisted them.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership generally increased in all areas and this is good to see now that the club is completed.

FINANCE

A separate annexure has been supplied setting out the finances for the year.

CLUBHOUSE

The clubhouse was handed over to South Port on 10/9/84 and since then a great effort has been made to finish it off. The building looks good and functions well. Next season more interesting improvements will be added.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Another creditable effort. Runners-up 1984/85. It was a great day with high club spirit at participation, as the "Prez" said 2nd is better than last.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Australian Championships were held at Port Leo in Victoria on 1st, 2nd and 3rd March. South Port acquitted itself well and acquired 1 Gold and 3 Bronze Medals together with a number of finalist placings. The carnival was spoilt by rain on Saturday and flat surf generally.

CANOEING REPRESENTATIVES

Shane Wooden has been selected to coach the Australian Junior Canoe Team in Rome. Our top competitors David Pummeroy, Andrew Peacock, Ian Rowling and Joanne Patterson have been selected in the team. Congratulations.

It would like to take the opportunity of extending my personal thanks to all members and the committee for their help throughout the season.

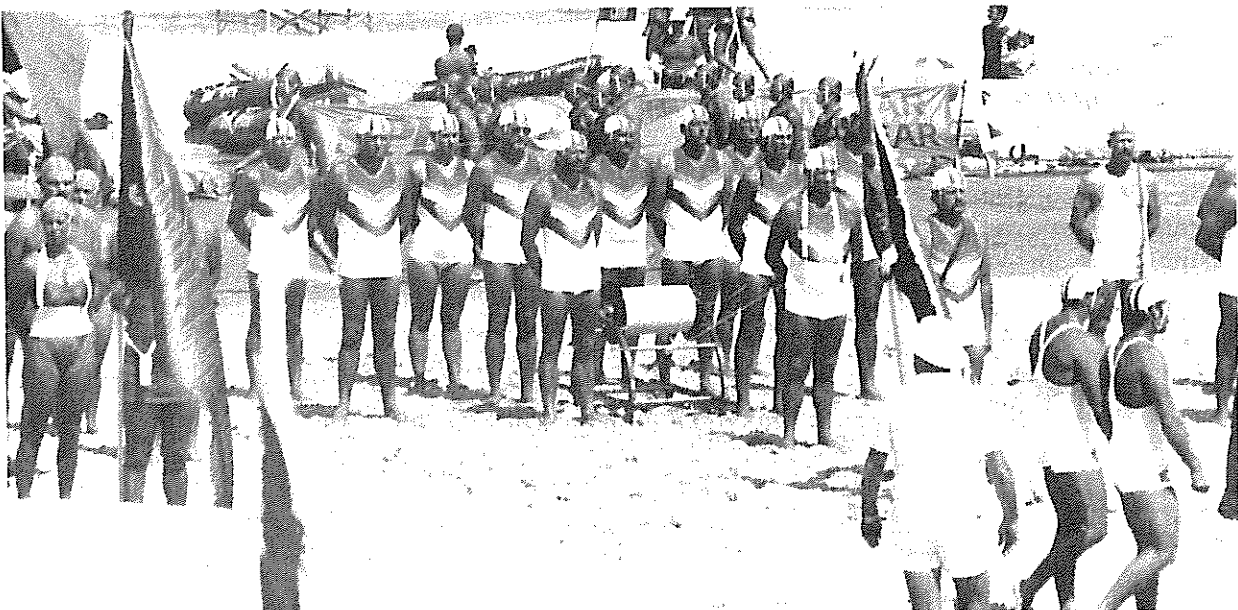

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

1984 - 1985 was a season of mixed success for South Port. Clearly it will be difficult to continue to match the successes the club has made over the last few seasons, however I feel that 1984-85 in a number of ways could have been a better year.

Competition again proved to be this club's strength. The club again recorded a magnificent effort at the State Championships with everybody, competitors and supporters alike getting right behind our bid to retain the title we won last season. Though our bid failed it must be remembered that we did score 15 more points than last year, we were minus one of our best competitors (Darren Goldsworthy), and Grange were extremely keyed up to win after their poor showing last year. At the Australian Championships we continued our fine run of performances, led by Ian Rowling and David Pummeroy retaining their Australian Junior Double Ski title, but not forgetting the almost unbelievable bronze medallion the March Past won.

Well done everybody.

Patrols however were not nearly so successful. After a reasonably good start to the season patrol absenteeism recorded extraordinarily high level after the new year and continued to remain high until March. Many members have found themselves saddled by numerous penalties as a result, the number of which reached ridiculous proportions by the beginning of March. This lack of enthusiasm for and commitment to the club's most important activity is very disturbing and the incoming committee must give top priority to ensuring that the events of 1985 are not repeated next year. Personally I would recommend the following:-

- (a) Abandoning the split patrol roster. Despite the flexibility it offers, members have increasingly stated that the 2½ hours virtually commits them to the whole afternoon at the beach and the 5 hour patrol would have been preferred.
- (b) All penalties unfulfilled be rigidly enforced at the beginning of the 1985/86 season.
- (c) That the membership of a number of members whose commitment to patrol has been extremely poor be reviewed by the committee, and that such members will be required to show why their membership should not be terminated.
- (d) That carnival patrols be abandoned and membership patrols be determined according to the needs of beach safety. That is, a very strong swimmer for every patrol, a first aid officer to each patrol, and so on.
- (e) That more members be encouraged to gain first aid and radio operator certificates.

It must be borne in mind that the South Port S.L.S.C. is here to patrol the beach.

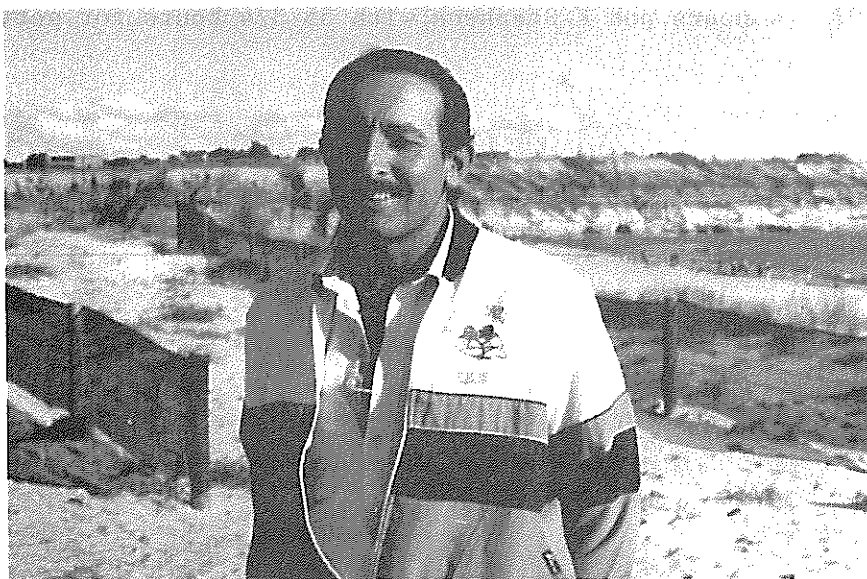
Turning towards other areas of the club, the Chief Instructor (and his small group of assistants) should be given much credit for maintaining a steady supply of newly qualified members to the club. More assistance in this area would probably be desirable in 1985/86 as the amount of work that has fallen on Mick and his cohorts has been extremely large.

With the clubhouse being the major centre of attention over the last season it is not surprising that on the social scene events have been very successful. Credit must go to Tony Horton, in particular, who has been the guiding force behind the club's social scene.

A word of warning. There have been signs over the last season that the club is dividing into various factions. This is not a good trend. South Port since its rise to prominence in S.A. Lifesaving has always been noted for its solidarity and club spirit. Instead of thinking of yourself (or others) as boaties, ski paddlers, marchers, or IRB drivers, think of yourself as a "clubbies".

Finally I would just like to apologise for my own sub-standard performance this season as the club captain. While I was rail-roaded into the position, that is little excuse for my lack of involvement. The person that will replace me must be prepared to devote a large portion of all their week-ends during summer to South Port if they are going to do the job justice.

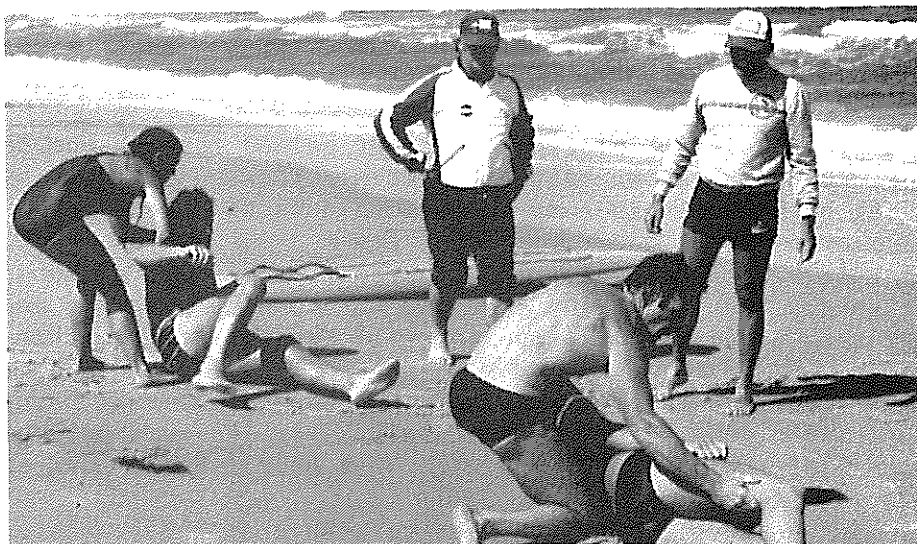

At long last we have been able to replace some of our craft for new - the replacement costs are approx \$700 for single skis and \$550 for malis.

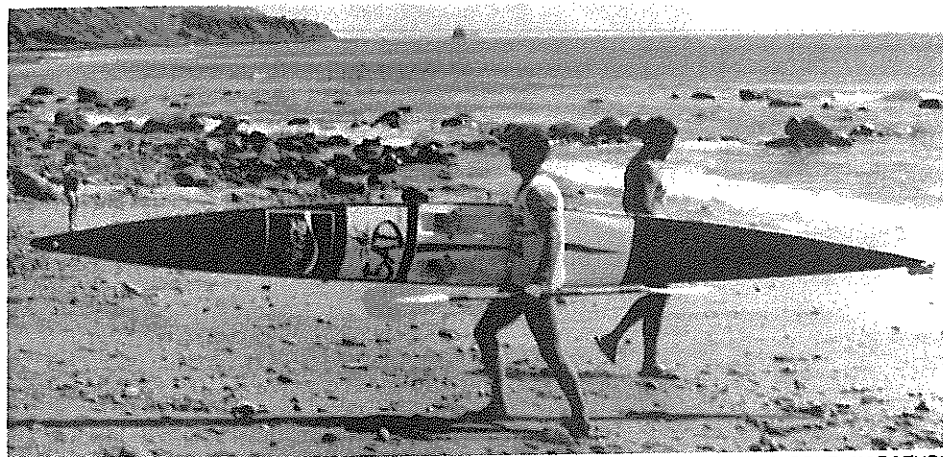
Once again we have had a very successful year in competition at State and National level.

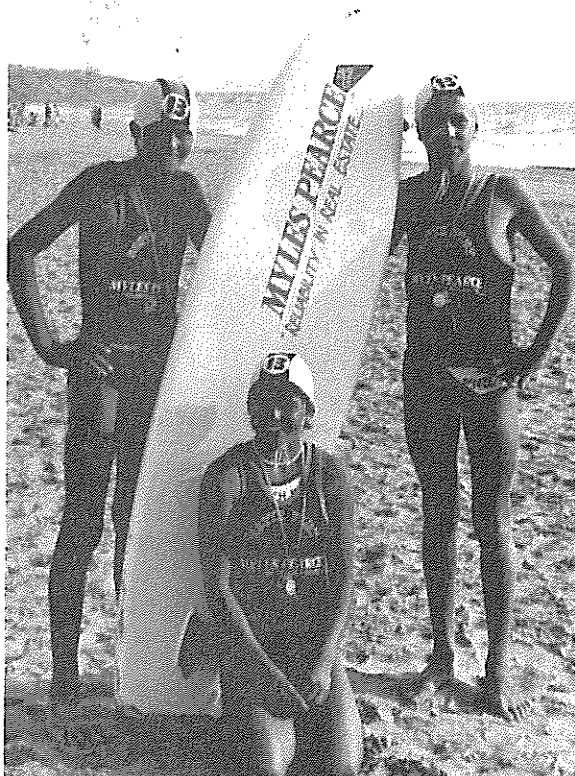
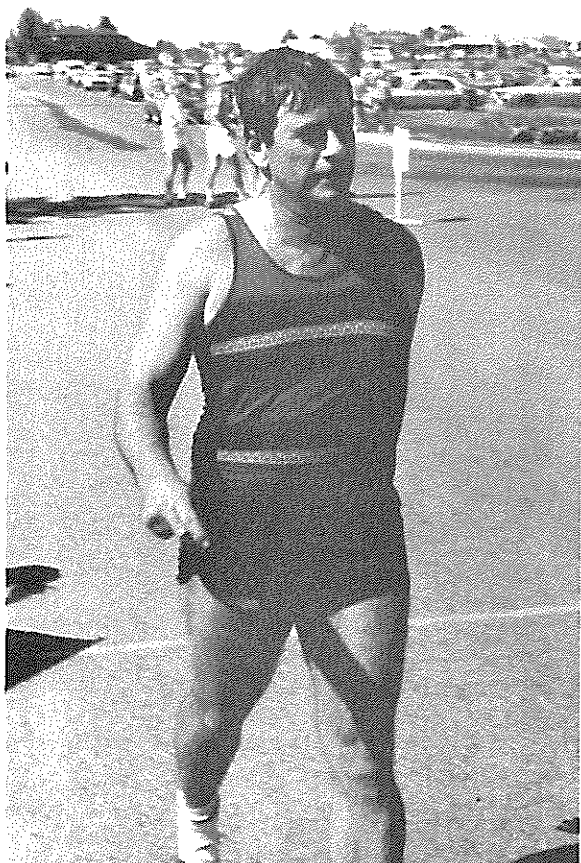

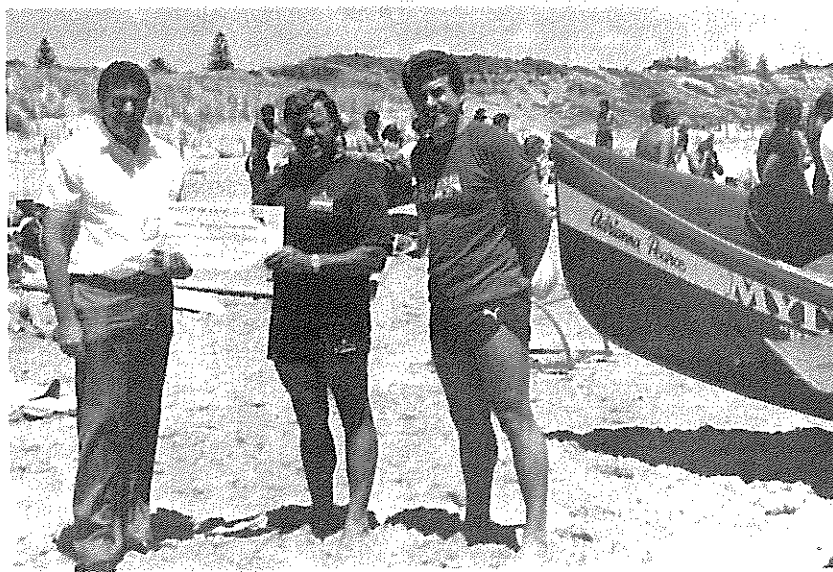
