AFFILIATION

The Club is affiliated with the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (South Australian State Centre Inc.).

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Club are:-

- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and apparatus.
- (b) To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River, or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.
- (c) To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in life saving.
- (d) To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other Public Bodies in improving facilities for bathers.
- (e) To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights or privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

As Vice Captain In Charge of Patrols, I was very happy with the performance of South Port during 88-89 season.



Jump in South Port rescues

THERE has been an alarming rise in rescues and preventive actions at South Port.

Port.

This is shown in the South Port Surf Life Saving Club's 29th annual report which will be presented at the club's annual meeting on Sunday, June 5.

South Port's surf patrols saved 12 persons from drowning and performed 54 preventive actions, which ensured those people did not further endanger themselves.

First aid cases were also up over the past season's figures and totalled 65, three of which required St John Ambulance attention.

The majority of first aid cases related to surfboard cuts and abrasions and South Port will urge the SA Surf Life Saving Association to engage in a high profile public education pro-

profile public education program next summer.

History was created during the 1987-88 season with Sharron Hobbs being the first female member to win the club's most patrol hours award with 96 hours of patrolling duties.

Almost 70 club members performed more than 1900 hours of surf patrol activities and South Port is again proud to announce "no lives lost while on patrol."



With no Bar Manager elected at the Annual General Meeting I stood in temporarily for the whole season.


It is a time consuming job but rewarding.


