



#### AFFILIATION

The Club is affiliated with the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (South Australian State Centre Inc.).

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of the Club are:

- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and apparatus.
- (b) To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River, or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.

- (c) To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in life saving.
- (d) To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other public bodies in improving facilities for bathers.
- (e) To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights and privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

The near-drowning of a five-year-old boy at the mouth of the Onkaparinga River yesterday has sparked a warning for parents to keep a close eye on their children.

The boy was saved by Ms Pam Scott, a member of a Southport Surf Life Saving Club patrol, about 2.20pm.

Club officials later implored parents to be alert to the dangers children faced at the beach.

The club's public relations officer, Mr Dick Olesinski, also said groups of children were risking their lives by ignoring warnings and diving off cliffs at the mouth of the river.

He said unsupervised groups of youngsters aged between about 12 and 16 were congregating at the popular spot and jumping off the 5m cliff into only 2m of water.

"I am imploring parents to keep an eye on their children at all times," he said.

Mr Olesinski said the club

provided mobile patrols of the area and officers regularly warned people of the danger, but "we can't be there 24 hours a day".




## BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

South Port also entered a crew in the Seagrims Outback Surf Boat Challenge at Pt. Augusta, picking up 3rd place in their division.




As this was my first year as Boat Captain, I have to thank a few of the club's older boaties for their help throughout the year.







## SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL SITUATION AND MATTERS

The 1996/97 season was again another slightly disappointing year financially. While our cash situation improved slightly, with current assets up \$3000 on end of last year, we fell short of our budgeted income target for the year by \$10000. Fortunately, expenditure adjusted downwards to ensure the net budget target was achieved. Nevertheless, if this downward adjustment was the result of deferred expenditure, the pressure on fundraising and other income sources will inevitably increase in 1997/98. I strongly suspect that we have been neglecting capital assets, with depreciation on equipment and buildings outstripping new expenditures, and contributing to yet another deficit on the balance of income and expenditure.

Compared with last season, the main areas of increased revenue were:

- the canteen, where profits were up by 61%, no doubt due in part to the cash bonanza provided by hosting Junior State Titles;
- (ii) clothing, where we actually made a profit for the first time in my tenure as Treasurer (though there is still a fair amount of stock to sell);
- (iii) 'donations', which is dominated by equipment sales and craft subsidies;
- (iv) the grant from the Noarlunga Council; and
- (v) sponsorships (though the figure is still well down on the figure from three seasons ago).

On the down side, profitability in the bar fell by 23%, but then 1995/96 was an extremely good year for the bar.

On the expenditure side, the main features to note are:

- (i) an extraordinary rise in depreciation, reflecting the loss (or non-delivery) of materials needed for the erection of the Wearing St shed;
- (ii) a marked increase in expenditure on the touring team (reflecting the miserly contribution made in the previous season);
- (iii) marked increases in expenditures on telephone and printing, both of which are matters that the incoming committee may need to give attention to.

In conclusion, while our cash reserves have improved slightly over the course of the year, the need to ensure revenue is sufficient to meet planned expenditures remains a constant challenge.




