

AFFILIATION

The Club is affiliated with the Surf Life Saving South Australia Incorporated.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Club are:

- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.







Well done to coaches Vonnie Olesinski and Greg Higgs and the under 21 Marchies for sticking at it and achieving a gold medal at the State Titles.



A first aid course will be run through the winter to update people and for any new people who wish to receive new skills.



MEMBERS LIAISON OFFICER


here did this season go? It was busy but a successful year in all areas, thanks to all members both junior and senior.


I was pleased with the way most of the gear was looked after and stored, especially the tents.

TREASURER

AUDIT

By arrangement with our Auditors I was able to have the Club books assessed each month. This was of great assistance as it allowed the finances of the Club to be monitored and advice provided to me to ensure than our obligations were met.

BUDGET

An attempt was made to provide a cash flow budget in which expenditure was allocated to the specific areas of club functions such as life saving, competition etc. with the official in charge of that area responsible for the cash flow. This worked with some success however we tended to look at what we allowed for expenditure and not how we were going to raise the money.

I believe that this is an area that should be improved so that we can manage our cash flow more efficiently.

A new coding system was adopted to identify all the accounts. Income and expenditure has been allocated under these new accounts and because of this a number of items compared to the following year will show some variation or have a nil balance.

The financial statement for the season 1998/99 will reflect this new approach.

BAR ACCOUNT

This is still the main earner for the Club and the turnover has been reasonably consistent.

Managing the bar is a big job and needs a methodical approach to achieve success.

We have been fortunate to have David Watt as manager for the last three years and have benefited from his skills and application.

CANTEEN ACCOUNT

Although turnover is down the canteen functioned well under

the management of Chris Clohesy and proved to be a viable income producer. The work in the canteen can be very arduous but Chris and her team put in the effort and were able to produce a creditable result.

CARNIVAL

An analysis of income to expenditure for the Masters and State Carnivals showed little financial benefit to the Club. In round terms the nett gain was less that \$200. Greater financial benefit should be expected if the Club is to manage a carnival again.

ACCOUNT

You will note that the closing stock balance for this account is high. We ordered too many clothes for last season, including patrol wear and had some difficulty with pricing and purchases on credit. It has been agreed that no purchases will be made next year, with the exception of some hats, and that no credit will be given. Vonnie and Reenie undertook a very hard job and acquitted themselves admirably.

COUNCIL GRANT

With the help of Bill Jamieson from Christies Beach SLSC and Rhonda Cunningham of Port Noarlunga SLSC, a submission was made to the Onkaparinga Council to increase their \$2,000 annual grant. This application was made on behalf of the five clubs in the council area.

Recommendations have been made in Council for the grant to be increased to approximately \$7,000 per annum, subject to inflation and we will be advised of the outcome in July.

EQUIPMENT AUDIT

A full equipment audit was completed this year and all gear that was capable of being numbered was treated accordingly. This will

be a base audit and will be updated in November of each year.

GEAR PURCHASES FOR MEMBERS

A new agreement is to be put in place next year varying the financial arrangements for repayment to the Club.

INSURANCES

The clubhouse was revalued for insurance purposes. The replacement cost is now estimated at \$540,000.
