

- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.



hange, sometimes it's hard to accept. In 1998-1999 we as well as everyone else must be prepared to change. A Surf Life Saving Club is not just a Surf Life Saving Club anymore, we are a community based service club and if we do not accept this we will not survive. As you all know this year the Onkaparinga Council upgraded our annual grant from \$2,000 to \$7,000. Thanks I might add to Geof Moffat from South Port and Ronda Cunningham from Pt. Noarlunga for submitting a detailed costing of placing a patrol on the beach. This submission was forcefully placed before council by Councillor Bill Jamison who was the driving force for the whole submission. I am extremely grateful to Bill and Councillor Arty Ferguson for supporting and pushing this increase in our, and all Mid coast surf club annual grants. The whole of the \$7,000 grant went towards purchasing a new I.R.B.

The Onkaparinga Councils attitude to Surf clubs in the Mid coast has been nothing but positive and I congratulate them for finally appreciating what these clubs do for the beach going public. The Council also has engaged Consultant Woods & Baget to draw up and price the optimum surf clubhouse. This clubs sub committee spent many hours attending meetings with these consultants and came up with what we believe is a clubhouse to take us well into the 2,000's. Now we will have to do the real work and come up with an affordable building, but if your not in it, nothing happens.

This season again no lives were lost during patrol hours and I thank all patrol captains and their patrol members for their vigilance and support. This is what it's all about and I would hope you all are back next season. This season we ran only 6 patrols. I feel we have plenty of members to have 10 patrols but we need the appropriate number of patrol captains and I.R.B. drivers. I know Jackie Rawson our Vice Captain until work commitments vested her from continuing had great problems in getting members to fill these positions, so put your hands up you younger members, it's your turn.

To those who gained awards, well done. To the new Bronze and Qually holders, congratulations it was a long process, but I thank you for your patience. Our chief instructor Andy Whitford, I feel has done an excellent job under difficult circumstances and I thank him. As always we had a few problems in our education section but I am pleased to hear this section are preparing themselves for the forthcoming season.

To the competition side of our club, what a marvellous improvement, we are starting to show our potential. I congratulate the competition Panel chaired by Olle, 4 years ago we competed in 15 events out of 95 at the state championships. This year over 60 events carried the South Port hat. I am sure Olle's report will be very large and interesting.

Our Junior Division, all looks well but I can see we need to recruit, our numbers are down as are all clubs in the Mid Coast, the clubs in the Gulf, are not having this problem and we must address this in the winter.

To Vonnie Ollie our apparel officer, a fair bit of mucking around in this job and I thank you. Everyone appreciates your effort.



COMPETITION ..



Why try and fix something that is not broken and is fail proof? It takes real character for a person to admit they are wrong or don't know and ask for help


IN CLOSING..







YOUTH DEVELOPMENT



INDEPENDANT AUDIT REPORT

Qualification

RUNNING REPORT

It is with great pleasure to present this report. It was one of the most productive seasons for results produced at the State Titles by our Running Squad.

The season began with the preparation for the annual City to the Bay Fun Run back in July 1998. What began as a fitness adventure ended with eight to ten dedicated people training twice a week. The idea was to Run - Walk - Talk and enjoy! Everyone did enjoy! We had 10 people complete the 12 kilometre course. For next season everyone is welcome! You don't have to run, you can walk. This is another way to improve your aerobic capacity.

From this pre-season training we developed a programme which included some distance training up to Christmas and beyond. The squad grew as the season progressed. Sprint training venues were tried and tested with Port Noarlunga Primary School Oval being used in the later part of the season. It was central to most runners and has a good grassed surface. 
