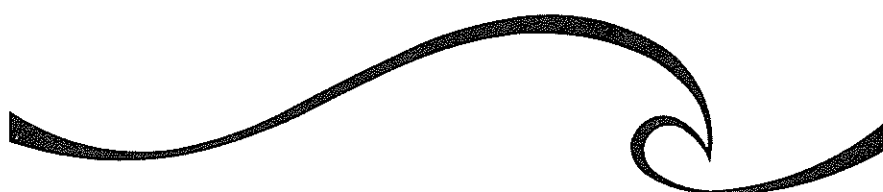



PRESIDENT

The finale at the National Championships was hard to beat. The joy on the faces of our two March Past teams was unbelievable, I was extremely proud and I am sure every other member of our club felt the same.

There has been a lot of work done by many members in the last 12 months to maintain the forward thrust of our club in South Australia. I am pleased with the way our club is participating in all aspects of Surf Life Saving. It is crucial we are represented on all Panels, Committees and interested groups as a large club and that is what we are, it is vital. We are at the coalface of decision making here and nationally.

As you are aware Surf Life Saving is now funded by the Department of Emergency Services, but sadly our annual grant has not increased and we still receive a pittance from State Government. The Onkaparinga Council grant is more and I commend the Council for their support, without their grant of \$7,000 we would battle to supply the services we do to the public. Over the last few years we have been in consultation with the Council on Capital Development (ie. Clubhouse extension). Due to the tireless work by Bill Jamison, headway has been ongoing and I am pleased to say the Dept. of Emergency Services is now showing interest and only last April we had Dept. of Emergency Services consultants audit the club in view of Capital Development. This could amount to nothing but I can assure you we will be assisting and encouraging this process.

This season we started with 10 Patrols, which required members to patrol only once every six weeks. Sadly we had to drop one Patrol but we still were able to increase patrols by 50% from last season. It will be possible to have 12 Patrols next season if we can gain more I.R.B. drivers and I know there are some incentives planned to encourage more members to gain this award. Overall the Patrols were run efficiently and with good spirit. Again no lives were lost while we were on Patrol, and that by far is our greatest achievement for the 99-00 season, I thank all patrolling members for their dedication and generosity to the club and the community we serve.

To our Educators, what a marvelous job you have done this season, more Bronze's than in any other year in our history. Andy Whitford and his team have been extremely busy. A standard has been set, let's improve next season. The Annual Proficiency ran smoothly and I thank Bob Menhenart for his assistance.

The Competition Panel chaired by Andy Highs is on target to fulfill its 5-year plan. Our FIFTH at the State Championships is on course and the whole Committee should be pleased with their effort. I must congratulate our Beachies for an excellent job. The Boaties, organised by John Devitt, an area really on the go. Our young Board paddlers, Under 16 Board Relay champs, what a difference one young man can make, I refer to Jason McGaffin, this member has taken over coaching our board paddlers and I congratulate him on his efforts. The March Past Teams and especially their coaches Bob Mayo and Andy Highs, I am in awe of you, "Congratulations".

The behind the scenes people, Chris Clohesy, Mark Niease and Vonnice Olesinski our Canteen, Bar and Apparel Officers, a great job. Without your efforts our club would be much the poorer.

The Junior Division, a consistent year and I am encouraged by the number of under 8, 9 and 10 year olds. Kevin Clohesy filled in the gap as Junior Chairperson when Fred Curran resigned due to work commitments; I thank Fred for his efforts. The Club thanks all age

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group leaders and coaches. Our members are increasing, we could do with more and I am sure Sharryn Campbell our new Junior Chairperson and her new Committee will be addressing this already. As in all sectors of the club I thank those who do a lot of work behind the scenes.

The Senior Committee, a very dedicated group of people and I thank them all for there support and efforts. All working well together, a few spits but that is normal. I don't wish to single out Committee Members, but Don Alexander's handling of the treasury position has been excellent, especially his correction of last years statements.

The club hosted two Carnivals, a Senior and the Master States. Both were run well especially the Masters. We were also happy to entertain Robert Brokenshire, Minister for Emergency Services, David Cox, Local Federal Member, John Hill, Local State Member, Mayor Ray Gilbert, John Fitzgerald and major sponsors at this carnival.

Our Fundraising Committee, another good year, a dedicated group, more volunteers are more than welcome, it truly is a good fun group and monies raised are much needed. Our Sponsors, without your support this club would not exist. The Dollars and goods you supply, are used with the utmost care and all monies go to supply all Life Saving gear before competition equipment is bought. Richard Olesinski our Promotion Officer does a marvelous job in this area and I am sure he will report in more detail.

In conclusion I feel the club is on the right track but we must not become complacent and should be pushing hard to achieve our goals, so lets with haste get on with it now.

Well done to everyone, especially the coaches, Bob Mayo and Andy Higgs for all their hard work. The Juniors didn't have a very good season competitively. They really only have only one way to go. Hopefully with some quality coaching and leadership and working as a team they will improve next season.

FUNDRAISING:

Well done to the Fundraising Committee for all their work during the season. It is a thankless task trying to come up with new

ideas to raise funds to put bread on the table and keep the Club functioning at a reasonable level.

THIRTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF JUNIORS/NIPPERS:

Congratulations to all those Members who helped organise the Thirtieth Anniversary of the South Port Nippers and the unveiling of the new Junior Honour Board at the Clubrooms.

REGISTRATIONS:

Registered Members increased by three (3) this season from 285 to 288 this season. There was an increase in the Juniors and a decrease in the Seniors.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT:

The Club Board of Management and other Committees within the Club worked extremely well this season with only a couple of changes in personnel. Well done.

Fundraising figures.

- **99/00 - \$13,842**
- **98/99 - \$11,966**
- **97/98 - \$10,560**

So as you can see the team has done extremely well. This does not include however any sponsorships or donations. This equated to an additional \$10,000.

But lets put it into perspective. If you analyse our turnover for the season we still have along way to go. If you also compare these numbers to previous years we have even further to go to keep all those areas funded and resourced.

Turnover figures.

- **99/00 - \$133,000**
- **98/99 - \$109,000**

So what does it all mean?

We increased club turnover by 22% That's money through the doors to keep it running. BUT, we only increased our nett fundraising income by 15.6%. So next year we need your help to achieve that little bit extra.

So who was responsible for this continued herculean effort. They need to be recognised and thanked, not just by me, but by the whole club. It is these people who allow our competitors to keep competing and our patrols patrolling with the latest gear.

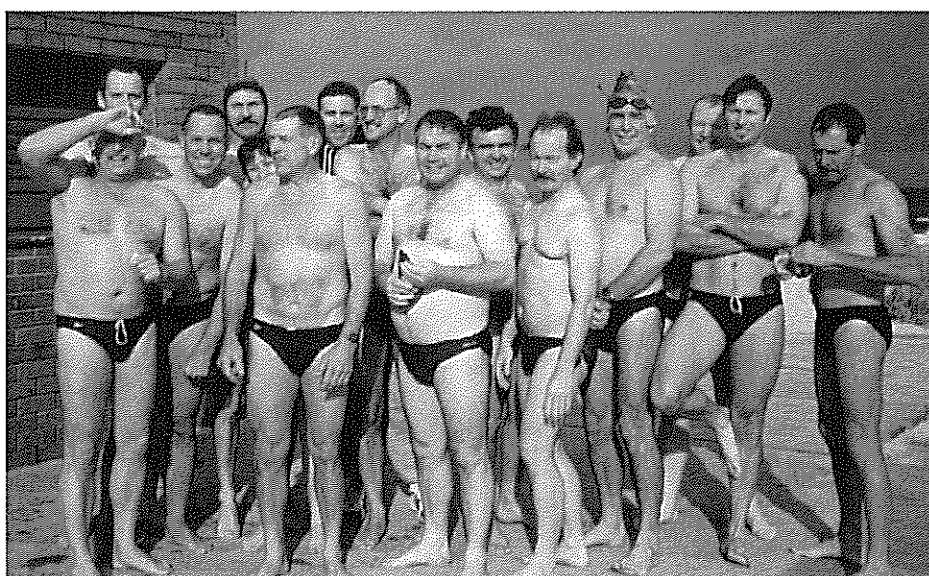

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Special Purpose - not for sale Accounting Standard

The accounts are a general purpose financial report that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia). The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the accounts.

(a) **Income Tax**

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) **Inventories**

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) **Property Plant and Equipment**

The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of property, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and resolved to adopt the revaluation of the Club's plant and equipment at the value of \$185,268.50. Due to the nature of the lease of the site of the Club's building, as noted in the previous period's Auditor's report, the Committee has adopted a valuation consistent with the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF SOUTH PORT SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC.

Scope

We have audited the financial report being the Statement of Income and Expenditure, Balance Sheet, Statement of Cash Flows, notes to and forming part of the Financial Statements and the Statement by Members of the Committee of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc. set out on pages 1 to 5 for the year ended 30 April 2000.

The Committee is responsible for the financial report. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Association.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial report is free of material misstatement. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Club's financial position, the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Qualification


Given the nature of the operations of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc. it is not practicable to establish accounting control over all amounts receivable prior to the issue of a cash receipt and therefore it is not possible to know whether all income due to the Club has been received by the Club and recorded in the books of account.


Accordingly, our audit has been limited to the amounts of cash receipts recorded in the books of account of the Club.

Depreciation has not been included in the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ended 30 April 2000. This is a departure from Australian Accounting Standard AAS 4, "Depreciation of Non-Current Assets", which requires that depreciation be taken into account in determining the Surplus/(Deficiency) for the year. The total depreciation expense, if calculated at the prior periods rates, would have been \$17,293 (1999: \$21,699). Had depreciation charge been brought to account, the operating surplus for the year would be \$3,676 (1999 loss of \$6,704).

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, subject to the above qualifications, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with applicable Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements the financial position of South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc. as at 30 April 2000, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the
