









In my first year as Club President, it is with great pleasure I present this report after a season where no lives were lost on our beach, enabling us to again fulfil our Mission: 'To maintain South Port Beach as a safe and enjoyable environment for the general public and our members.'

There are numerous highlights over the past season, however, none of this would have been achieved if it was not for the many hours put in by our numerous volunteers – to all, thank you for your commitment to our/your Club.

Our purpose is to save lives and create a safe environment for the community at South Port. I suggest that we as a Club, offer more to all by the way of personal advancement, social inclusion and life skill development.

As our younger members progress through Surf Life Saving, they will become better members of society, be able to react calmly under pressure, communicate across a wide spectrum of the community and understand the need to give back to our community.

Many thanks to all our patrolling members who ensured our high standard of patrolling and keeping South Port Beach safe for all swimmers, surfers and visitors.

Our patrols will continue to be challenged in the future with increased local population growth and it's plain to see that many more community members are already making South Port their beach to visit and enjoy.

I'd like to highlight the major increases in our rescue figures - 24 lives saved compared to 4 the season before, 713 preventative actions compared to 352 and 78 first aid cases compared to 51 the previous season. These statistics further prove the need for us to be where we are to ensure that we remain sustainable into the future.

Congratulations to our new Bronze Medallion members and our Nippers continuing their Surf Life Saving journey and completing their Surf Rescue Certificates – you are our future and we wish you all the best in what you want to achieve at South Port.

I'd also like to forward thanks to the Board of Management (BOM) who have been very patient in helping me to become familiar with the job of Chairman. In particular, special thanks to Michelle Copley and Nicole Berry, who have made the learning curve a lot easier to manage.

Many members are not aware of what happens behind the scenes, and I'd like to recognise the unbelievable workload that David 'Wal' Watt undertakes throughout the year in managing the bar and functions area. This is our Club's major fund generator, and without Wal's commitment, we would not be in as good a position as we are.

Thanks to Don 'Bristles' Alexander, our Treasurer for guiding us into a very positive financial direction, Club Captain Lyndon Mills for his commitment to leading us forward, Adam 'Duggie' Parkinson for his continued counsel, Carla Zeitz for her countless hours in ensuring our competitors are entered in events, Cass Stoodley for her great coordinating role in fundraising and events, Vonnie Olesinski for her dual roles as Canteen Manager and Apparel Officer and to members who took on Office Bearer roles the past season – a huge thanks to all.

Congratulations to all of our competitors, Juniors, Seniors and Masters who pulled on the South Port cap proudly and did their best locally, as well as interstate. To all our coaches, in particular, David Clayton, Richard Cunningham, Simon Linden and Jason McGaffin – thank you for your huge commitment to keeping South Port a more than competitive Club.

Well done to Junior Chairperson, Stephen Nahlous and his talented team of Age Group Managers and Assistants who guided our Juniors throughout another busy season. Major highlight was the successful hosting of the inaugural Junior Branch Championships - the first Junior carnival held at South Port for many years. Thanks to our great workforce, who again ensured the day was a success with minimal issues.

One area that deserves accolades for their dedication, is our ever-reliable band of officials – to all, a huge thanks. Our officials have taken on more responsibility to ensure our members are able to compete. I would encourage any of our members, in particular Junior parents to put their hand up and help. No experience is required, as Surf Life Saving has a great mentoring system in place while you grow in confidence.

Thank you to all our supporters and sponsors, in particular Kahini Pty Ltd (SLSSA Trust Fund), the City of Onkaparinga, the State Government, through the Office of Recreation and Sport and the Federal Government through their continuing support of Surf Life Saving across the nation. A list of Club sponsors can be found within this report - thanks for your commitment to our Surf Rescue and competitive activities.

I'd like to thank past member Michael Keelan for his ongoing support through a weekly surf report, what's happening at South Port segment and a safety tip on 5AA each Saturday morning through the summer. This provides extensive promotional exposure for not only our Club, but for Surf Life Saving in general – many thanks Michael.

The Club has been heavily involved in planning for the redevelopment of our gym as part of the Wearing Street project. The concept includes not only our gym being upgraded, but includes toilets, showers, a meeting area, together with emergency equipment storage being included. A building sub-committee will be formed to oversee the project – an exciting upgrade of a facility that is used regularly by many of our members.

Social events are an important part of any successful Club's fabric. Member support is encouraged for the Club's Sunday Sessions, where members and the broader community can enjoy great live music, meals, and refreshments and importantly, the Club can generate much needed funds, particularly during the 'off-season'. Put the first Sunday of each month in your diary.

I'd like to finish by quoting Surf Life Saving Australia's Values and suggest to all of us, that we strongly align with these and ensure we use them as the basis of how we continue to successfully operate in order to be a sustainable Club into the future.



TREASURER'S REPORT
Don 'Bristles' Alexander

The summarised report on income, expenditure and trading for the season 2017-18 has been taken from the 2018 Audit conducted by PCS Accountants, which is included as Annexure "A".

Richard Olesinski has made a great start in his first year as Club President and there have been many initiatives already taken with more to come by him in the future. The Board of Management had many contributors during the season that impacted not only on their own areas but also to our income and profit.

Once again David "Wal" Watt, led the way with a fantastic effort in his role of Club House Manager, not only with management of the bar but with organising functions and special events that led to bar trading producing a gross profit of \$55,181. As a matter of interest David has been bar manager of the Club nine times and during that period he has been responsible for making a trading profit of over \$370,000. Of course, many members contribute to this success, as David would acknowledge, but there is no doubt in my mind that his contribution has been outstanding.

Our total income increased by \$30,217 over the previous period, due to a number of factors and individual efforts over a range of portfolios.

The Club received Grants from:

- City of Onkaparinga Council \$13,682
- Kanini Pty Ltd (SLSSA Trust Fund) \$11,000
- SLSSA Beach Safety Equipment \$10,000
- SLSSA \$4,545
- SA Government-Rec and Sport \$4,250

Total \$44,477

Sponsorship funding came from Telstra, Babcock Pty Ltd and Oliver Concrete Construction and Bernie Lewis Home Loans who continue to donate funds in support of the Club.

Surf Boat Fundraising contributed \$8,424, mainly through the efforts of Jason McGaffin in his position as Surf Boat Captain, by introducing a number of new initiatives, especially in using the resources of the Australian Sports Foundation.

In general, our expenses have been kept in check, although the costs passed on to the members from SLSSA continue to rise and amount to around 30% of our total expenditure of \$182,113.

Cash and Cash Equivalents improved by 35% to \$130,492 of which \$97,000 has been invested in term deposits at the ANZ Bank and Peoples Choice Credit Union.

Three years ago, the Board of Management was convinced by the City of Onkaparinga that the Wearing Street Proposal was finally going to go ahead and that the Club's contribution could be around \$100,000. With this in mind we decided that we needed to put aside around \$30,000 per year for us to fund the redevelopment of the gym with additions including, change rooms, training room and emergency services area with IRB and associated equipment to strengthen our lifesaving capabilities. I'm happy to say that we have achieved that goal and can see no reason why we cannot continue to put aside a similar amount over the next few seasons.

A special thanks to all members who donated their time to help contribute to the financial growth of the Club.

I am pleased to report that the Club is solvent.

It is no mean feat to achieve this, and whilst we expect it each year, hats off to all that made it possible to return such great and positive rescue and prevention numbers again this year.

I would like to thank all the patrolling members for another season of commitment, training and fun.

A big thank you also goes to all the families of our patrolling members who also sacrifice seeing each other.

We have had many new members join the Club this year, I would like to congratulate and welcome you all. The feedback from the Patrol Captains is extremely positive. You have all become strong assets to your patrols and to the Club in general. We hope to see you all back in the next year for another great season, where you will be able to consolidate on what you have achieved this season and start considering the many development opportunities that are available to you for being a member of this great Club.

On a more serious note, our patrols have suffered this year from a decline in patrolling members and patrol non-attendance. Non-attendance puts pressure on the remaining members of the patrol and on those handful of volunteers who are frequently called upon to relieve the pressure in these situations.

The 44th Annual Club swim was excellently run - big thank you to everyone who helped on the day. We had 53 swimmers in total. 30 swimmers participating in the long swim and another 23 swimmers doing the half swim.

For the upcoming season, I would like to see us fill the role of Chief Instructor, which will become Life Saving Education Officer as of season 2018-19. We are in desperate need of more active patrolling members.

Also, members need to be able to extend their knowledge of skills and surf awareness at their own Club as we all have busy lives and are unable to travel to other venues. We must remember that surf lifesaving is a voluntary service and we need to make education more convenient for members to access. I know there is a willing group of kids wanting to do their SRC and extend on their Bronze Medallion, IRB etc.

I'd like to reiterate my thanks to all of you for the incredible work you put in for the Club and the community. Without your service, we'd be unable to carry out South Port core business, saving lives.

To maintain a "healthy Club", we rely on the many volunteers each year who share their time, talent, hard work and commitment, all without any compensation. It's crucial that we acknowledge all of them from patrolling members, to working the bar, cooking the BBQ, coffee machine and canteen and thank them for the important part they play in our Surf Life Saving organisation.

Volunteers create a platform that sustains our Club's viability into the future.



The apparel was a success this season, with a broad variety of stock readily available.


An initial outlay was made on bathers and compulsory hi-vis vests etc, therefore making it available for competitors and members this season and for the coming season.





The financial statements cover SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C as an individual entity. SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C is a not for profit Association incorporated in SA under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985.

The functional and presentation currency of SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies
Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment of losses. Plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.
