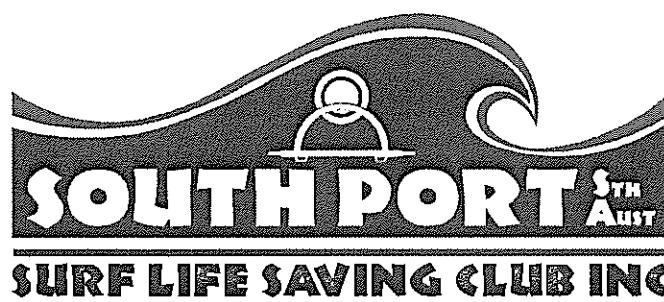

Name: South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

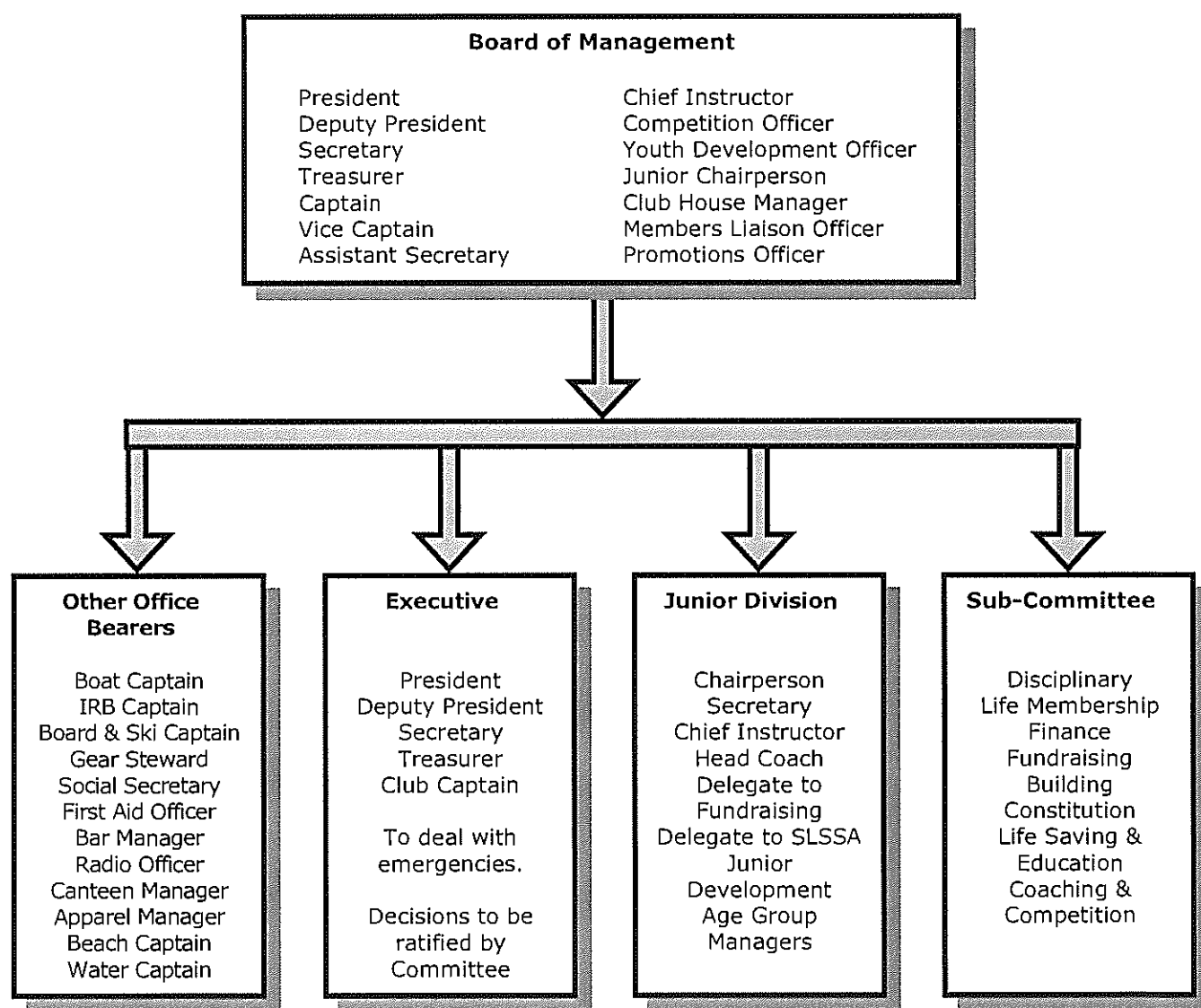
Affiliation: The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

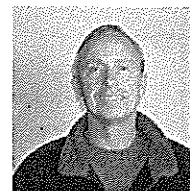

President's Report

It is with satisfaction I report to you this season. I feel we really are making great gains as a club in all facets of surf life saving.

The Mid Coast Clubs have formed an entity called the Mid Coast Surf Life Saving Club Group Inc. As you are aware, the five clubs in the Onkaparinga Council area have been working together for a number of years. We have formed a working group to communicate with the Council on all business matters relating to future opportunities that may arise to assist the clubs financially, eg, capital works through the Assets Management Group and leasing of Council properties.

Again I must thank the Onkaparinga Council for their annual grant of \$7,000 plus another \$1,000 under the Community Aid Scheme. This money is injected into life saving equipment for patrols and first aid.

Surf life saving comes under the umbrella of Emergency Services and our annual grant was \$6,000. Emergency Services has allocated an additional \$400,000 to Capital Development which is good news. This year \$300,000 goes to Moana and \$100,000 to Normanville. Thank you to Minister Robert Brokenshire, he truly is right behind our association and I am sure that if he could channel more money our way he would.

At the Masters State Championships which were held at South Port this year Minister Brokenshire presented the Club with a considerable amount of money through the Active Grants Scheme. The Club purchased a training aid called Resusci Anne, this piece of equipment cost in excess of \$4,000 and will greatly

enhance our ability to train our Members in resuscitation and first aid.

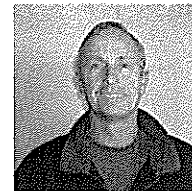
At the same carnival we also entertained a number of our sponsors.

Mobil Adelaide Refinery donated to the five clubs of the Mid Coast Group a rescue board and an Ambu Manikin. This shows how working as a group we can benefit all of our clubs. I thank Mobil for their support and look forward to a long relationship with them. To all of our supporters, who donated generously this year, I thank you, for without your support we would not be able to put our patrols on the beach.

Again no lives were lost at our beach while we patrolled this season and I take this opportunity to thank all Patrol Captains and their patrolling Members for a job well done. I hope we made it a bit easier this season with bigger breaks between patrols. To our educators a job well done. We had a small number of instructors this season but I am hopeful we can address this issue next season.

During the winter months our Life Saving and Education Panel met and devised a plan to produce a roster of 10 patrols. This has worked well and I can see the possibility of expanding this to 12 in the coming season. Having more qualified IRB drivers for our patrols is a priority this season, 2 per patrol would be ideal.

To the competition side well done to you all. I congratulate Andy Higgs for his tireless work in this area. Under 21 and Open March Past Teams, you cannot do better than that. Australian Gold Medals back to back. Our craft area is showing gains and I must

congratulate you all, especially Alex Botha for gold in the U19 Ironman and bronze in the Open Ironman. To all Members who competed in this area, well done.

To the boat area congratulations to all who rowed to make us the Boat Rowing Champion Club of South Australia. Under 21's – State gold medalists and a great effort at Kurrawa. Our Masters boat crews won 2 gold medals, and we are hoping to improve in other divisions next year.

I must congratulate the Junior Committee for the effort in recruiting new Members this season. This area is not easy to manage and is extremely time consuming. The numbers on the beach confirmed their success, especially in the under 11 age groups and down. With an influx of new parents, their fresh enthusiasm and the current dedicated group I am sure we will become stronger in numbers and more competitive. I must thank several hard working Members: Sharryn Campbell (Our Most Outstanding Member), Anita Johns, Sue Goldfinch, Mark Gluis and Mike Etheridge, all the Age Group Managers and Assistants, and Coaches.

Our Fundraising division put in a great effort this year, organising some tremendous functions for our Club Members. The Seafood night will take some topping.

Brian "Zee" Johns and his team must be congratulated on their invaluable work throughout the year.

The canteen was run by Anita Johns and Annette Shephard. I thank you both for

your efforts on a big job well done.

The Bar crew of David Watt and Beau Lyons produced the best financial year ever in turnover \$47,456 and profit \$16,014. Again well done.

Andrina Wright and Sue Goldfinch have done a fabulous job on the apparel sales this year. A difficult portfolio, but the girls have done well to report a profit of \$1,265 for the season. Thanks also for the more than generous support and donations from John Devitt in this area.

In closing I must thank my Committee for the effort they have all put in this season. As you can see by our financials, we are not a little club. A lot of money goes in and sadly out. With the New Tax System incorporating GST and Business Activity Statements, Don "Bristles" Alexander spent many hours organising the accounts and putting them on the computer through the Club's new MYOB accounting software package. The paper trail was again handled well by Chris Mullins our Secretary. John Devitt our Captain has been involved in all facets of the Club and has contributed greatly to our successful season. Thank you Devo. Well done to Mike Etheridge with his support team of Craig Whitmee, Matt Clohesy, David Yates and Janet Puplett for training new Members and existing Members to achieve life saving awards. Andy Higgs, our Competition Officer is to be commended again for his efforts. Richard "Ollie" Olesinski as Promotions Officer has put in a lot of work behind the scenes.

I hope to see you all next year in whatever role you choose.

As I sit and write this I am not reflecting on what has happened during the season just past, but what will be required in the fast approaching 2001/02 season.

I believe the primary focus should centre on two areas. One is core to our survival and the other is natural fallout from the first.

- **Membership:** We need to continue to target new Members. With new Members come new ideas and of course more funds. But of course these Members in turn consume more resources requiring more funding.
- **Funding:** If the South Port membership continues to increase per the trends of the last 5 years we would as a club require to increase our fundraising efforts by 15% to 20% per year. In dollar terms this equates to an increase from \$17,500 this year to a base level of \$38,500 by 2006.

But back to the current year.

First, let me congratulate the Fundraising Committee for their steely efforts and realising in excess of the budget this year of \$12,000. [Actual figure \$17,677.]

We weren't sure we would get there but in the end a hearty effort, an increase over last year by approximately \$4,000.

In any success there are always some outstanding efforts, and I must single out those individuals for special

mention. Don "Bristles" Alexander for the Seafood Delight Evening and it was, on all quarters. Anita Johns and Sharryn Campbell for their decorating efforts on all occasions. The VIP lunches were always of a high standard as was the way in which the girls carried out each task to ensure all was well at every function. Thank you to Pam Etheridge for organising the 100 Club and making it the financial success it was.

A huge thank you to Andrina Wright, Sue Goldfinch, Diana Foord, Chris "Dollar" Foord, Chris Clohesy, the young crew and John "Devo" Devitt for their continued effort and support doing whatever it took to make sure that you, the Members, have what you see now.

As you can see, the task ahead is a mammoth one and as shown above, the figures are only to maintain our current standard of equipment. If we require any extraordinary expenditure then we need to find new ideas and promote ourselves outside the organisation.

That is where the untapped funds are . . . not our Members.

You the Members can put in the time and that's what we need. Organising, conceiving, cajoling, being part of the plan and then promoting and realising that plan.

Please take a moment to consider being part of that group looking toward 2006. I look forward to seeing you, and joining you on any street corner yelling the praises of South Port SLSC.

Both the Seniors and the Juniors performed

Fundraising: Well done to Brian Johns and the Club's Fundraising Committee for a great season of fundraising events.

It must be difficult coming up with new ideas for fundraising each season. The seafood night was a great success along with all the other functions and raffles.

Congratulations to all those involved for all their hard work during the season.

Carnivals: The Masters State Championships and the February Senior Carnival were again a great success this season, proving again that South Port continually organises and conducts the best carnivals. Congratulations to all the Members who involved in the organisation and conduct of the events.

Registrations: Registered Membership increased by 21 this season from 288 last season to 309 this season. The highest registrations for five seasons. There was a significant increase in the number of registered Juniors this season, 97 in total an increase of approximately 20.

Financial Statement for Year Ended 30 April 2001

The financial position of the Club has improved over the past two years and especially over the last twelve months. Our total revenue has increased from \$133,215 in 1999/00 to \$165,535 this season and this upward trend should continue into the future.

We were very fortunate to have a strong committee led by Chris "Dollar" Foord in addition to many very dedicated Members who were prepared to put in the time and effort for the benefit of the Club. Our main focus, of course, is providing quality patrols on the beach. With John Devitt's leadership we are doing this as well as any surf club. On the competition side, with Andy Higgs ensuring that all areas of competition are covered, the Club has the potential to return to the golden days of the eighties, particularly with the recent emphasis on the Australian Titles as our end goal rather than the State Titles. In addition, Sharryn Campbell and her team have done wonders with the Junior Division.

What happens when you have patrols, competition and juniors operating effectively is that they provide a nucleus of Members to provide stimulus and income to our money raising efforts, whether it be buying a ticket in a raffle, standing at the bar or supporting a major function. Without these Members we will amount to nothing.

Fundraising

The Members' support to Brian "Zee" Johns and his team provided income of

\$17,677 to the Club this year resulting, after expenses, in a profit of \$10,522. A wide variety of functions were held to cater for everyone, with the highlights being the Seafood Night and the Annual Dinner.

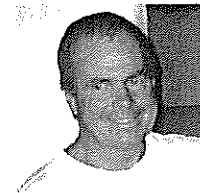
We must offer our special thanks to my very good friends Kerry and Allan Campbell for their generous donation of much of the seafood provided for the Seafood Night. Kerry and Allan not only provided the food but also were our seafood chefs. Their donation, coupled with profit from the bar, resulted in a profit for the Club in excess of \$2,500.

Thanks to all who contributed to a successful fundraising season by attending the social committee's meetings, organising events and assisting in decorating and cleaning up after the functions.

Trading Operations

The real flow-on effect of a strong club however is the performance of the trading operations, which this season totalled \$65,742 and provided the Club with \$19,960 in gross profit.

The Club is embarking on a project to extend the Clubrooms, second storey preferred, or if not approved, extending outwards. Whatever happens we need to seriously consider taking advantage of our position to improve our social facilities and enable the trading side of our revenue stream to grow. We cannot rely on the more traditional forms of income to last forever.



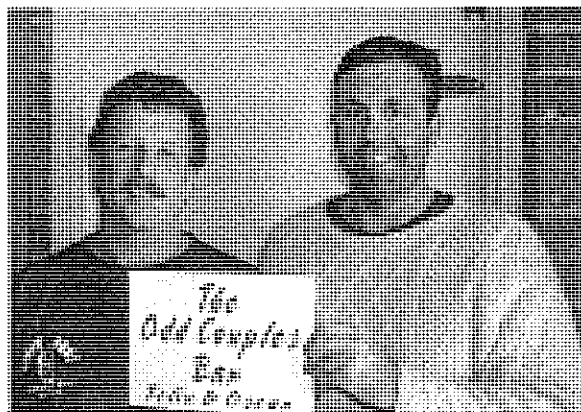

However, for the first time, this position was successfully shared by both Wal and Milky. There were still times when others were needed to assist and to all we say thanks for your help. Next season we will need more volunteers behind the bar so please don't be frightened to offer help. We guarantee you will enjoy the experience.



Canteen: Brian and Anita Johns ran the canteen this year and on revenue of \$12,031 returned Gross Profit of \$2,681. This is another difficult position to take on, especially with family commitments, so our thanks to Brian and Anita for your time and effort. Thanks to all Members who helped from time to time in the Canteen and especially to Annette Shephard for her effort over the year.

Clothing: This year Andrina Wright and Sue Goldfinch were responsible for clothing. We all know how hard it is for this area of our trading to make a profit, however we are pleased to report that on revenue of \$6,056 they returned a Gross Profit to the Club of \$1,265. It is difficult to please everyone, especially when it comes to clothing, but they have done a great job.





Financial Statement for the Season 2000/01

Our Auditors have once again completed the audit for the Club and some of the changes over the previous year are as follows:

Balance Sheet:

Member funds increased by \$21,073, brought about by an increase in assets of \$9,334 (mainly due to more cash in the bank, receivables and higher stock values), and a decrease in liabilities of \$6,705 (due to less outstanding accounts).

Cash Flows:

With revenue of \$165,535 and deducting payments to suppliers and others, the net cash left for operating activities was \$30,361. From this amount \$21,254 was used to purchase plant and equipment. After repaying borrowings, we ended with \$7,929 in cash at the conclusion of the financial year (previous year \$3,630).

Income and Expenditure:

The detailed Statement of Income and Expenditure provided the Club with an operating surplus of \$21,073. Note that the audit provides for a Depreciation charge of \$21,830. Last year we did not have a depreciation charge.

Conclusion

My special thanks go to Geoff Price and Bob Mayo for their assistance at all times in matters financial and especially to Bob for setting up the format of the audit which has now been recommended as a standard for all surf clubs throughout South Australia.

The financial records of the Club are now kept on the MYOB accounting package which was forced upon us by the introduction of the GST. The GST has had minimal effect on the Club and with the resulting efficiency of the MYOB program has enabled us to run our accounts more effectively. We are now in a position to invoice Members for any services that the Club provides and we are hoping to invoice through this system all Members prior to registration day in October for membership fees.

I appreciate the support of everyone who has contributed to the Club in any way financially, whether by donation, fundraising or through our trading operations. It is through these efforts that we are able to provide the finances to allow our patrols, competitors and Club assets to remain at a high standard. I look forward to another successful year.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2001**

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts are a general purpose financial report that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia). The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the accounts.

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) **Inventories**
Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (c) **Property Plant and Equipment**
The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of property, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and resolved to adopt the revaluation of the Club's plant and equipment at the value of \$185,268.50. Due to the nature of the lease of the site of the Club's building, as noted in a prior Auditor's report, the Committee has adopted a valuation consistent with the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated

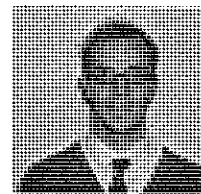

My first season as Chief Instructor has certainly kept me on my toes, with most things running smoothly. The areas that I had problems with were Patrol Inspections, certificate courses and the dropout rate in courses.

I started Patrol Inspections too late in the season. We need to start them from the first patrol in November and have them completed by the end of December. The major problem with running any course at the Club is that the candidates are not registered or are not financial Members, and during the season I had to chase people for their forms and money. The other problem is recouping the cost of the training manuals. We need to invoice the candidates before the course starts and have starting times set before August each season. It's called "planning". The other worrying trend is the 50% dropout rate in Bronze courses. The average course started with between 8 and 10 candidates and within the first week or two we would lose half of these people. If we have starting times and fees paid before these courses start, there may be less chance of them dropping out.

Awards this season were down on last year because of the lack of people who are willing to train squads. If we are to become the top club in this State we need to train more Members in all areas. Other clubs put a great deal of emphasis on training their Members. This is why clubs like Semaphore do so well in the Champion Club Award. They gain easy points by training as many Members as possible.

Thank you also to Matt Clohesy, Craig Whitmee and Andy Whitford for training the Bronze squads; David Yates for the IRB squad and Janet Puplett for the First Aid squad. I must thank John Devitt, Andy Higgs, John Nearmy, Dave Jolly, Andy Whitford and the Management Committee for their help and support throughout the season.

We had a number of glowing praises from people who were treated for injuries and from the Ambulance Officers who attended the Club. The Ambulance Officers stated that they are always impressed with the standard of first aid given to the injured and the willing assistance by the Club Members to help with the patients whenever needed. It is always good to hear comments like this, it just proves that we are a great Club.

Andy Higgs produced new First Aid Report Forms, ie, one set for the Doctor and or Hospital and the other set for minor treatments. These report forms are specially designed for the person giving First Aid treatment to give a full detailed record of the injuries, treatment and after care eg; Doctor and or Hospital etc. A big thank you to Andy for providing these important and necessary forms.

I did a check on the First Aid cases and I estimated we had at least 98. During the Season the Club received a donation from the Mobil Adelaide Refinery. The essential equipment the Club received from the donation is vital

and of immense importance to the Club for the training of its Members. The equipment comprises of two Laerdal Resusci-Anne Torsos and one Laerdal Airway Management Trainer. We also received a donation from the Emergency Services Fund for a Laerdal First Aid Training Manikin.

Congratulations to Janet Puplett and the group she helped and trained to take part in a First Aid Competition. The team achieved a top ten placing in the State Under-19 First Aid Competition, a great achievement seeing it was their first attempt.

I would like to see the Club with an ATV Sport 4 Wheeler as used by many Surf Clubs interstate. If we had one of these vehicles it could be used to transport the injured from the beach area and across the bridge to the waiting ambulance. It could also be used to carry Rescue Equipment and First Aid Equipment and it would be of great assistance with the operations of the Club.

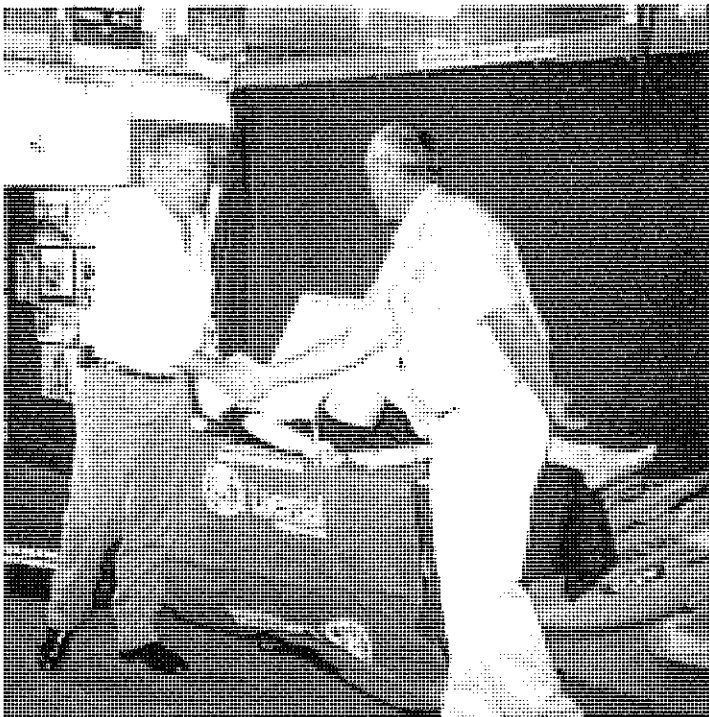

The Boat Crews displayed what would be our Club's best performance for many years. The Under 21 crew made it through to the second quarter final. The 220s Boat Crew competing in the Masters Championships were eliminated in their heat finishing fourth in a close race.

In summary, if I was given the opportunity to pick an individual competitor as outstanding for our Club at the Australian Titles this year it would be without doubt Matthew Clohesy. His efforts in replacing the injured Justin Pitcher at the Titles in the U21 Boat Crew and then fulfilling his obligation to the U21 March Past team and being rewarded with a Gold Medal, were outstanding.

South Port was again the host of the State Masters Titles. Our Members showed the rest of South Australia how to set up and conduct carnivals. Congratulations on an excellent job. It is the same people who then compete. A big ask when you witness this level of competition. The competitors from our Club excelled this year in trying out in events that they had not competed in for many years and some surprised themselves with medals.

The Senior State Titles at Aldinga Bay had excellent results. Last season we attained 5th position with a total point score of 345. This season we retained 5th position but increased our point score to 388. To reach 4th position we need to increase our score by 336 points. This sounds a big step but we still have 70 events and 1st to 6th place to have competitors in. This equates to a maximum possibility of securing extra 1,470 points. If we are satisfied with staying in fifth position we will never improve. But if we accept the challenge we will grow as a Club both in

It has been a great season this year for the Club's boat area, with every crew giving it their best to produce some very pleasing results. In South Australia there are three major awards to be won each season. We are extremely pleased with the 2000/2001 results as South Port won all three awards!

Super Series: The Club came out on top in the City of Port Augusta Super Series, winning a set of oars and a sweep oar valued at \$2,400 and \$833 in prize money. We had a great challenge between our board and ski paddlers and the U21 boat crew for a keg. The U21s won, but not without a good fight.

State Titles: We also won best performing boat club at State Titles with a lot of effort and teamwork. Both sweeps took our Club to a new level of competition with innovative training methods and valuable experience. Thanks to you both.

The AGM was held with 43 Members in attendance.



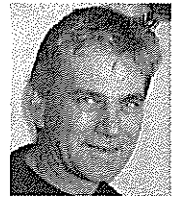

general handyman work, Brian and Anita Johns for their work in upgrading the canteen, Kevin and Matt Clohesy for their incredible work with the new key system, Dave Randall for his upgrading of the security system and David Watt and Beau Lyons for maintaining the bar and carpet area in such a well organised manner. I must also thank the many people who kept the toilet areas clean during the season, swept out both the main Clubhouse area and the storage area, tidied up outside the Club, helped with the rubbish bins and generally worked to make the South Port Clubhouse an enjoyable place to be.

The Members are to be congratulated on the manner in which they have kept the main clubroom area much cleaner this past season and I think the persistence of our previous Clubhouse Manager, Mike Etheridge, is now starting to show benefits. The pool table has been a valuable acquisition to the Clubhouse and has offered Members another form of entertainment and kept many of the youth at the Clubhouse for longer times than in past seasons. I applaud the Board of Management for showing initiative in this area.

For many years South Port March Past team was advised that the presence of women in a team meant "no success"! In 2001 the Australian Championship team, aided by three ladies, marched without any deduction at all, believed to be only the second time by any team ever. Over many years we have all come to admire Jenny Whitmee's style and determination but this season her presence was complemented by both Anna Worden and Katherine Hobbs. Much credit must be given to both these ladies with Anna having presented herself with no marching experience and Katherine joining as a first year senior.

It is important to note that the team structure needed to be reviewed given that the Club had to make certain judgements in respect to people's participation. However, from a coaching point of view, both Bob and George (after his recovery from surgery) worked extremely hard during the season to achieve the best combination which competed through the year with very few deductions, but as events unfolded, the State Championship team had to be changed to further comply with Club policy. The team that marched on the Friday in Queensland was perceived by the judges to not have the presence of previous South Port teams. The Bob Mayo "coup" solved the team dilemma with eleventh hour changes that saw Hally removed from his backline comfort zone to the belt position and both Katherine and Anna marching in a backline. That left only Greg Higgs remaining from the backline of the previous year. Bob's successful moves, with so little time to nurture them, has definitely placed him in a class of his own as a march past coach.

The South Port March Past team has now won 12 medals since 1985 with the last seven medals having been achieved consecutively. The five Australian Titles won since 1995 has placed the Club in the top five all time winning Australian March Past teams and together with Bundaberg remain the only clubs outside of New South Wales to have ever won the event. Much credit must go to a number of competitors who have contributed to this record, along with the coaching efforts of Bob Mayo and George Hann. South Port's March Past accomplishments over a long period must now clearly rate as an outstanding South Australian Surf Life Saving success story.

The back-to-back Australian Titles achieved by both our Senior and Under 21 Teams at this year's Titles was also in itself a remarkable achievement. A continuance of the same dedication and enthusiasm makes three in a row by both a real possibility.

Such success does not come without a lot of behind the scenes help. To this end, John Hall's "sponsorship", Pat and Frank Harris' care of the senior uniforms and Frank Drake with the reel must not go unmentioned.

Bob has indicated over the past couple of seasons that in his advancing years he finds it more difficult to deal with the varying expectations and disappointments that arise on selection of a team which has the highest goals and it is probable that he may not wish to continue.

Should this arise it is important that the Club upholds the tradition.
