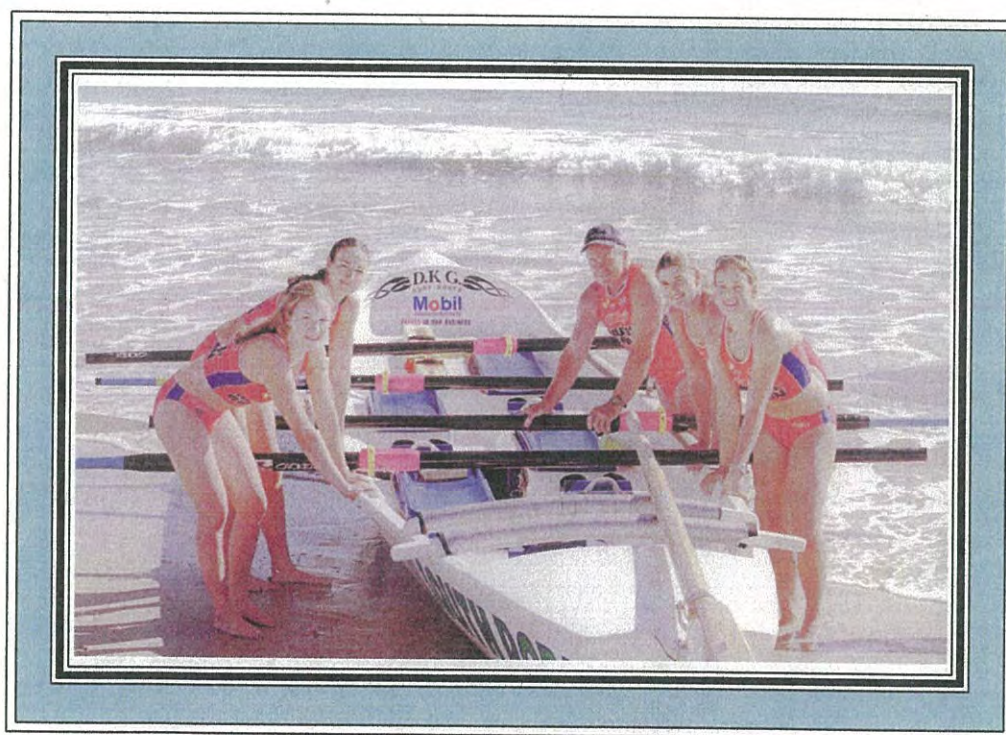

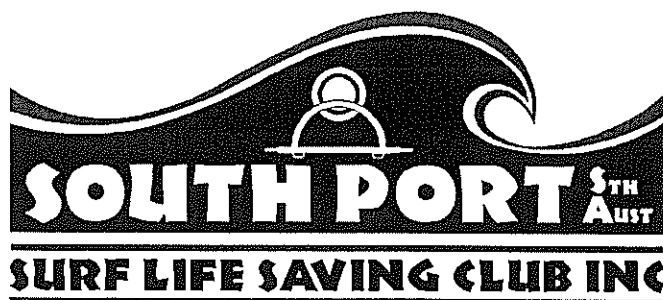

Objectives

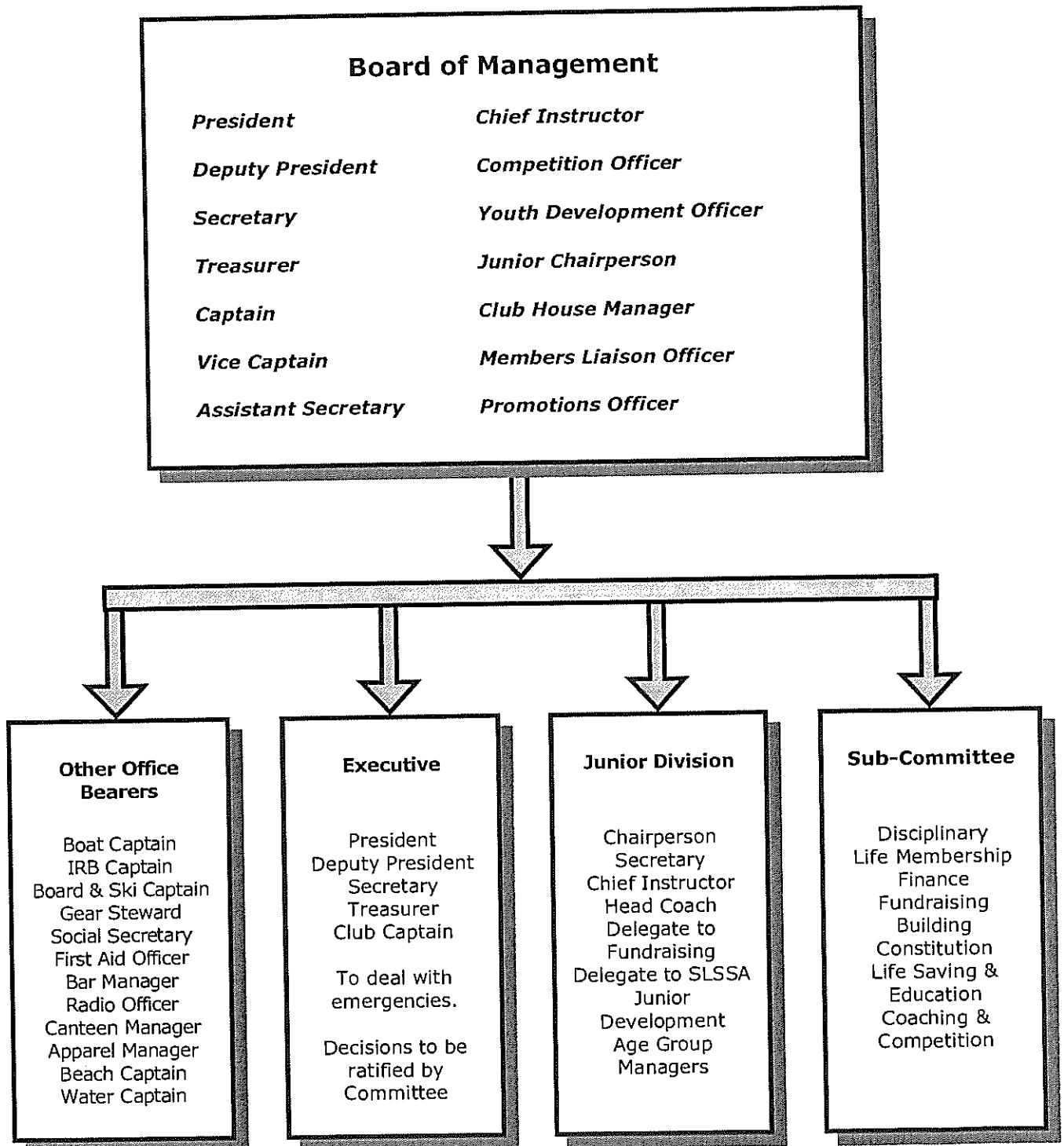
- To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and life saving equipment

President's Report

Firstly, no lives lost while we patrolled our beaches. In patrolling our beach I don't only mean Saturdays and Sundays during the summer between the hours of 1pm and 6pm. Our members patrol every time they train; members of all sections of our club during training spend many unrecorded patrol hours. Even Sunday mornings in the depths of winter we have a group on the beach prepared at any time to assist and perform if a situation presents itself.

In patrolling our one kilometer of beach we have during the last winter designed a patrol trailer which carries all of our rescue equipment which enables us to respond quicker than in the past and I thank John Devitt and David Cornish for its construction. It truly has made setting up the patrol area a whole lot easier. Our Life Saving and Education committee also should be thanked for the planning and procuring of the best rescue equipment and making all current members proficient and instructing new members in gaining awards. I would encourage all members to update and gain more advanced training in first aid and A.R.C. The news of a couple of our young Juniors assisting in a rescue at the river mouth a couple of weeks ago, shows all of us just why we are here.

Over the last few years the Surf Clubs in the Onkaparinga Council have combined to form an entity call the Mid Coast Surf Life Saving Group Inc. This group will be the vehicle to liaison with council and large corporate bodies which wish to deal with one body instead of five. It was this group that initiated the forming of the Facilities Management group now part of Surf Life Saving Capital Works Group to assist all clubs in updating their Club Houses i.e. Moana's new Club House. My thanks to the leadership of Bill Jamieson for his work.. As current Chairman I would also like to acknowledge the groups new management team, Secretary, Brian Johns and Treasurer, Don Alexander and a

special mention to Robin Perry for his ongoing work in the construction of our constitution and effort in incorporating the group

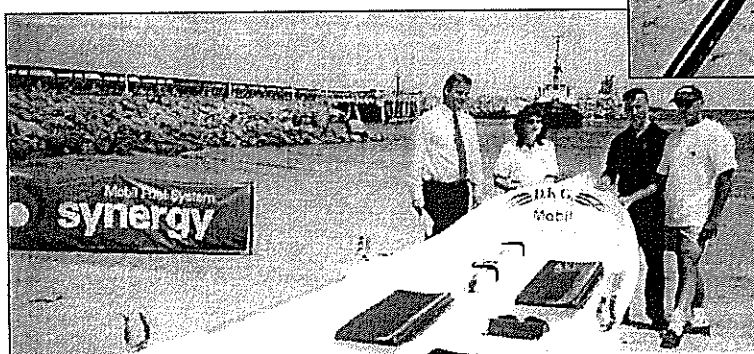
financial result. To her helpers, well done especially Debbie.

Thank you to those who did spare a few hours during the season. A very special thank you to new club member, Deb Philips for the many hours she volunteered of her time.

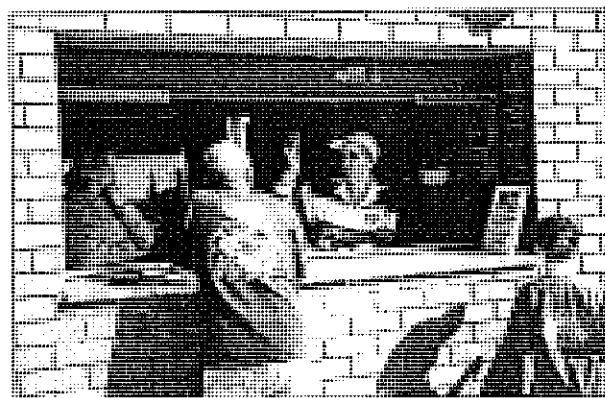
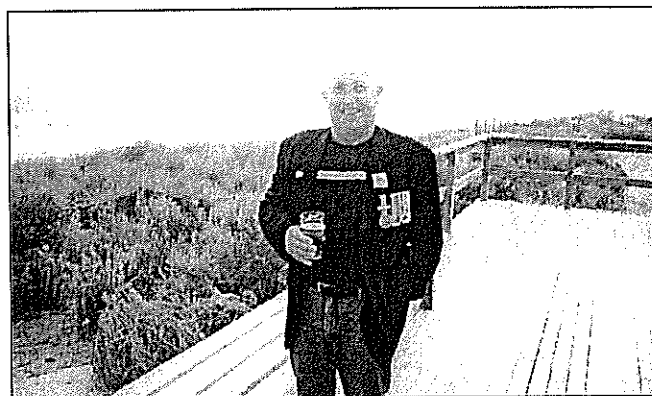
Finally, the State Titles weekend went extremely well in the canteen area. This would not have happened without the team of members who pitched in to make it so successful. Thank you to all.

However, this is a common problem for all clubs and perhaps we should be grateful to break even. It is always difficult in the clothing area to know just what will sell, what sizes will be required and most importantly control the stock.

Bar: Shane Randall took on the responsibility of Bar Manager at last year's AGM and did a very good job in the early part of the season. Unfortunately, the time required to fulfil the obligation of Bar Manager was interfering with his employment and he had to resign from the position.

It was decided that Wal, Beau and Bristles would take over and we are happy to say that they did a great job, as the financial report shows. Profit was up on a slight increase in sales





Financial Statement for Year Ended 30 April 2002

Balance Sheet

Member equity stands at \$248,148 an increase of \$14,450 over last year. The main contributor for this is an increase in our Assets of \$25,695. Our Liabilities increased over the previous period by \$11,245 due to the taking up of a number of account payables and setting aside prepaid income from a grant. No payments were made to reduce our liabilities to State Centre for our loan (as we had paid in advance the previous year) however, it is intended to clear this amount next season.

Cash Flows

Revenue increased slightly to \$173,275. Net cash provided by Operating Activities was \$75,611 enabling the Club to purchase additions of plant and equipment to the value of \$73,438

Income and Expenditure

Income increased over the previous period but not by any significant amount; in fact revenue was down in some key areas. Gross profit from Trading Operations; increased by almost 15% to \$22,906. This was mainly due to a higher percentage of profit from the Bar and a fantastic result from Vonnie Olesinski, due to her management of the Canteen.

Not to be left out by Vonnie's achievement, Richard Olesinski rates a very special mention due to his outstanding efforts in obtaining Donations, Grants and Sponsorship in excess of \$50,000, a wonderful effort, by an individual member of the Club. Without Olli's contribution we would not have been able to spend what we did on plant and equipment this past season.

Expenditure decreased by 4.4% to \$73,354 and even though we spent a large sum on

plant and equipment, there were no cuts in the area of Life Saving Services.

Property Plant and Equipment

Each year we re-assess the value of our premises, plant and equipment and revalue the Club's property. This year the amount came to \$223,526.

After taking into consideration the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated, we have included in the accounts a further re valuation decrement of \$20,000 to the Club's premises

Audit

You will notice a further change in the presentation of the accounts, which have again been prepared by Tilley Murphy Hughes. These are to comply with the relevant accounting requirements. The Statement of Income and Expenditure provides a more detailed listing of the allocations used by the Club.

Conclusion

It has been an exciting season and one that many will look back on with pride in the achievements that have been gained by many individuals and the Club in general. Of course, we can always do with more funds to enable the purchase of additional equipment or make improvements to our premises, but often this is not always possible. After three seasons as Treasurer, I can honestly say that the Club is in a sound position, at this point in time, but as you will be aware on reading the financial report we cannot relax

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2002

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia). The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the accounts.

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) **Inventories**
Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (c) **Property Plant and Equipment**
The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of its premises, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and revalued the Club's property, plant and equipment at \$223,526. After taking into consideration the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated, the Board of Management ratified a further revaluation decrement of \$20,000 to the Club's premises as at 30 April 2002.

- (d) **Cash**
For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

- (e) **Reclassification of Financial Information**
The Club has adopted the presentation and disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 1018 "Statement of Financial Performance", AASB 1034 "Financial Position" for the first time in the preparation of this report. In accordance with the requirements for these new or revised Standards, comparative amounts have been reclassified in order to comply with the new presentation format. The classification of comparative amounts has not resulted in the change to the aggregate amounts of current assets, non-current assets, current liabilities, non-current liabilities or equity, or the net profit of the Club as reported in the prior year financial report.

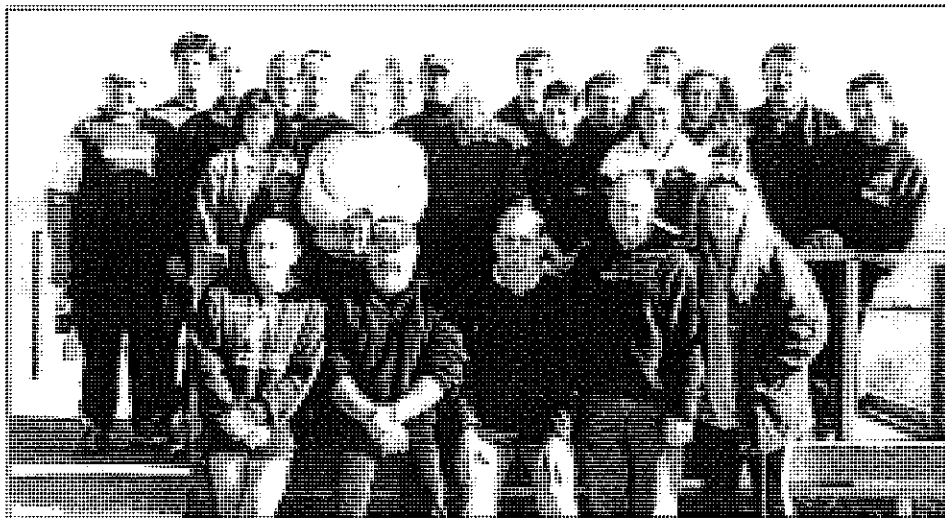

It's going to take a good management team with Member's support to run the Club from now on. The responsibility to the Public and our Members is something that has to be foremost in our minds for the successful future of the Club.

Mike Etheridge as always for his diligence and persistence with the Proficiency's, the ever-painful job, has been outstanding. Then his work to organise the training of our new award holders is tremendous, I think he secretly lives at the Club. I'm sure Mike will have a list of these awards in his report. He's also an Examiner and Official at Senior and Junior Carnivals.

Andy Higgs, what can I say, when he gives it away there's some very big shoes to fill, the conduct of the Club this season on the Competition Arena although not always reaping the rewards we would like, has been fantastic. He's involved with everything, Under 21 March Past, Beach events, weekly Club swim, Annual long swim, and the very important job of lodging State Titles entries for Masters, Seniors, and the Australian Championships. The Board and Ski area of the Club has had a good season without the results to show for the efforts put in by our competitors in this area. The time spent training, for some, morning and afternoon is testament to their commitment to the sport. This side of the Club has grown in strength and should continue to do so with the recent influx of Juniors passing their Surf Rescue Certificate. Jason McGaffin and Steven Clohesy are to be congratulated on the work they have done. At the Aussie Titles they had some encouraging results overall with a couple of competitors experiencing those types of surf conditions for the first time. 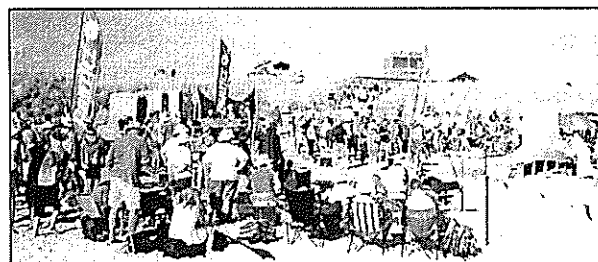

Proficiencies

Because of the bad weather and members not handing back their proficiency sheets, November and December turned into a nightmare. Due to the problems we have made a few changes. Each examiner will have a master sheet and they will tick each area that you have passed and you will only have two opportunities to complete your proficiency next season. It will take a few sessions to bring you up to speed. If you don't sit these ARC proficiency sessions your award will lapse and you will have to sit for your ARC Award again. Next season the IRB

Driver and Crew proficiency will have to be performed in a wave height of 1.5m or higher, this may cause of few dramas.

This season we had a wider range of awards sat for which was great to see.

The only areas that I have concerns over are Bronze Medallion with only seven and IRB's with only 2 completing these awards. The Club needs approximately 20 new Bronze members and 5 IRB Drivers each season to maintain our current patrol status. From next season the IRB Crew will be taken out of the Bronze Medallion Award and will be examined as a separate award with candidates of a minimum age of 16 years old.

Season 2001/2002 was set in motion surrounded with much uncertainty. In seeking an early commitment from people we were initially faced with the departure of Anna Worden and the untimely demise of Ansett. The decision by Terry Smallwood to join the team and hence give us the required number was most appreciated. Given that we trained with the bare twelve, the support given to us by Brian Dixon in his role as the thirteenth man was indeed magnificent.

It was decided to separate responsibility for operational matters from coaching, and this was achieved by way of John Hall acting as team manager. After early financial commitments were made by team members, accommodation and travel arrangements were secured in November. From a training and competition viewpoint our pre Christmas efforts were quite effective, but a concerted effort was needed to attain the required level upon resumption in January. With much work we eventually completed the domestic part of our competition as undefeated, culminating in the achievement of our 18th State Title.

Our campaign at Kurrawa began with the Friday competition, but we did not compete to our normal standard. Due to our nil deductions in the critical wheeling section, one less spacing and dressing deduction would have seen victory to South Port. Even though we were so close to Freshwater the team was relegated to third by way of the middle score concept, which we fully support. The second place getter was Alexandra Headlands, notwithstanding they had a total of 15 deductions.

The South Port March Past Team has now won 13 medals since 1985, with the last eight medals having been achieved consecutively. The question as to whether this effort can be

sustained will be addressed during the off season! At this stage, some members have indicated their intention to retire, but others have indicated their intense desire to even the score with Freshwater. Obviously this can only be achieved with a team comprised of dedicated and experienced people. However, in light of this uncertainty, it is important that the club upholds the tradition by working towards the establishment of a team that can follow on.

The introduction of the under 21 event has also been fantastic for the club, with Andy and his team achieving a third consecutive Australian Championship Gold Medal. A great achievement! It was certainly encouraging from the Senior Team's point of view, to witness the under 21 team, by way of their own initiative, emulate some of the difficult training routines which the senior team had established.

The efforts of our team were supported by a lot of behind the scenes help. To this end, the sponsorship of "Your Security Company", Insulation Solutions, Captain Harris and Pat's Care of the senior uniforms and Frank Drake with his hands on approach to the reel and other matters.
