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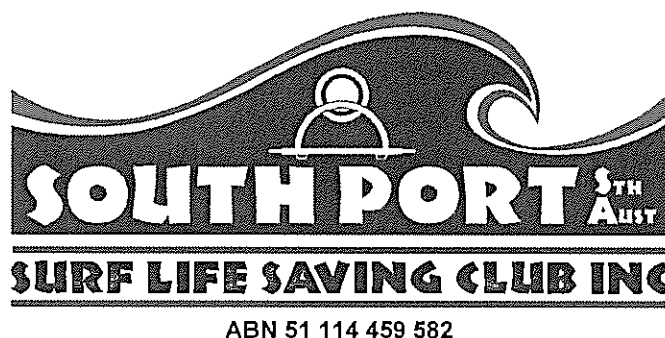

Affiliation: The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

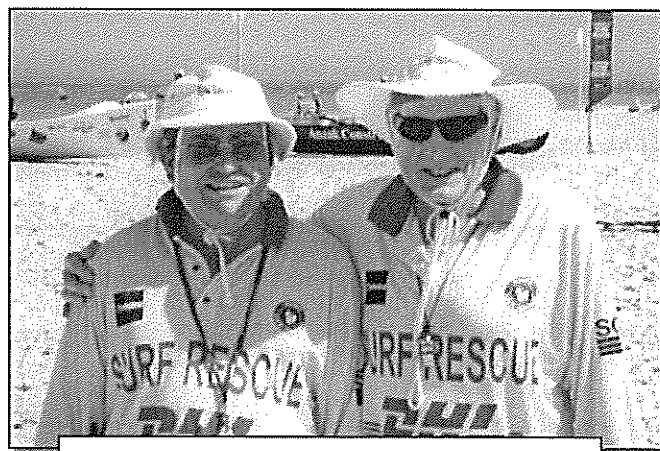
Objectives

Life Saving SA shall from time to time determine

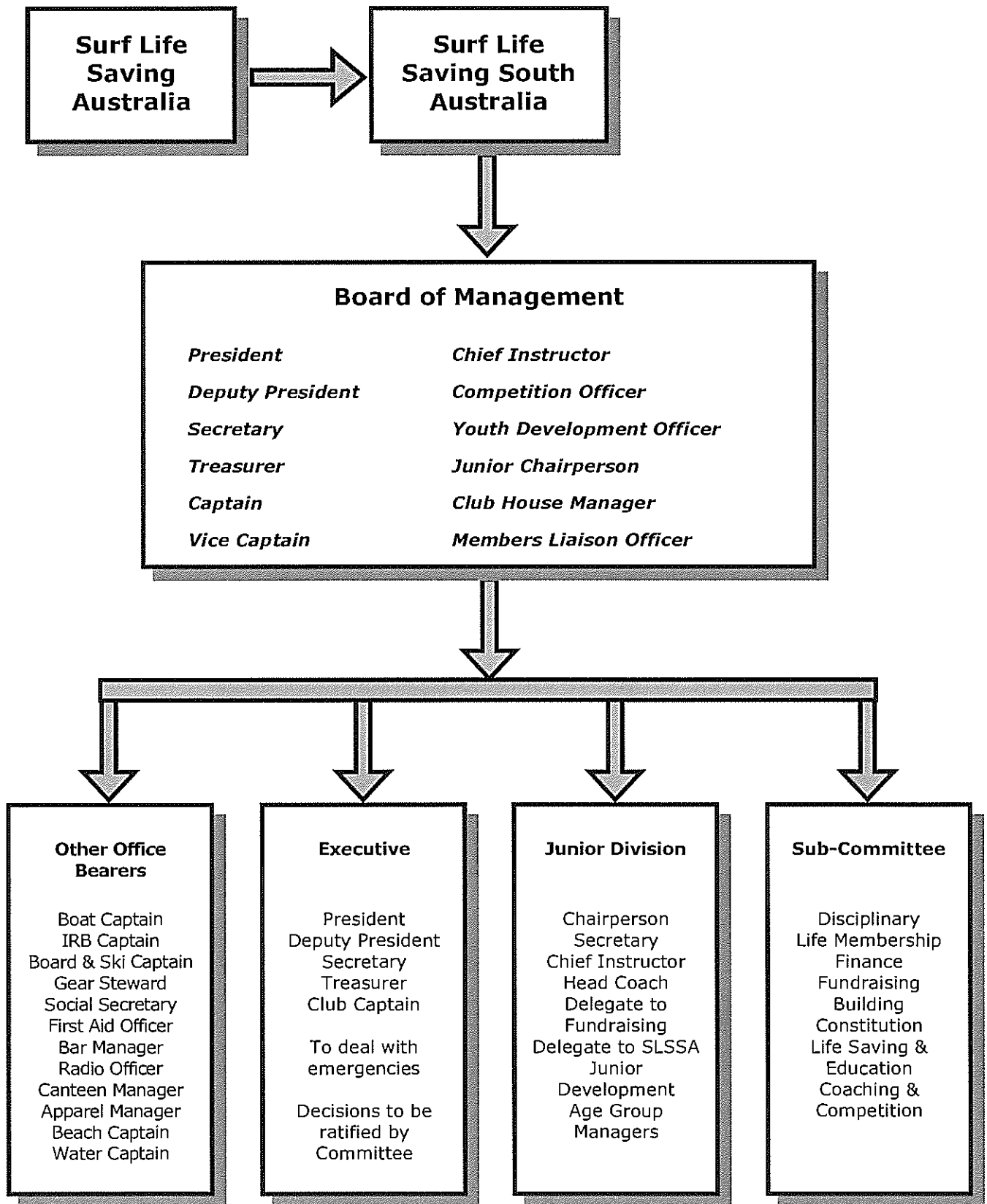
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction of life saving

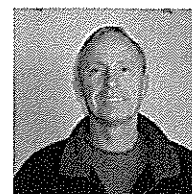

President's Report

No lives lost while we patrolled our beach. I must thank all Patrolling members for a job well done. A different patrolling contract was used this year, focusing on expanding our profile and our public image to the local community. I believe we should never close our minds to new innovative ideas which may help protect our beach goers.

Registration and proficiencies still seem to be a problem with some members to undertake early in the season. It would be helpful if all members would finalize these two processes in October and November, no later.

Our Instructor again spent many hours educating and nurturing new members to gain their Bronze Certificates and other awards. I thank you. Our internal club patrol competition was once again very successful with John Smith creating some real life scenarios for members to respond to. Well done to all who participated.

Our Competition group performed extremely well this season, culminating at the Aussies with Chris Lowery and the Senior March Past Team winning Australian Championship Gold Medals. Under 19 Board Relay Team making the final and Under 19 Boat Crew, quarter final, 200 Master Boat Crew, Semi Finalist. At State Championships the Boat division dominates in all grades except U21. The Board Team, coached by Jason McGaffin, winning the most medals in this area of competition. Open March Past, winning and our Open Ladies March Past, silver medallion. On the beach, Euan Currie our sole beach runner doing very well. I'm sure Andy will give more details in his report.

We hosted the Australian Surf Rowers League National Championship on the 6th-8th February and what a great carnival it was. The praise we have received from local and interstate clubs has been greatly appreciated. My thanks to the organising committee, who worked extremely hard to bring this event together, even Huey turned the weather on for us. I was impressed with all members contributing on this weekend. We certainly set the benchmark for those who follow us in holding this event.

Again the Mid Coast Group has worked hard for all Clubs involved. The off site storage facility is

nearly finalised and I am sure it will be built before next season starts. We are hopeful, in conjunction with the Council, to be able to end our septic tank worries; this will be of tremendous value to us, especially at carnival times. We have had meetings with the Coastal Protection Board submitting our extension plans. I am a great believer that the Mid Coast Group is a very important element which we must continue to support.

I thank Onkaparinga Council for its financial support throughout the year. Council assists us where ever it can. Andy Furman, Peter Smith have helped us when ever we ask, I thank both of you.

To run our club we need money, I thank the following for their help, Onkaparinga Council, over \$9,000 last year. Mobil, \$15,000 to MCG plus an extra \$20,000 ensuring Aldinga and Port Noarlunga received their sponsored surf boat, a part of an ongoing support.

To our Club Sponsors, I thank you, without your support we could not survive. It's a pity that we did not receive any moneys from the Emergency Service Levy this year. (Yes, we did not receive any monies from the Emergency Services Levy.)

Canteen, Vonnie Olesinski, again a tremendous effort, thank you. But please remember she needs help too, so make sure you volunteer, even for only a few hours. Bar, Megan Rawson started and I thank her for her efforts. Lyndon Mills took over half way through the year and did a great job. I thank you both.

I would like to congratulate the achievement of Bob Mayo AM of being made a Life Member of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia

Richard Olesinski, for his fantastic promotion of the Club, and the weekly raffles. To the Management Committee a great effort, thank you all for your support and the work you have done this season. I am confident this Clubs forward planning will take us to a bigger and better future.

Deputy President's Report

When I took on this job at the AGM I was aware of the problems my predecessor had with the fundraising aspect of being Vice President. As the season progressed it was more than evident that the fundraising was aimed at the same people that put their hands in their pockets all the time. I found this to be a real problem for me to contend with. There are many members who enjoy the benefits of our Club, and I hope they continue to do so, but it takes an enormous effort and amount of money to provide these benefits. The Senior and Junior competitors are provided with the best equipment available, the upkeep and maintenance of this equipment is a continual drain on our resources, finding the extra funds required, is not easy. This season we did not have the fall back benefit of running carnivals or the Senior State Titles to raise funds.

So with this in mind the Fund Raising committee got together and organised a night at Moana Hall with the band Hoy Hoy. Rosie Howse worked extremely hard for about three months to put it together. It must have been very disappointing for Rosie with the ticket sales (kept to just \$10) prior to the night just covering costs. Then if it wasn't for the extra 90 tickets sold on the night we would have had about 30 members there, (the same old same old, again). The night was not a financial loss for the Club, but in terms of return for effort it was sad, to say the least.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to Rosie for her efforts and to the members involved in the setting up, running of, and clean up the day after, especially as the Club had a craft carnival at the beach on the Sunday.

After this event I started to feel a little disillusioned with the apathy shown towards events for raising funds. My enthusiasm was not there and I considered the options for the next couple of months. One of those options was to resign from my position because I did not consider I was the person for the job of continually asking or expecting the same few people to pay all the time. So I tendered my resignation. The Committee seen fit to drop the fund raising aspect from the Vice Presidents portfolio and Chris Foord asked me if I was prepared to withdraw my resignation, which I did.

Mary Carr still had the major raffle going and I thank her for that. Mary has been pushing the ticket sales, but as I write this report, Mary is having trouble getting the tickets and or unsold

books returned.

Just to give members some idea on how far in advance the Committee and some of its Officers have to act, the Club initially put in a bid to host the Australian Surf Rowers League Surfboat Open back in July 2002 at Rainbow Bay in QLD. Many meetings were held and support sought to conduct this event. Richard Olesinski has spent many hours, too many to table, in the build up to the event being conducted. He approached the Onkaparinga City Council re their support for the event and they were absolutely brilliant, they came on board as the initial sponsor offering help both financially and utilising their personnel that had experience in the conduct of similar type events in the City area. Richard and Don Alexander had many meetings with the Council, helping to resolve the many issues that came up in the lead up.

Richard also approached Australian Major Events re support and financial aid and after much consultation and many meetings they came on board as a major sponsor. In the meantime because of his promotional efforts in the Southern Times and throughout the area, Mobil decided they should be involved in this event.

A meeting with Claire Ryan and Anne Rix of Mobil was convened and Mobil decided to be a major sponsor of the event in terms of money and promotion through their outlets in SA. He also gained Centro Colonnades as a sponsor of the event, and in his spare time organised a lot of the accommodation facilities for the visiting crews.

To all those people involved in the days leading up to and after the event I offer a big thank you on behalf of the Club. We actually made money on the weekend.

Special mention should go to Vonnie Olesinski, our Canteen Manager, the hours Vonnie puts in on her own locked away in that canteen is amazing.

I offer my congratulations to all competitors this season who did their best, many for medal rewards, some not, but they gave their all, which was good to see.

In closing I would repeat the words of last years Vice President/Fundraiser, "Without the support of our sponsors we would find it very difficult to buy the craft and equipment that the club needs to run

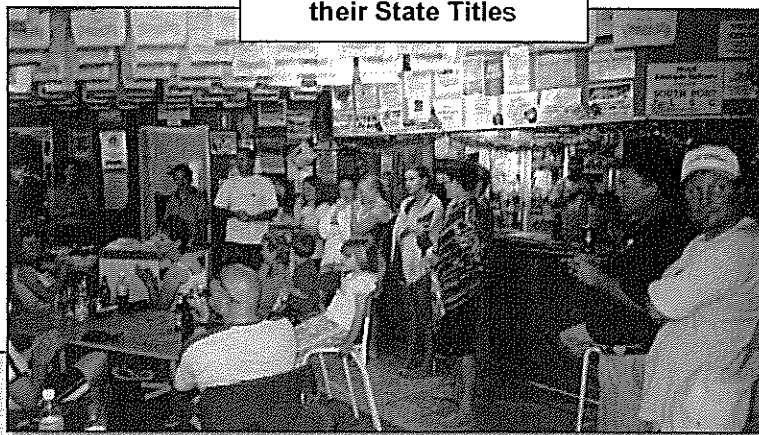

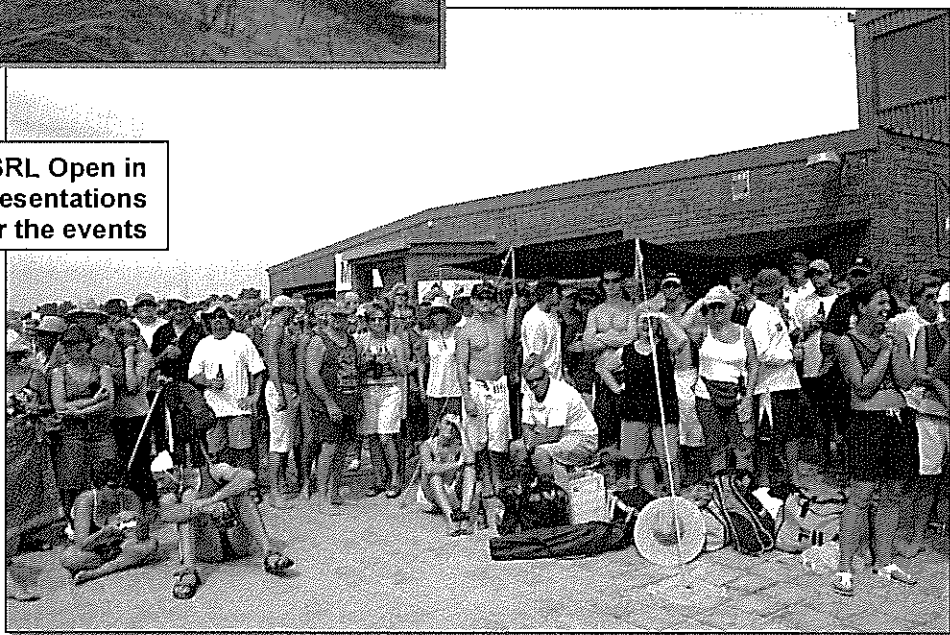
Juniors gathered after their State Titles

When you analyse what actually makes up our membership it makes for interesting reading when you see how many actually do what we are in existence for.

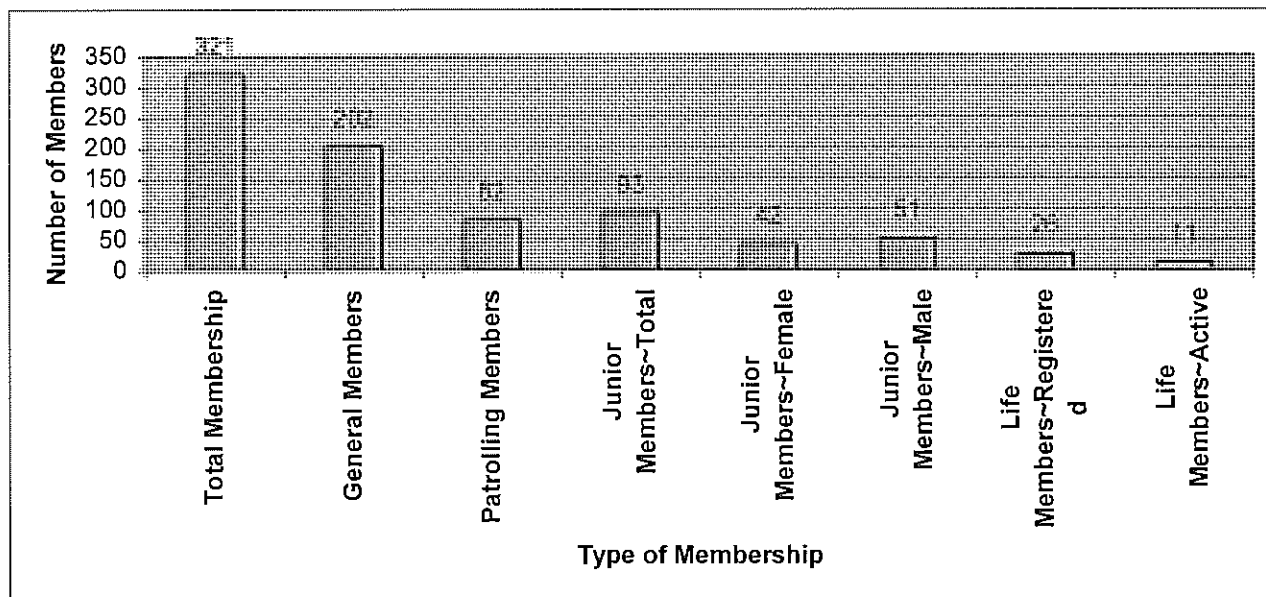
Let me explain.

Today

In year 2004 our membership is clearly divided into a variety of sub-groups - those who are "active", those who are junior lifesavers and those who are general members.

If we look at the membership breakdown only 25.5% of our total membership is actively patrolling the beach.

Of these members 13.4% are Life Members. If we then extrapolate out the junior membership we get that of the total membership able to patrol only 35.9% look after the general public.

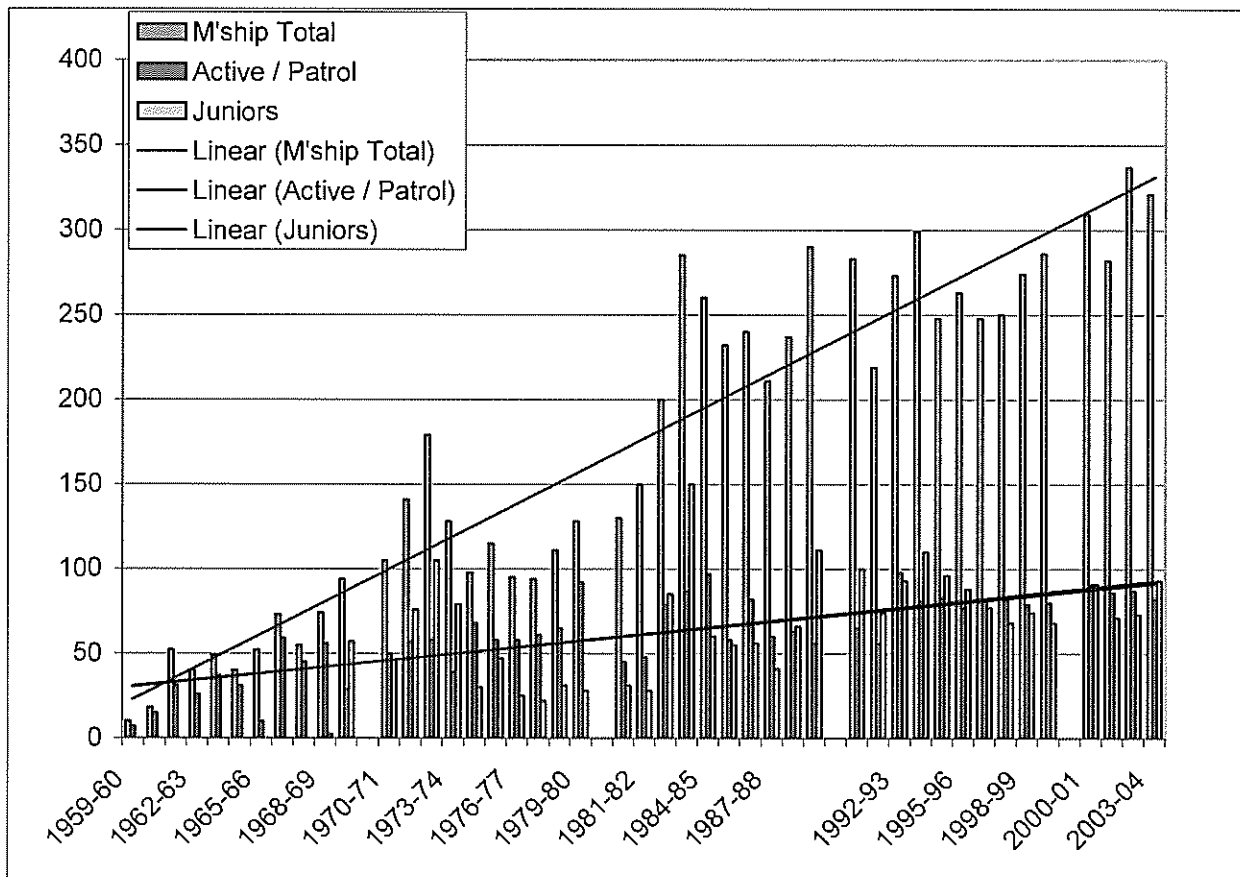

Another key trend within the process is the number of members who patrol. Our membership trend of average patrol hours versus total members is diminishing.

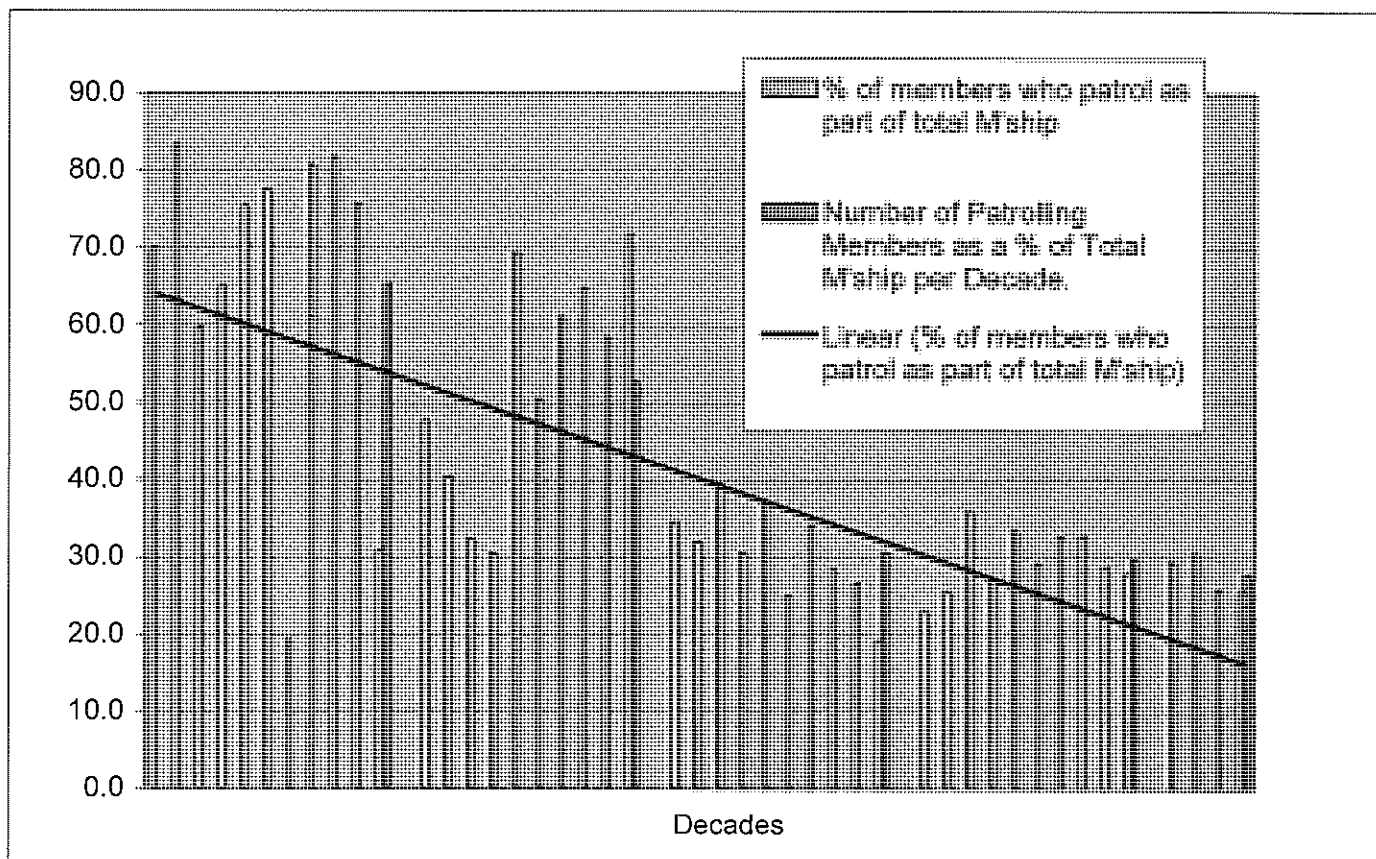

Statement of Financial Performance

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities was \$10,198 in 2004 compared to \$20,157 in 2003. This is a decrease of \$9,959 brought about by an increase in cost of sales, depreciation, borrowing costs, other expenses from ordinary activities.

Statement of Financial Position

The net assets of the Club have increased by 4% from \$268,305 in 2003 to \$278,503 in 2004. There was a minor increase in total assets whilst total liabilities decreased by \$5,025 due to payables not being as high as the previous year, when we had some pre-paid income included.

Statement of Cash Flow

The Club had a decrease in cash at the end of the year of \$1,340 compared to the previous year. Cash provided by and used in investing activities was \$40,836 in 2004. Net cash provided by financing activities was \$4,869. This was for the repayment of the loan which we have with the SLSSA Trust Fund.

Income

Revenue continues to rise each year, as you will notice in the chart on the following page. In 1999 we had a turnover of \$107,492, this season 2003/2004, \$192,743, an increase of 80%. You will also notice that Trading Profit, is a record \$31,992, an increase of \$24,671 over the 1999 result of \$7,321.

Donations

This area of income was down considerably from the previous season, mainly due to the fact that most of the income to purchase the new surf boat came in the previous financial year.

Mobil Refinery donated a Nipper Board to the Club through the annual grant to the Mid Coast Surf Clubs Group.

For the fourth year in a row South Port Boaties won the overall point score of the Port August Super Series, winning the Open Men, Open Ladies, Reserve and U19 Men's point score. The oars, sweep oars and prize money that we won in the competition, are valued at \$7,412.

Australian Open

This event provided a big boost to the Club's income, thanks to Richard Olesinski's effort in securing major sponsors for the boat event.

Grants-Financial Dependency

The Club is dependent on the receipt of significant grants to maintain its cash flows in operating activities:

We sincerely appreciate the support; when you look at the Detailed Statement of Income and Expenditure it is not hard to see how dependent the Club is on this income stream

Insurance

Like every other business in the world we have been hit rather hard in insurance costs during the past twelve months. Members insurance, up by 65% and premises up by 56%, are just a couple of examples.

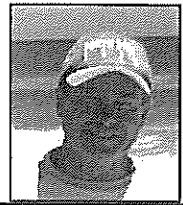
Conclusion

The revenue keeps rising, profits are up, membership on the increase, carnival and special events provide extra cash flows, but as treasurer there are still many times during the year when one has to be careful committing the Club to expenditure. It would be nice to have a little more money in the bank.

Having said that, for the past few seasons we have provided our competitors with quality equipment and the results that the athletes are achieving supports this. However, in my opinion, it is time that we spent extra money on the Clubhouse. It has been a neglected area of expenditure and it is so important to our fundraising and trading that we can't afford to neglect it any longer.

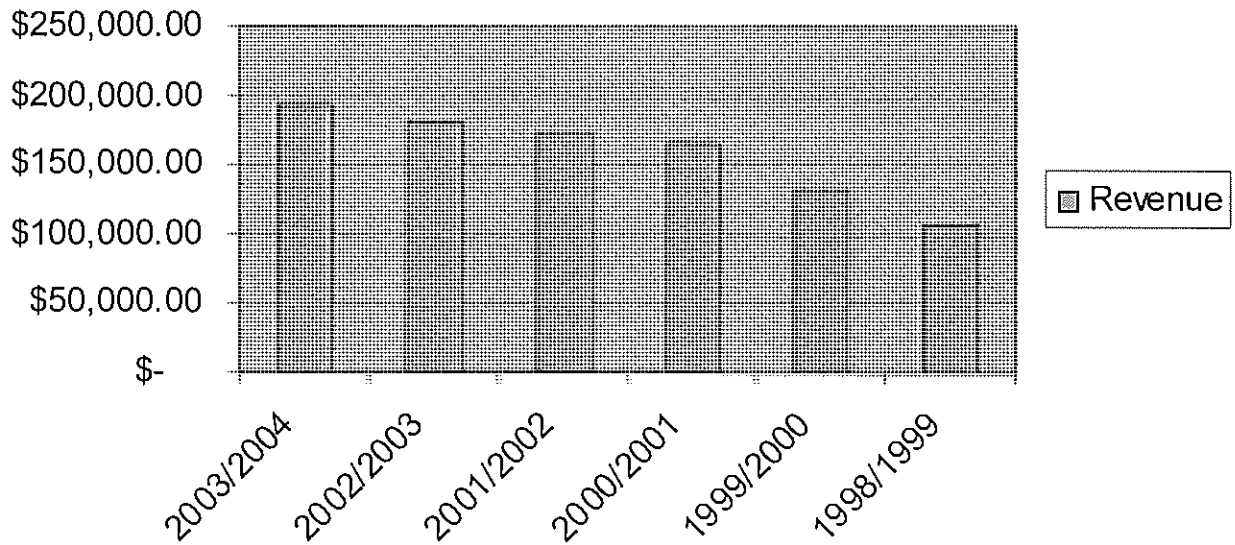

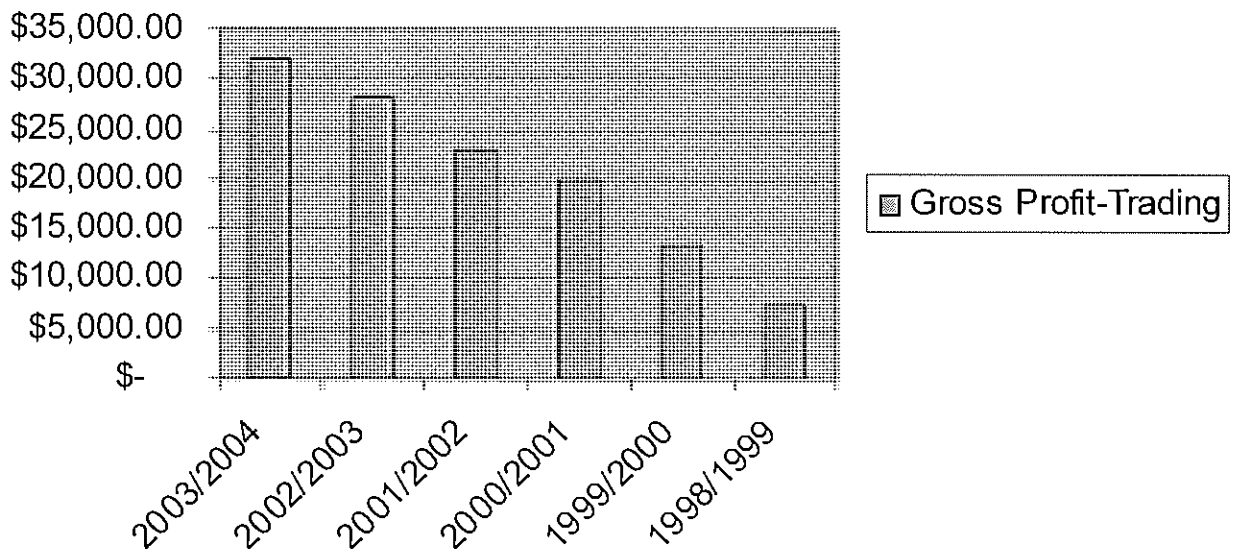

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2004

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The financial report covers South Port SLSC as an individual entity. South Port SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

- (a) **Income Tax**
The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) **Inventories**
Inventories consist of trading stock and are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) **Property Plant and Equipment**

The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of its premises, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and re-valued the Club's property, plant and equipment at \$223,526. After taking into consideration the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated, the Board of Management ratified a further revaluation decrement of \$20,000 to the Club's premises as at 30 April 2002.

The value of the Club's non-current assets, are reviewed annually by the Board of Management and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.

(d) **Cash**

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

(e) **Revenue**

Revenue from the sale off goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

(f) **Goods and Services Tax**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

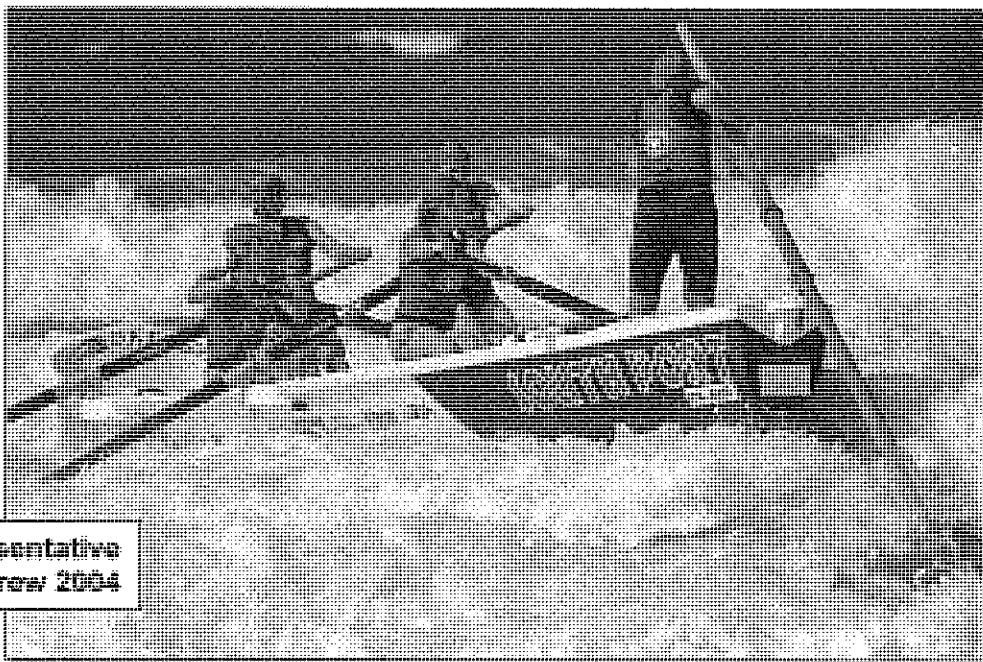

Congratulations to Annie Zygmant & Bridget Richardson for winning the Patrol Awards, your efforts are greatly appreciated.

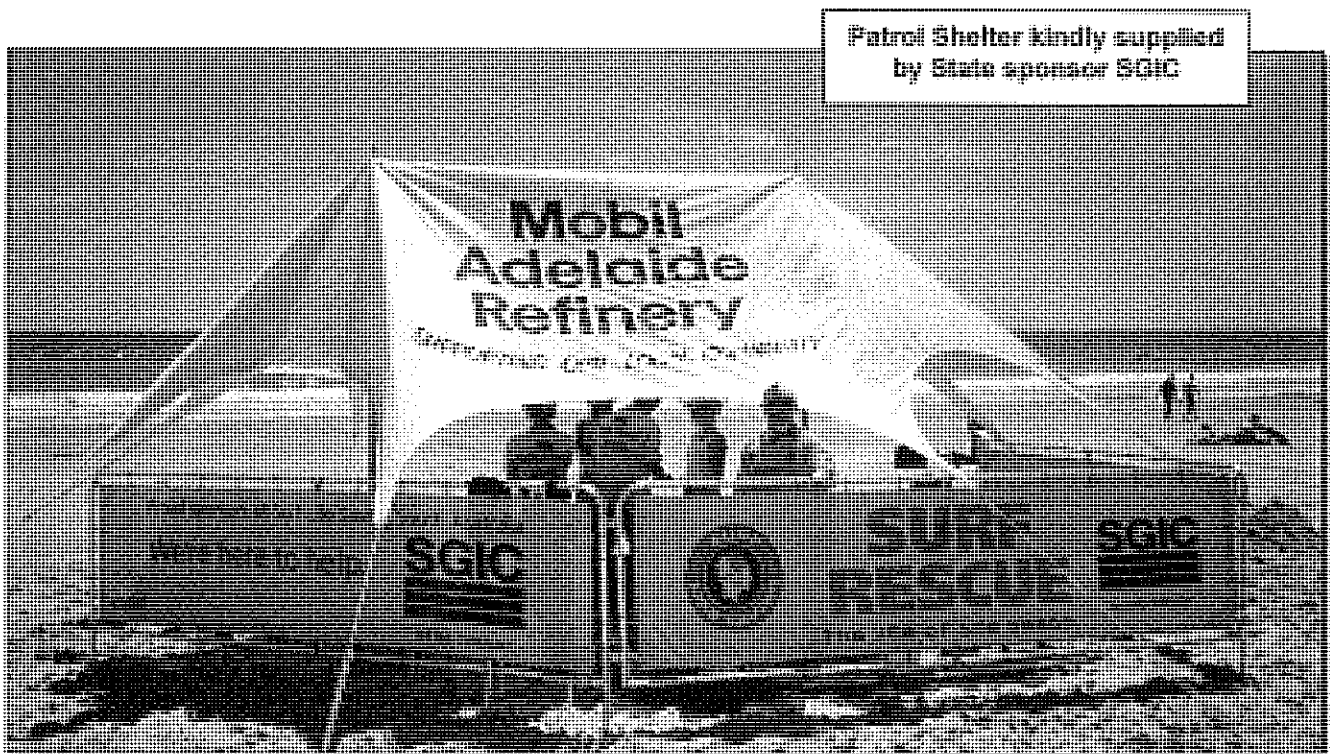

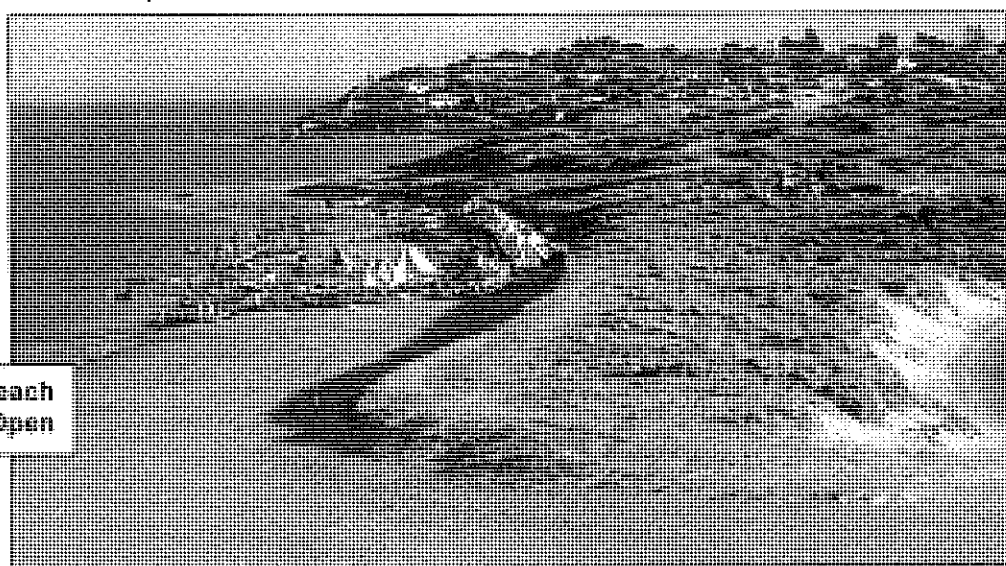

The squad started with six or seven members. As the season progressed injuries took a toll on the squad.

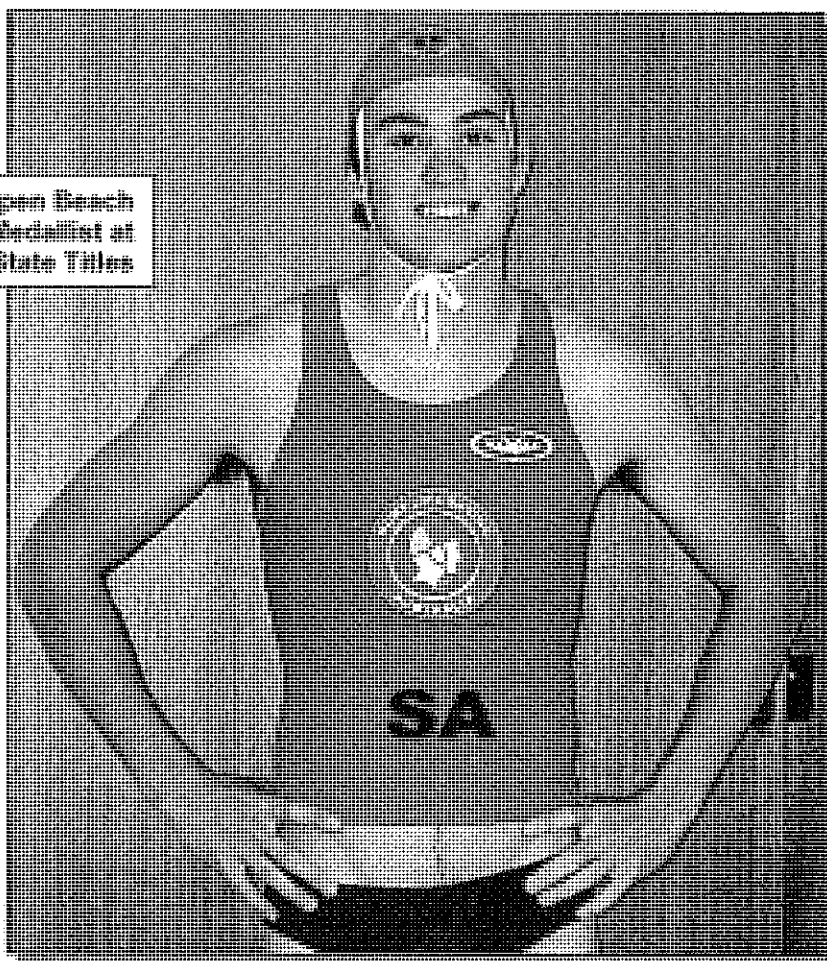

At the individual level it was very successful. Both and Paul Edwards a Gold Medal in the Under 44 Beach Sprint at the Masters State Title.

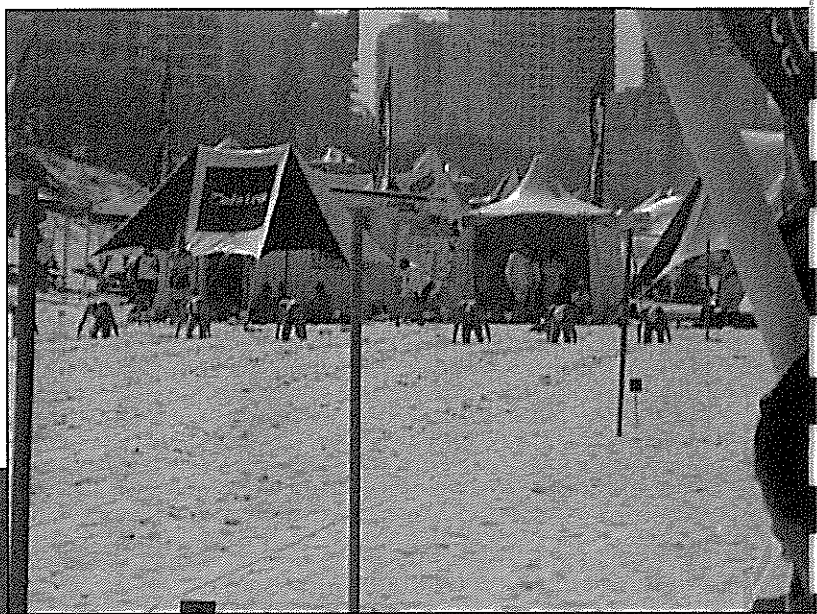

A special mention has to be made about a very special kid, Chris Lowery; he was able to achieve

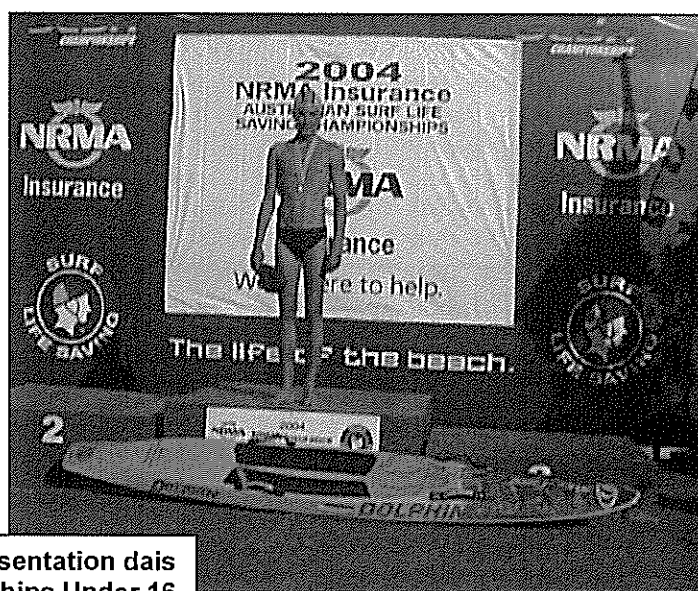
some superb results this season. Chris was able to back up for all three relays at States, competed in two individual finals and was a part of the team in the relay final at Aussies.

In closing I would like to see more people get involved with the IRB's especially the Ladies, we need more women drivers if we are to compete in the IRB competition and beat the other Club's.

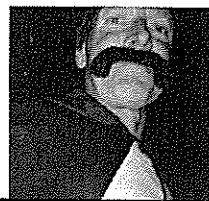

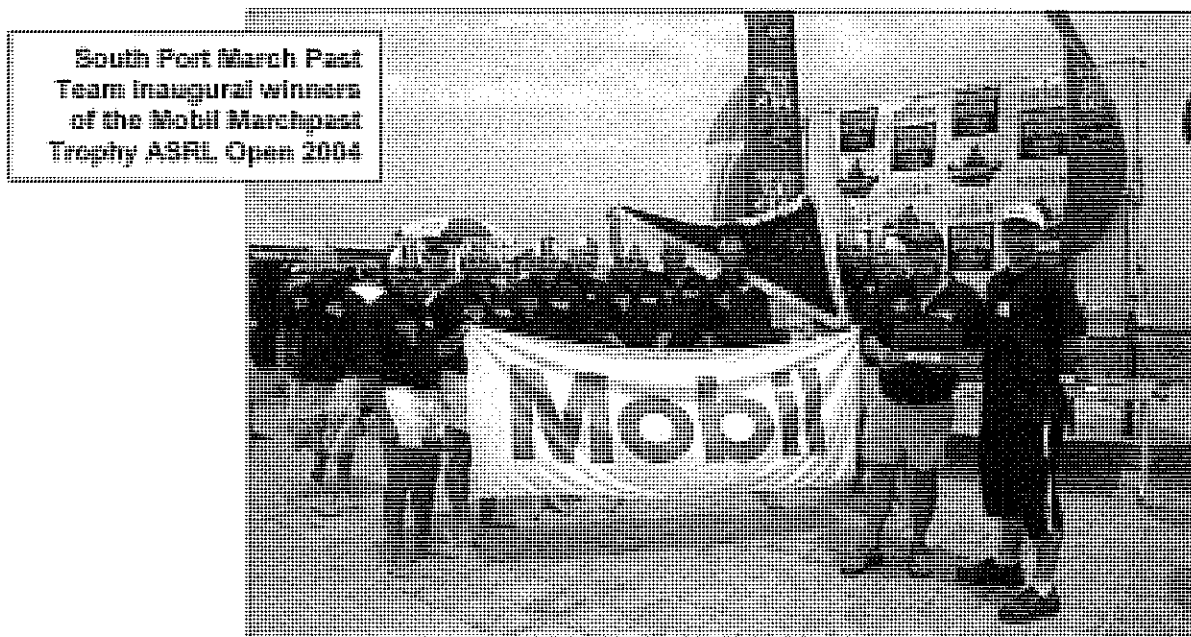

It was also pleasing to see the club field a second March Past team comprised totally of lady members and coached by senior team member, Terry Smallwood. However, on sadder note it was disappointing to see the demise of the excellent Under 21 team.

The South Australian State Championships saw the two South Port teams placed 1st and 2nd, with the senior team winning its 15th consecutive State Title, making a total of 20. The Australian Championships saw the senior team successful for the 6th time and in so doing made it 10 years consecutively either winning or being placed. Further more this also marked the 15th Australian

Championship medal won by the team since 1985. The ladies team finished a more than creditable 8th at the Australian Championships, which with their Silver Medal at the State Titles is an excellent reward for their efforts.

This report would not be complete without recording two significant occurrences at the Australian titles. Obviously the theft of the team's reel on the Friday morning prior to the elimination heat, caused great concern and impacted on the preparation for the competition with the reel only being recovered 30 minutes prior to the team marching.

The senior team's victory was the most clear cut in the competition for many years, with only one of the 24 judges finding any error.

In concluding, sincere appreciation must again go to our Coach on his efforts along with our congratulations on receiving his Australian Life Membership. Of course the assistance provided to the team by Frankie Drake, Captain Harris and Pat, David Donnelly and Brian Dixon, is very much appreciated, together with the support of sponsors that I was able to procure including - Adelaide Insulation, Fleurieu Property Services and Energy Busters.

The prominence of the South Port Club on the national scene, which has been maintained by the March Past Team over such a long period, was further enhanced, not only by the March Past Team's success, but also by the individual achievement of Chris Lowry.

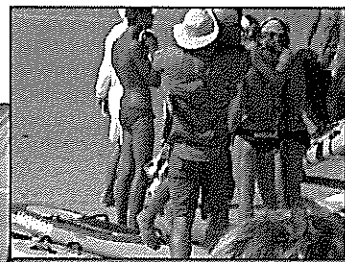

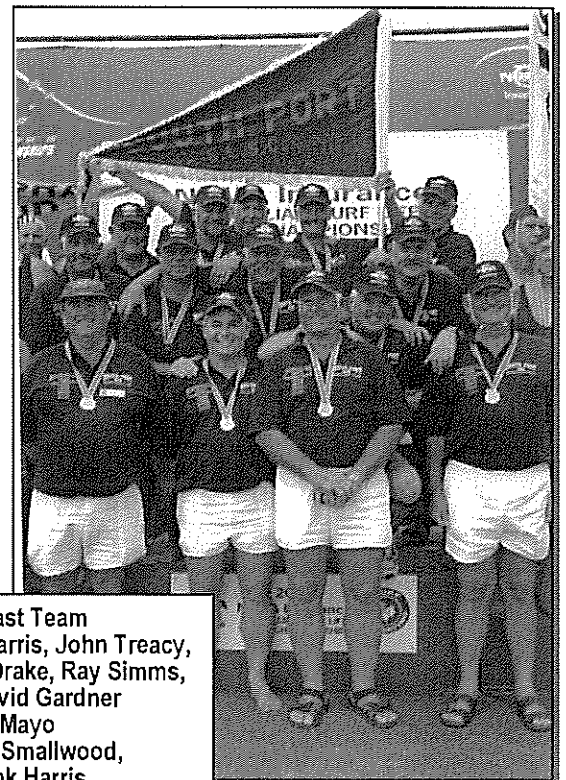
