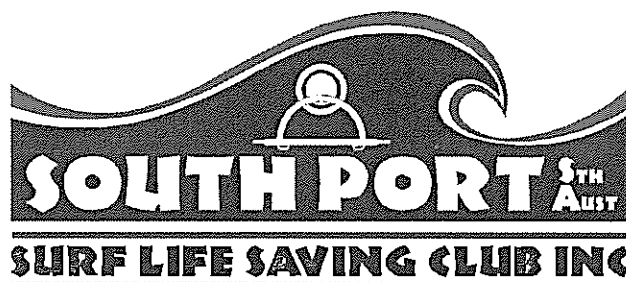

Affiliation: The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

Objectives

- To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and life saving equipment
- To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of Surf Life Saving Australia
- To patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga beach, south of the reef, to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River.
- To be on call within the City of Onkaparinga on such days and for such periods as Surf Life Saving South Australia shall from time to time determine
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction of life saving
- To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the City of Onkaparinga and other public bodies in improving facilities for bathers
- To encourage the physical and social welfare of Members
- To purchase, lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights and privileges
- To raise funds and borrow money for the purpose and benefit of the Club upon such terms and conditions as may be determined.

Colours: The Club colours are navy blue, white and green. The Club badge is a green silhouette of the side elevation of a standard reel with the words "South Port" above and "SLSC" below in white lettering superimposed on a navy background.



Nipper Safe



Surf Life Saving South Australia has developed a program called Nipper Safe, which is a program designed to protect the younger members of our organisation.

Nipper Safe is a joint initiative between the SA Police and SLSSA and it has gone about training some of our members in such things as:

- > what is a paedophile, how do you recognise one, what are their characteristics?
- > what you should do if you are suspicious about anything you have seen;
- > how to keep yourself away from any suspicion;
- > what your personal responsibilities are as a mandated Reporting Officer.

Each Club has had carefully selected members complete a mandated reporting training course, as well as a short training course developed by SA Police and the Child Youth and Family Services, specifically for SLSSA. These people are called Club Reporting Officers (CROs).

If you, as a parent, member, age group leader, or whatever, have the slightest suspicion about any of the children you see at nippers, then you are encouraged to speak to one of our CROs. You are encouraged to speak to any of these people if you have any concerns about child abuse of any form.

The abuse could be:

Physical: physical injury resulting from practices such as hitting, punching, beating or otherwise harming the child/young person.

Emotional: damage to a child's self esteem or social competence through chronic negative behaviour directed at them.

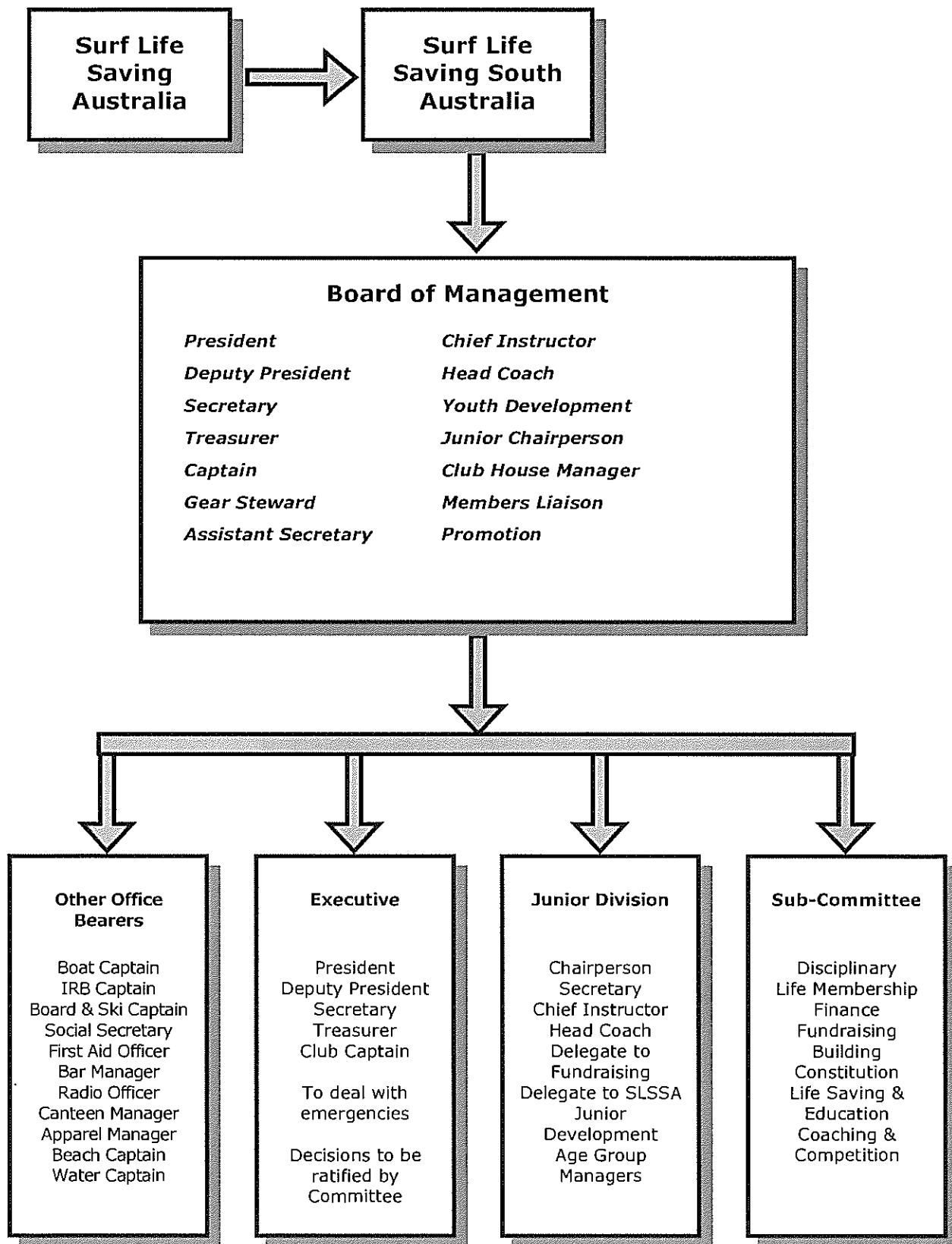
Sexual: when someone in a position of power to the child or young person uses their power to involve the child/young person in sexual activity of any nature.

Neglect: if you fail to provide for the child/young person's basic needs, including safety.

All reports are strictly confidential.

The Management Committee of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc encourages everyone to report any suspicion of child abuse either to the Child Abuse Report Line direct on 13 14 78 or to one of the CROs. Patrolling surf lifesavers are mandated by law to report. However, all other members of our Club also have a moral obligation to report.

President's Report

Here we are at the close of yet another season, with another already upon us. There doesn't seem to be any respite from one to the next anymore, there are many things to do to set things up for the next season. I'm pleased to report there were no lives lost at our beach during patrols this season. The year has seen a few changes to the Club Management structure. These changes were deemed necessary for us to move on and try and to streamline our operation. Some feel that it was change for the sake of change; well that's definitely not the case. It was felt that in the name of good governance we should introduce these changes. Basically it involved setting up panels to take care of our day-to-day operations and our core business, patrols and gaining awards. As with all changes there have been some problems implementing them. I'm sure that with a bit more understanding and patience the realisation of what we're on about will come to the fore. After all they have only been in for one season.

The Special General meeting that was called in February to vote on the Club spending \$27,500 on the joint storage facility, was very well attended and I thank all members that took the trouble to attend, and or supply their respective proxy vote. This was great to see and the interest shown was impressive. Maybe it's something the new committee could look at doing once or twice during the season to allow members to ask questions or put up ideas to the Board of Management. I can now report that the facility is well underway and by the time this report is presented we should almost have possession or be very close. This will enable us to get our Club back and have some space inside, and look at making it more presentable for our functions.

Last year I reported on the possibility of having some form of environmental waste water disposal system, this is not possible in our situation, so it's back to the rising main across the footbridge and connection to the sewer mains on Weatherald Terrace. We have advanced to the quote stage on this and will be seeking the funding through grants to complete the \$37,000 project, any member that has some time on their hands feel free to come forward, we can always use assistance with these sort of things. It's a great way to take pressure off our hard to come by funds. For those of you that are not aware of our situation, we have to fund all repairs and maintenance of our Club.

I would like to acknowledge the Onkaparinga City Council for their continued support and the provision of a grant each year, this year it was \$9000. In particular I would like to thank Andy Furman and Bill McCrae for their continued efforts and assistance on the Mid Coast Group. The MCG have been instrumental over a number of years in promoting our 5 Clubs throughout the region and without this group we would not have the likes of Mobil and the Council on side. The Mobil sponsorship comes around each year because of a lot of behind the scenes work done by Dick Olesinski, my thanks Olly for all your efforts, not only with Mobil but many other significant deals as well, not the least of which was Dial Before You Dig and Tom Faint, not only a \$5000 sponsorship over two years but providing the Juniors and Seniors with tee shirts, caps and sunscreen. Olly is always putting the South Port name in front of Companies all around the country.

I would also like to pass on my thanks to Mobil, Mark "Spider" Webster (Southern Powder Coaters), Dick Olesinski (Ecomarketing), Bob Mayo AM, Senior Larrikins and the Junior Larrikins for their contribution to the new boat, without this support it would not happen. Mark "Captain America" for his funding to provide a much-needed tent, primarily for the boat area.

There are many people to thank for their efforts this season, Mike Etheridge as his first season as Club Captain, Craig Whitmee as Chief Instructor did an excellent job, with proficiency's and award groups going through. Vonnie Olesinski once again in the canteen, the time she spends shopping for

bargains for the canteen go unheralded. Karen Lyons as Bar Manager always around the Club during the week cleaning up, these are the things taken for granted and will be sorely missed when they step down. John Charles with the team of Derek Wix and Lyndon Mills to keep our IRB's going this season. What a thankless job this is, they're damned if they do and damned if they don't, running this area can be a very expensive proposition and they seemed to be able to do it on a shoestring. With Derek and Lyndon patrolling nearly every weekend as well filling in for people, obviously nothing better to do!

Sharryn Campbell pursued many opportunities for grants etc through several agencies and was successful in number of ways, City Council \$xxxxx for conducting the Masters State Titles, \$xxxx towards a female ski. Sharryn has left in place many other options for us to try to gain these grants, as they become available. Unfortunately Sharryn had to resign towards the end of the season.

I would like to express my thanks to John "Schmidt" Smith and Don "Bristles" Alexander for their efforts this season, I know as usual just doing their jobs, but makes the Club a lot better place for it.

I thank Siggie Giebel for being the "always there man this year"; a great effort Sig. Karyn Kelly and Adrian Votino the IRB crew for water cover and carnivals this season.

On behalf of the Board of Surf Sports thanks to the South Port IRB crews for their outstanding efforts at the Senior State Titles, which were held at Middleton Beach for the first time in testing 4 to 5 foot conditions on both days. The team consisting of John Charles, Lyndon Mills, Derek Wix, Stefan Olesinski on Saturday and Sunday, plus Karyn Kelly, Siggie Giebel on Saturday, Michael Peel and Adam Lyons on Sunday and also to Michael Etheridge and Michelle Grey for being the only Patrolling members for the entire weekend.

Congratulations to all our competitors this season, I'm sure the Head Coach will elaborate on their achievements. Our Senior March Past team deserve a special mention on taking out the Senior State Title, World Title and the Australian Title. I wish the members of South Port Club all the very best for the coming season and I'm sure we are in for bigger and better things.



Secretary's Report

What a Season!

This has been one of the busiest and most frustrating seasons that I can remember. There was all the usual goings on and then the World Life Saving Titles in the Geelong area was superimposed on the season. A number of events and carnivals were cancelled for a variety of reasons – sharks, hot weather, dirty water. The most disappointing was probably the cancellation of the Australia Day Events at South Port due to the heat. We had the Nipperthon planned and Australia Day ceremonies and a carnival in the afternoon so the cancellations hit us very hard. We even had the flag poles procured by Derek Wix, an Australian Flag provided by Federal MP Kim Richardson and an Australia Day flag provided by Andy Higgs. Because of the busy season, the Club Champs were not held until after the season had finished and as a result they were poorly attended. The Competition Committee will need to give this event greater priority next season. The Long Swim was postponed because of rough weather but was successfully conducted in January with quite a good turn out of swimmers. We were lucky enough to have the Westpac Life Saver Helicopter down for the start of the swim which put the swimmers' minds at rest as far as the presence of sharks was concerned.

Membership and the Clubhouse

This season we had a pleasing increase in membership from 290 last season to 314 this season. Unfortunately, with the increased size of the Gym and the Shared Storage Facility being delayed, the need to store boards, skis and other equipment in the Social Area of the Club meant that we were very cramped for room. It is pleasing to note that the Storage Shed is now under construction and will be available before the start of next season which should make conditions much more comfortable. Our thanks must go to Artie Ferguson our local councillor, Andy Furman from the City of Onkaparinga, and the City of Onkaparinga Council for seeing this project through to the point where the building is now a reality.

Board of Management

I was disappointed again this season to see the low attendance at Board meetings. On a number of occasions we needed to wait for members to arrive before we had the necessary quorum and we had resignations throughout the season which put extra burdens on elected members who had enough to do in their own portfolios. The Club can only be run effectively if we have members prepared to nominate for positions at the AGM and follow through for the whole season. The Committees are the places where the running of the areas should be discussed, differences thrashed out and plans for the season be developed. This season too many decisions were made on the spur of the moment, resulting in functions not proceeding smoothly and extra expenses being incurred. When members nominate for Committees in their areas of interest, they must be prepared to give up some time to make sure those areas run smoothly.

Communication

Our current e-mail list covers 290 of our 314 members so we can rapidly get information out to our members. This year I introduced a weekly email news and the response from the members has been fantastic. Please remember that the communication list is only as accurate as the information that you give me, so if you change email address, home address, home phone number or mobile number, please remember to contact the secretary. Statement of Financial Performance

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities was a profit of \$35,400 compare to a loss of \$2,879 last financial year of \$2,879.

Statement of Financial Position

The net assets of the Club have increased from \$275,624 in 2004-05 to \$311,024 this financial year. There was an increase in total assets from \$293,533 to \$322,205, whilst total liabilities decreased by \$6,728.

Statement of Cash Flow

The Club had \$11,044 in the bank at the end of the financial year, a decrease of \$37,077 compared to the previous year. The Club still has a small amount owing to the Trust Fund of SLSSA.

Income

Revenue increased over the previous period and we are again extremely grateful for the contributions of Ren and Beau for their effort in keeping the Bar Trading up with last season and Vonnie, another great effort. Karyn Kelly had the difficult job of trying to make a profit from clothing and we will have to have a serious look at how we as a Club operate this area of the Trading next season.

Grants-Financial Dependency

The Club is dependent on the receipt of significant grants to maintain its cash flows in operating activities and we sincerely appreciate the support of these organisations

This season saw the introduction of the position of Head Coach onto the Board of Management, replacing the previous position of Competition Officer. The change in titles and in some duties have been forced on us mainly by the accreditation process for coaches and officials and in the litigious society that we live in. Surf Life Saving is heading down the same path and it seemed that we should proceed there as well.

When looking at the end result of the competition area of the Club this season as compared to the previous year it is obvious that we have improved and I guess that is what we are always striving to achieve. If you based our performance by competitors competing against other Clubs, we perform extremely at a very high level.

However, I am the first to say that we could have done things differently on occasions. The main concern I think is that we look after the top athletes but don't do a lot for those others who at times need to be provided with incentives and assistance to compete, particularly when it come to Club events and carnivals. It was said last year that we needed to look at the dates and availability of the athletes when setting up the Club Championships to try to increase the numbers competing. This proved to be almost impossible with the heavy carnival program that we were confronted with at the start of the season and we again reverted to having them after the Aussies, with a further drop in numbers competing.

As has been mentioned in other reports we had a number of events cancelled this year throughout the State and that didn't help our participation levels.

State Teams

Early in the season we set out to train our athletes more in surf conditions and so every Saturday morning a large group of parents and athletes trained in the waters of Middleton Beach in order to be selected in the State Teams and prepare for the State Titles, also held at Middleton.

This approach worked well and we had Chris Lowery, Lauren Etheridge and the Ladies Boat Crew of me, as sweep, Genevieve Stols, Mary Carr, Brioni Oliver, and Gina Mills in the Senior team and Thomas Gray, Caitlyn Gray in the Junior Team, with Jason McGaffin appointed as Coach. Both teams competed in the 2006 Interstate Championships at Queenscliff Beach in Sydney.

The Open Men's Boat crew of Chris \$ Foord, sweep, Matthew Whittmee, Mark Wilsmore, Angus Boot and Jeff Hegarty also were selected to compete at Freshwater and Manly Carnivals as part of the State Development Program

Thomas Smith, Zachary Ryan and Jack Sutton were selected in the Junior Development Team that competed in Devonport, Tasmania. Matt Clohesy was also selected as the Team Manager

Worlds

A small team of competitors and supporters competed at the Rescue 2006 held in February at Geelong and Lorne. There is a lot more said on other pages in regard to the effort of the March Past Team in winning the Worlds, suffice to say that the win set the team up for the trifecta. They will go

down in history for their effort over the years and they have certainly helped put our Club on the Surf Life Saving map.

All competitors came away knowing that they were on track with their preparations for the States and Aussies and once again it proves that there is a lot to be gained by venturing outside ones own backyard to enable proper comparisons to be made.

State Championships

No one can say that the training and competing in surf conditions didn't pay off, with eleven gold, silver and bronze medals, (91 individual medals) as against five, seven and six for last season (63 individual medals). Our efforts in the Master State Titles were almost as good as last season and if the boats had of been competing we would have at least equalled the result.

IRBs

The IRB Team are well into their competition phase and will be competing in their State Titles on the same day as our Annual General Meeting, we wish them the best. Throughout the season the were always there to assist the athletes with water cover and we are extremely thankful, particularly to John Charles, Lyndon Mills and Derek Wix, who along with the other have taken over this section of the Club and have it running better than I have ever seen it, congratulations.

Aussies

A smaller group than previous attended the last year at Kurrawa for the Australian Championships. Good results came once again from Chris Lowery making the Final of the U19 Surf Board Race and combining with Thomas Gray in making the final of the U19 Board Relay.

The Men's Open Boat Crew of Chris \$ Foord, sweep, Matthew Whittmee, Mark Wilsmore, Angus Boot and Jeff Hegarty made it through to the Semi Finals of the Open boat; the first time since 1969 when a crew from South Port with Bob Mayo in it, got through to the Semi Final.

Port Augusta Super Series

We won again, but this time by the smallest of margins from Grange. The prize includes a set of oars, normally L2's but we paid the extra and received a set of L1's, which belong to the Open Crew and three sweep oars for coming first place in the Men's, Ladies and Reserves division. We also picked up over \$2,000 in prize money from the competition at Port Augusta.

Thanks to all the crews that helped by turning up to all the super series events. Hopefully we will be able to have the U19 and U23's going next year to take the pressure off.

Jason McGaffin

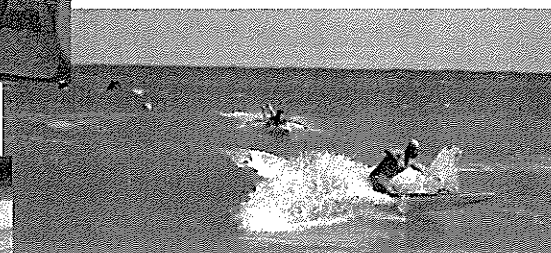
While he at times gets disappointed with his own performance I'm sure that the other athletes appreciate his dedication to their development and the Clubs future, thank you Jason.

South Port competed at the World's, States and Masters carnivals which was very pleasing and did the Club proud.

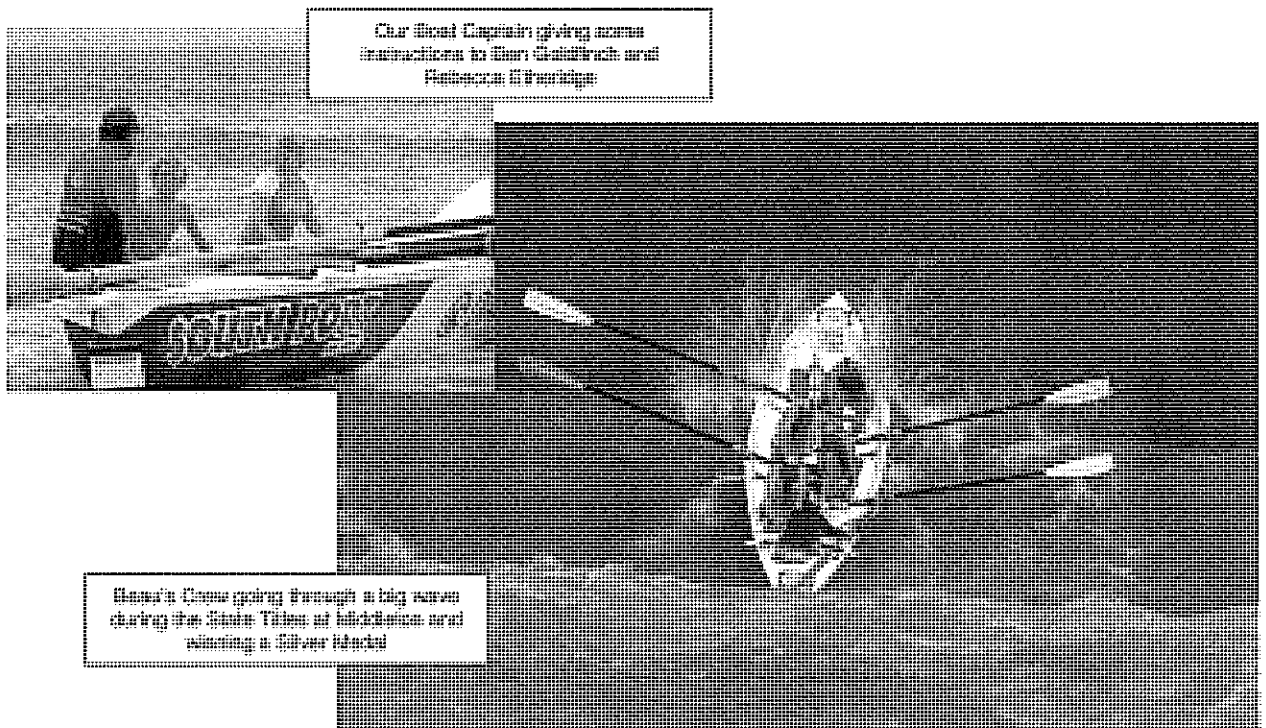
This year we purchased another DKG boat which was rightly named the John "Devo" Devitt.

Well done to all who rowed or swept and helped through season 05/06.

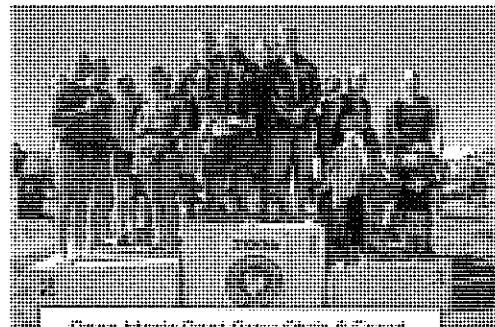

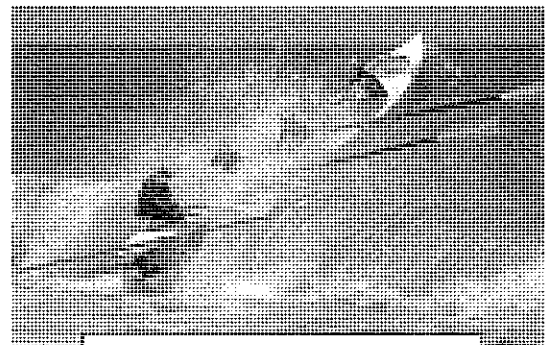

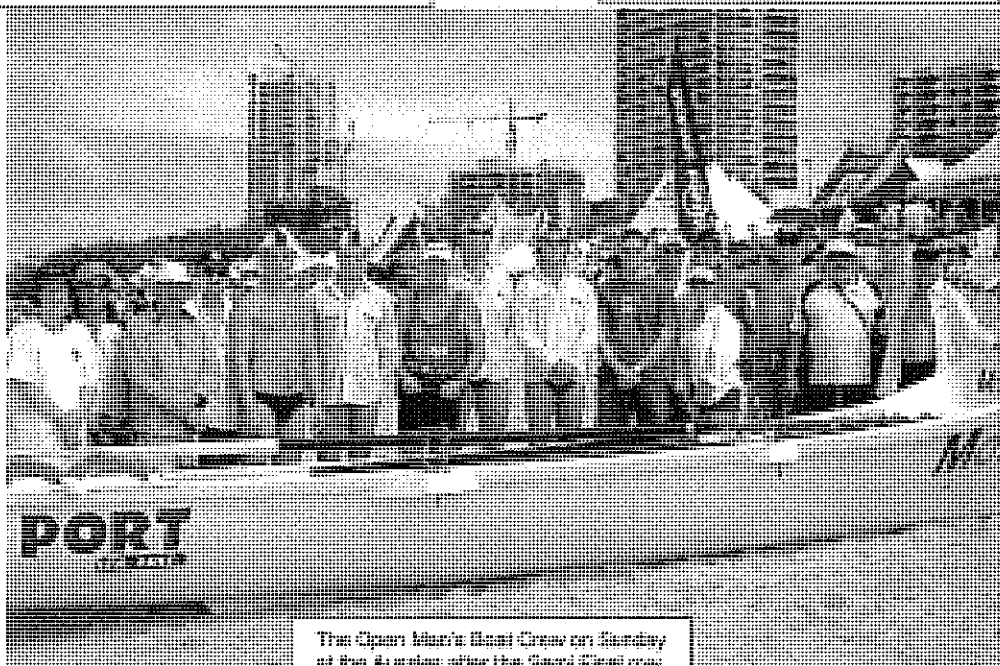

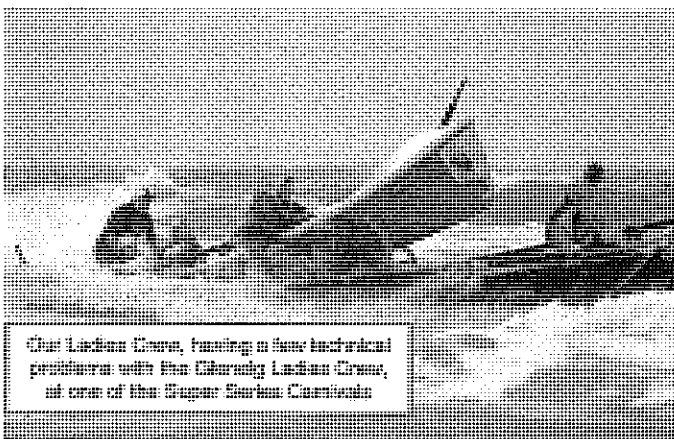

In 2004 the Shivering Shags celebrated its 20th Anniversary.

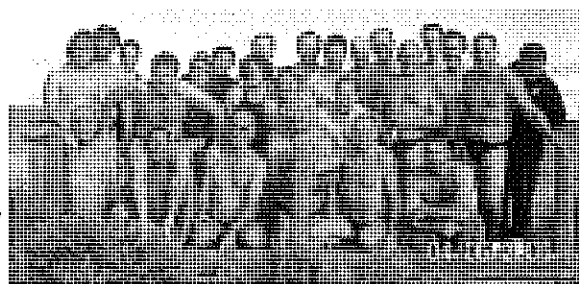

South Port: World, Australian and State Champions

Following the disappointment of 2005's Australian Championships plans were put in place to meet the challenges of 2006. The goal was set of achieving a trifecta of our 22nd State Championship, winning the first World Championship and our seventh Australian Championship (16th Australian medal).

It was realised that there would be retirements from the team but finding replacements was made easy when the coach received an approach from a former lady member of the team asking whether former lady members might rejoin the team. As a consequence, Jenny Whitmee and Katherine Hobbs rejoined the team and brought the additional support of Michelle Copley.

Two new members (in addition to Jenny and Kath) competed for the first time during the year, i.e. Michelle and Rob Perry. This experience will be invaluable in the future as they become permanent members of the team.

Our coach was heavily involved in the organisation of the World Championships and we were fortunate to have ground support in Geelong in the form of local council member Tom O'Connor and former team member Phil Carter. Competing at the World Championships and participating in a parade with 33 international teams was a most moving experience. Particularly, having regard to our victory and the ceremony attached to the medal presentation by the Premier of Victoria, Steve Bracks (who had to again acknowledge the superiority of South Australia over Victoria).

Planning for the State titles presented some real difficulty. Kate and Greg Higgs were expecting a child, Greg injured his calf at the Masters and Jenny sprained her ankle gardening so there was a great deal of uncertainty as to who would be fit and able to compete. Fortunately Greg and Jenny were right on the day but this led to the unfortunate experience suffered by Michelle who, when not competing in the A team, marched with the B team (ladies) and was denied the opportunity to do so at the State Championships.

I was able to obtain the same accommodation and normal arrangements were made for touring to the Gold Coast for the Australian Championships. We were again successful on the Friday but this year, on Sunday, the day it counted, we were also the clear winner; the seventh gold medal in 12 years, plus four other medals, an outstanding achievement. However, this did not occur without some drama. At Saturday afternoon training, Terry Smallwood became violently ill and the coach sent him to bed. The team was reorganised with Michelle taking John Hall's position in the rear rank and John taking over the belt. We were quite prepared to compete with this team if Terry was not well and believe that we would have achieved the same result. The coach issued instructions to Terry on the Sunday morning that if he did not partake in the medicine prescribed by the coach he would not march (the coaches view was that his health was more important and we didn't want him collapsing on the beach). At the last minute the team took on its normal formation. Once again a terrific job by Michelle in coping with the pressure applied.

So the team has been very successful this year achieving all its goals. Rob Perry has been of great assistance to the coach in terms of acting as an assistant when not marching. However, some sad aspects arise at the conclusion of every season. This year sees the retirement of Captain Harris who can be credited with creating the basis from which South Port has become so successful in March Past. In 1982 at a meeting on what was then the back lawn of the club he convinced Bob Mayo to

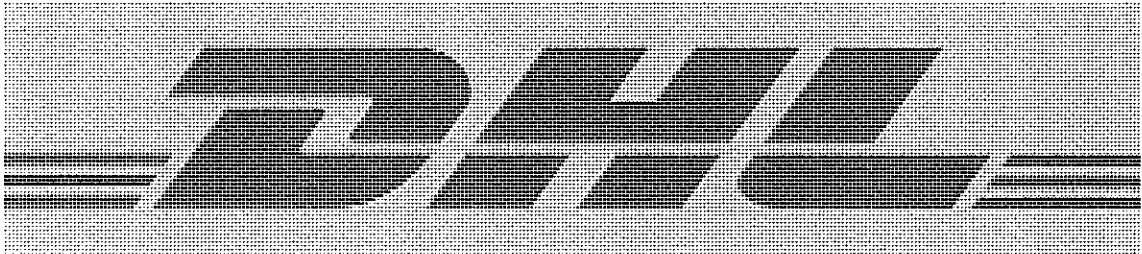



Scope
