- To maintain an organisational structure conducive to the smooth operation of the Club
- To maintain good links with local Government and the community
- To raise community awareness of South Port Surf Life Saving Club
- To create and maintain a good working relationship with Surf Life Saving South Australia

Name: South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

Affiliation: The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

Objectives

- To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and life saving equipment
- To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of Surf Life Saving Australia
- To patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga beach, south of the reef, to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River.
- To be on call within the City of Onkaparinga on such days and for such periods as Surf Life Saving South Australia shall from time to time determine
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction of life saving
- To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the City of Onkaparinga and other public bodies in improving facilities for bathers
- To encourage the physical and social welfare of Members
- To purchase, lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights and privileges
- To raise funds and borrow money for the purpose and benefit of the Club upon such terms and conditions as may be determined.

Colours: The Club colours are navy blue, white and green. The Club badge is a green silhouette of the side elevation of a standard reel with the words "South Port" above and "SLSC" below in white lettering superimposed on a navy background.

Surf Life Saving South Australia has developed a program called Nipper Safe, which is a program designed to protect the younger members of our organisation.

Nipper Safe is a joint initiative between the SA Police and SLSSA and it has gone about training some of our members in such things as:

- > what is a paedophile, how do you recognise one, what are their characteristics?
- > what you should do if you are suspicious about anything you have seen;
- > how to keep yourself away from any suspicion;
- > what your personal responsibilities are as a mandated Reporting Officer.

Each Club has had carefully selected members complete a mandated reporting training course, as well as a short training course developed by SA Police and the Child Youth and Family Services, specifically for SLSSA. These people are called Club Reporting Officers (CROs).

If you, as a parent, member, age group leader, or whatever, have the slightest suspicion about any of the children you see at nippers, then you are encouraged to speak to one of our CROs. You are encouraged to speak to any of these people if you have any concerns about child abuse of any form.

The abuse could be:

Physical: physical injury resulting from practices such as hitting, punching, beating or otherwise harming the child/young person.

Emotional: damage to a child's self esteem or social competence through chronic negative behaviour directed at them.

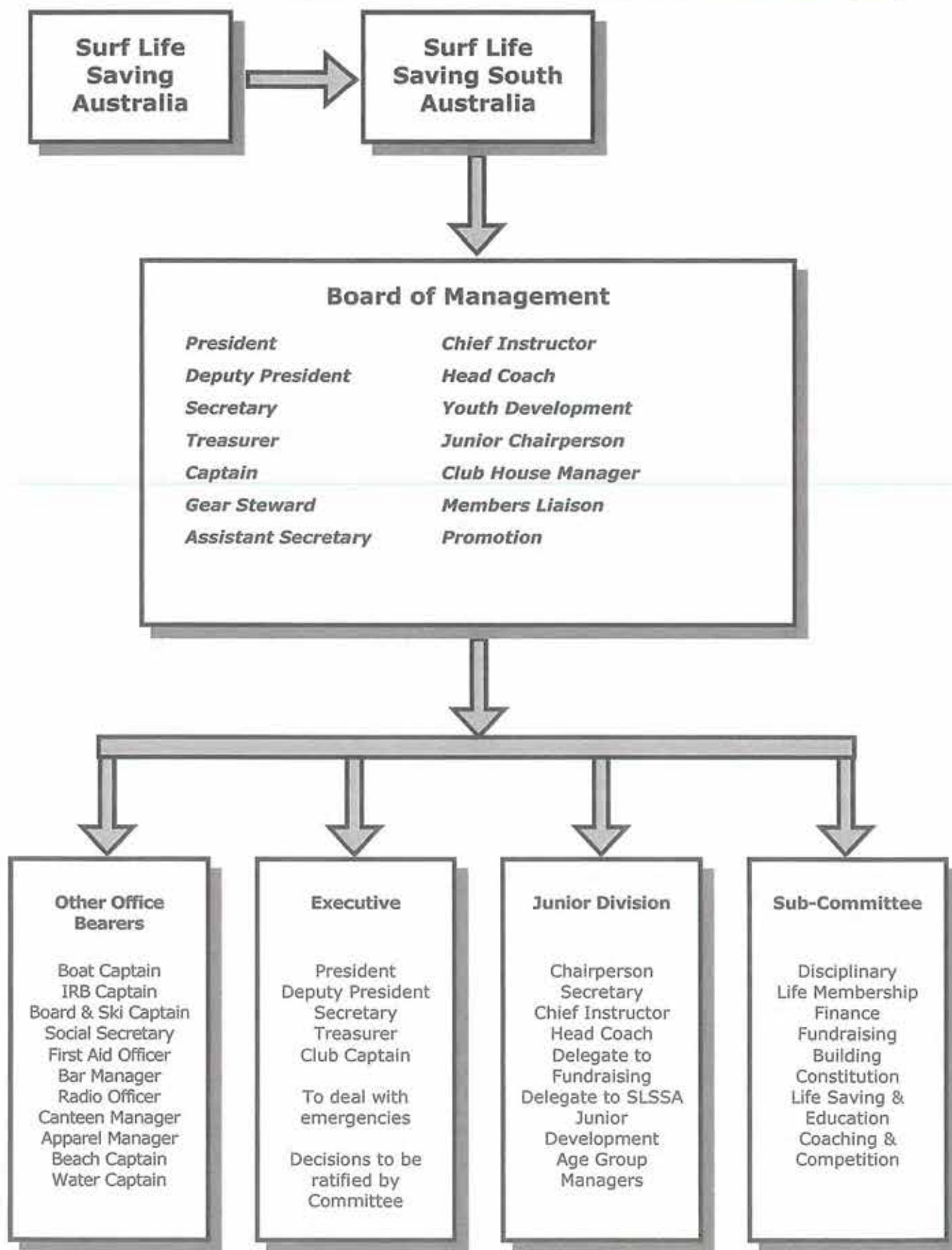
Sexual: when someone in a position of power to the child or young person uses their power to involve the child/young person in sexual activity of any nature.

Neglect: if you fail to provide for the child/young person's basic needs, including safety.

All reports are strictly confidential.

The Management Committee of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc encourages everyone to report any suspicion of child abuse either to the Child Abuse Report Line direct on 13 14 78 or to one of the CROs. Patrolling surf lifesavers are mandated by law to report. However, all other members of our Club also have a moral obligation to report.

President's Report



John Devitt

The presentation of this Annual Report brings yet another season to a close, and I'm glad to report no lives lost at our beach while we patrolled.

The Mid Coast Group comprising the 5 Clubs in our area with the support of the Onkaparinga City Council have finally been successful in the completion of our joint storage facility on the W. M. Hunt reserve on River Road at Port Noarlunga. This project has been an on going battle for Chris Foord over the last 5 or 6 seasons, and for this the Club is very grateful of his efforts. Chris's persistence in keeping the Mid Coast Group functioning have been remarkable.

A couple of years ago I mentioned in my report of the fact that we as a Club are responsible for all of our own maintenance. The other Clubs in our area enjoy a lease arrangement with the Onkaparinga Council, and that takes care of their maintenance. At the Club's AGM in 2005 we had a discussion re our tenure in the current location. It was decided to form a committee to look into this. We had two or three meetings and the issue has progressed with the assistance of Councillor Artie Ferguson to the point that as I write this report Council has agreed that they are the current landlord of the sand dune area. Further discussions have since taken place and the Council has under taken a building audit and we are currently waiting the results of this report.

Late this season Chris Foord, Dick Olesinski and I were invited to be part of the Community Foreshore Action Committee. This involved our input in regard to the shared pathway that is being planned for Weatherald Terrace. This is still in the early stages of planning and no doubt progress will be a slow process. I will keep you posted as things progress.

Last season was a busy one for many of us, the office bearers, the competitors, patrolling members, and parents of members. My thanks to those of you that helped out on many occasions. The Club hosted several carnivals this season, High Performance #1 at South Port, High Performance #2 & virtually #3 at Middleton. We then conducted the Southern States Challenge followed by a Junior Carnival the next day. The next weekend we were heavily involved in the Interstate Championships held at Middleton, because of the change in the weather on Saturday night and the event being moved, I can honestly say without South Port there would have been very extensive gear loss.

It was a pleasure to go the Freshwater/Manly carnival the next weekend and have a rest.

Thanks this season to:

Michael Etheridge the Club Captain and Lifesaving Adviser, Michelle Gray the Vice Captain for their efforts in maintaining our patrols and the general function of the lifesaving side of the Club. They both spent many hours on patrol at the offsite carnivals this season to fulfil the Clubs obligation to the State based carnivals. They have both discovered that they do have homes to go to after it's all over. Mike also stepped in to be the Workforce coordinator on the Sunday at the Senior State Titles, not an easy job. Michelle was also our Competition Officer, looking after entries for carnivals for the season.

Vonnie Olesinski, once again for her effort in the canteen, locked away in there for most of the season and raising considerable funds for the Club. As well as training with the March Past and gaining a bronze medallion at the Aussies.

Mary Carr and Heather Zinnogger were in charge of the clothing this season and have done a fantastic job, even the treasurer is happy.

Siggi Giebel first year as Chief Instructor of the Club has done a excellent job, many new awards through and as I write this he has another group of six going through for their awards. Siggi was also an Age Group Manager in the Juniors.

President's Report

Don Alexander has kept things tight as usual and is in the process of trying to set-up a building fund for the Club to take us into the future, So that if the need arises, we are able to take on the opportunity of extensions if the option becomes available. We would need in excess of \$100K behind us to be able to do so.

On a State Level Don is also the Chair of the Board Of Surf Sports a very demanding job in its own merit. Don has been instrumental in making changes to the way Surf Sports is looked at and conducted in SA, and this year is stepping aside to concentrate more on the Club level.

John Smith our Club Secretary has as always been on top of the administration side of operating a Surf Life Saving Club. This task is not an easy one by any means, because what ever happens he's in it. I really appreciate Schmidt's guidance and dedication to the Club. This year for a number of reasons has not been as smooth as one would like and he's always there to give advice when required. On a State Level John has been the Chair of the Board of Development and has implemented a new strategy for the State to follow in the way we develop our youth.

Jason McGaffin this year as the Head Coach of the Club should be very pleased with the results from the competitors this season. The Club had many representatives in the Senior State Team, Junior State Team and the Development team. This season was the first time the Lifesaver Relay was conducted at the State Championships and I'm pleased to say our Club was successful in winning this event. I'm sure Jason will have all the results in his report. Rob Zinnogger and the Junior Committee had a good season and the results on the competition side of things speak for themselves. Well done Zingers.

South Port this season competed well in all areas and should be proud of their achievements, but let us not make the mistake of letting the old clichés cloud our judgement of competition. It's quite simple really our competitors know that our core business is patrolling our beach, and in most cases they do it extremely well. The other aspect to look at though is that without these members that compete we would struggle to put effective patrols on the beach. Some patrol to compete, some just patrol, it's what we do, we are a diverse group of people from a variety of backgrounds and have largely different principles, but we are here because we want to be. Here is the key, "We are all VOLUNTEERS", and don't forget it!

While on the subject of volunteers, at this point I would like to pay special tribute to a group of our members. John Charles, (Jet Boat & IRB) Lyndon Mills, (Jet Ski & IRB) Derek Wix, Michael Peel, Bridget Richardson, Stefan Olesinski and Karyn Kelly and Siggie Giebel, this group notched up well in excess of 900 hours IRB water cover this season. That's an outstanding effort, and in doing so earned over \$6000 for the Club. Keeping in mind the conditions were not always that nice, from early October through to March.

Lyndon Mills also covered for us at the Nationals this year, because we had over thirty competitors, including March Past. The Club had to provide an IRB or Jet Ski driver with at least Level One Official accreditation. Every competitor in the Club should be very grateful of Lyndon for his efforts in WA. On this subject, we have to be very mindful next season if we have more than thirty competitors at the Nationals, we are up for the same commitment from one or two of our IRB drivers, don't just assume it will happen. It has to be taken into serious consideration.

In closing my report I would like to thank our sponsors, Dial Before You Dig, they have their name on one of our boats as part of a 2-year deal. A1 Steering and Suspension, Warren takes care of the servicing of our 4WD and trailers. GHR Motors for supplying lubricants and spark plugs for our IRB motors (Siggie and his partner) and Mobil for their continued support of the Mid Coast Group of Clubs.

I wish all our members the very best for the coming season and hope your expectations are met by that to which you contribute.

This report is now before the City of Onkaparinga and there will be a decision made in the very near future. We as a Club need to ensure we have a clear vision of the way in which we see the Club going so we can respond to the lease offered. I must thank ward councillor Artie Ferguson for the way in which he has championed the Club in this matter.

I look forward to season 2007-08 and the further progression of our fantastic Surf Club.

Income Statement

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities was a profit of \$16,439, compared to a profit of \$35,400 in the last financial year.

Balance Sheet

The total member's funds have increased from \$311,024 to \$327,463 this financial year. We had \$25,430 in the bank at the end of the financial year. The Club has finally paid off the Trust Fund Loan

Trading Income

Trading revenue increased to \$29,452. Bar sales decreased over the previous year but still showed a profit of \$21,162, thanks to Brad Foord, Grant and Haley Maywald, Beau and Ren Lyons and all other members who provided their time to assist behind the bar this season. We are again extremely grateful for the contributions of Vonnies Olesinski for her effort in passing on the donation to the Club from the canteen activities. Many thanks to Mary Carr and Heather Zinnogger for taking responsibility for the club clothing; it is not an easy job, many clubs experience problems, and they have excelled, turning in a profit of \$1,293.

It was nice to have our Club back this season. With the new shed finished and the Gym moved to Wearing Street, it was a great start. This year it felt like we ran most of the carnivals. We held the Southern Team Challenge and backed it up the next day with a Junior Carnival, then a couple of weeks later we held the Nipperthon and a Senior Craft Carnival. Then in February we held the Master States and with a couple of Boat Carnivals it made for a busy season. Thanks to all of our IRB Drivers and Crews without them, Carnivals don't happen. Also thanks to Sharryn Campbell, Vonnie Olesinski and Gary Eastham for the great Breakfast, Lunch and Teas, The Work Force and the Patrols - without these people, it just wouldn't happen.

Our competitors did the Club proud. Some of our areas are down on competitors such as the Boat and Sprint areas and we will need to build numbers in coming seasons but we have had excellent results at all carnivals. We had Boat crews, Board, Ski and Beach Competitors competing at Freshwater and Manly Carnivals. The State Titles starting with Masters, Senior and then Junior States with excellent results and a huge amount of medals won.

The results from the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Scarborough Beach are the best we have had for years with the March Past teams winning Gold and Bronze and the rest of our team making the Semi Finals or Finals. The accommodation was very difficult to arrange resulting in our members spread all over Perth. We learnt from this year and have made a tentative booking for accommodation for next year. Another problem is the six days it takes to tow craft over and back, we have looked at other means of moving gear but it works out to be far too expensive and we learnt that clubs that used containers to transport gear had problems with boards delaminating. So I believe towing is still the best option. The Club is indebted to John Devitt for allowing us to use his vehicle to tow the gear to the Aussies and Lyndon Mills for being our water cover person.

Patrols under the watchful eye of Michelle Gray have been excellent, running as smooth as silk. The IRB's once again, have been well run and maintained under Derek Wix and Lyndon Mills. As a club we still have a problem with our members gaining awards and then not utilising these skills for Patrolling. This is after all why the club exists. As a club we need our members to improve themselves if we are to provide a safe beach and aquatic environment for the community. Ziggy Gieble has worked extremely hard running and promoting all awards available to our members - Thanks Mate.

At South Port we had approximately 12,000 people use the beach this season and we performed 10 rescues with 5 without an aid (that's a bit of a worry!), 68 First Aid cases with most being cuts and abrasions and 465 Preventative Actions.

There are so many people that need a pat on the back for their efforts Michelle Gray, Chris Foord, Don Alexander, Mary Carr, John Smith, John Devitt, Ian Boys, the IRB twins Derek Wix and Lyndon Mills and to all the Patrol personnel - Thanks.

This year it was very difficult to separate these people for the Captains Trophy. I have awarded the trophy to John Smith as he has patrolled, been the carnival work force coordinator, helped tow gear to Sydney and the Aussies Titles, been team manager at these carnivals and has volunteered for quite a few sub-committees - Well Done.

Thanks for a great season and we will see you soon.

Once again thanks again to everyone for a fantastic year and I wish everyone the best for the upcoming season.

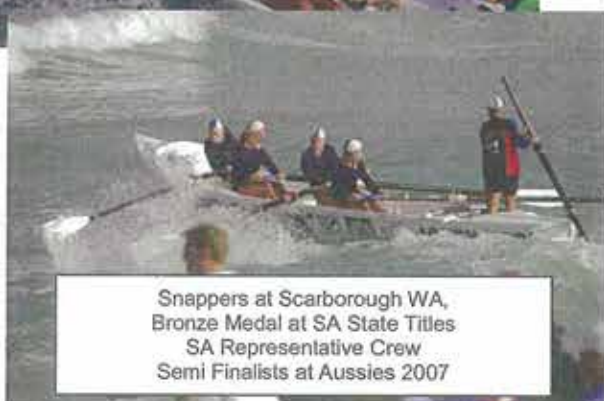

Gym

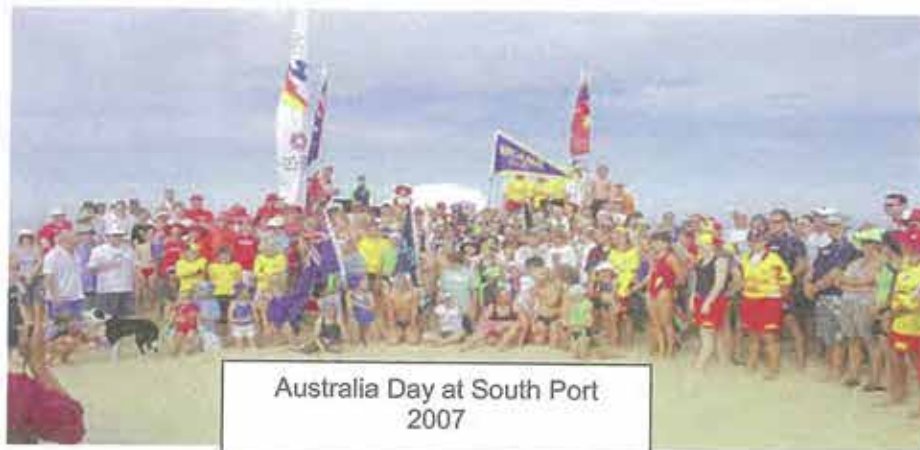

I believe he really had a soft spot for South Port and we certainly have the same feelings for him and his family.

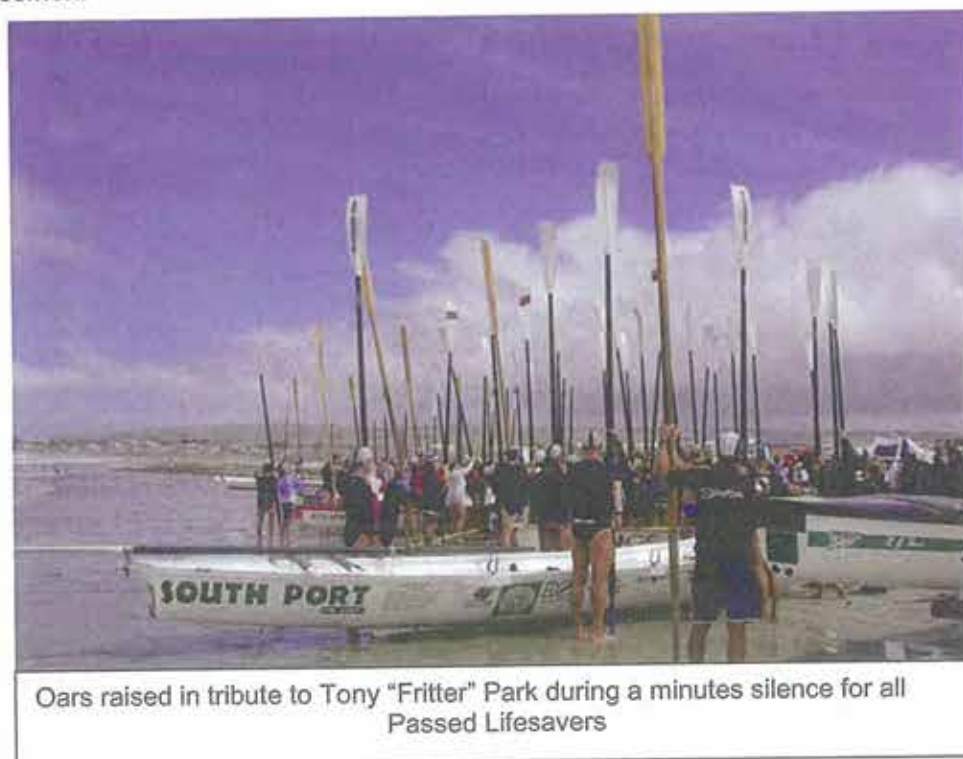

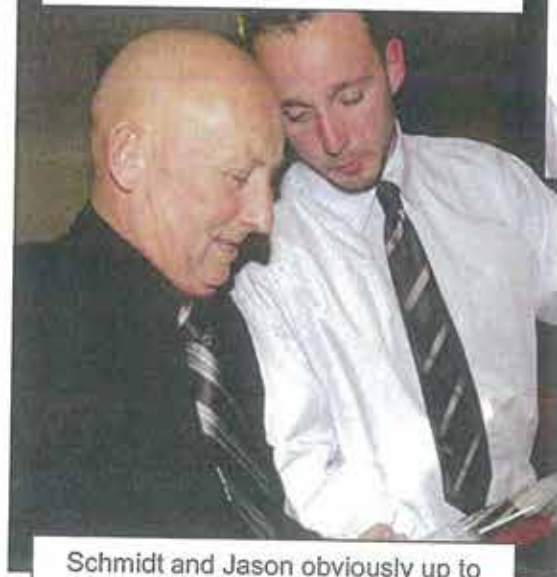

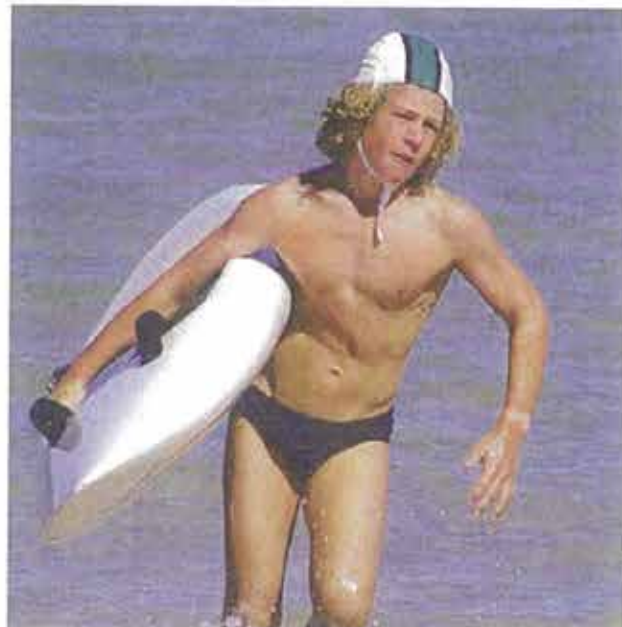

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

Inventories

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.
