- To maintain high safety standards of South Port Patrols
- To encourage competition as a means to attract and retain Members
- To create and maintain a friendly social atmosphere within the Club
- To create and maintain a friendly environment in which our Members can grow and learn
- To maintain an organisational structure conducive to the smooth operation of the Club
- To maintain good links with local Government and the community
- To raise community awareness of South Port Surf Life Saving Club
- To create and maintain a good working relationship with Surf Life Saving South Australia

Name: South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.

Affiliation: The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

Objectives

- To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and life saving equipment
- To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of Surf Life Saving Australia
- To patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga beach, south of the reef, to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River.
- To be on call within the City of Onkaparinga on such days and for such periods as Surf Life Saving South Australia shall from time to time determine
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction of life saving
- To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the City of Onkaparinga and other public bodies in improving facilities for bathers
- To encourage the physical and social welfare of Members
- To purchase, lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights and privileges
- To raise funds and borrow money for the purpose and benefit of the Club upon such terms and conditions as may be determined.

Colours: The Club colours are navy blue, white and green. The Club badge is a green silhouette of the side elevation of a standard reel with the words "South Port" above and "SLSC" below in white lettering superimposed on a navy background.

Surf Life Saving South Australia has developed a program called Nipper Safe, which is a program designed to protect the younger members of our organisation.

Nipper Safe is a joint initiative between the SA Police and SLSSA and it has gone about training some of our members in such things as:

- what is a paedophile, how do you recognise one, what are their characteristics?
- what you should do if you are suspicious about anything you have seen;
- how to keep yourself away from any suspicion;
- what your personal responsibilities are as a mandated Reporting Officer.

Each Club has had carefully selected members complete a mandated reporting training course, as well as a short training course developed by SA Police and the Child Youth and Family Services, specifically for SLSSA. These people are called Club Reporting Officers (CROs).

If you, as a parent, member, age group leader, or whatever, have the slightest suspicion about any of the children you see at nippers, then you are encouraged to speak to one of our CROs. You are encouraged to speak to any of these people if you have any concerns about child abuse of any form.

The abuse could be:

Physical: physical injury resulting from practices such as hitting, punching, beating or otherwise harming the child/young person.

Emotional: damage to a child's self esteem or social competence through chronic negative behaviour directed at them.

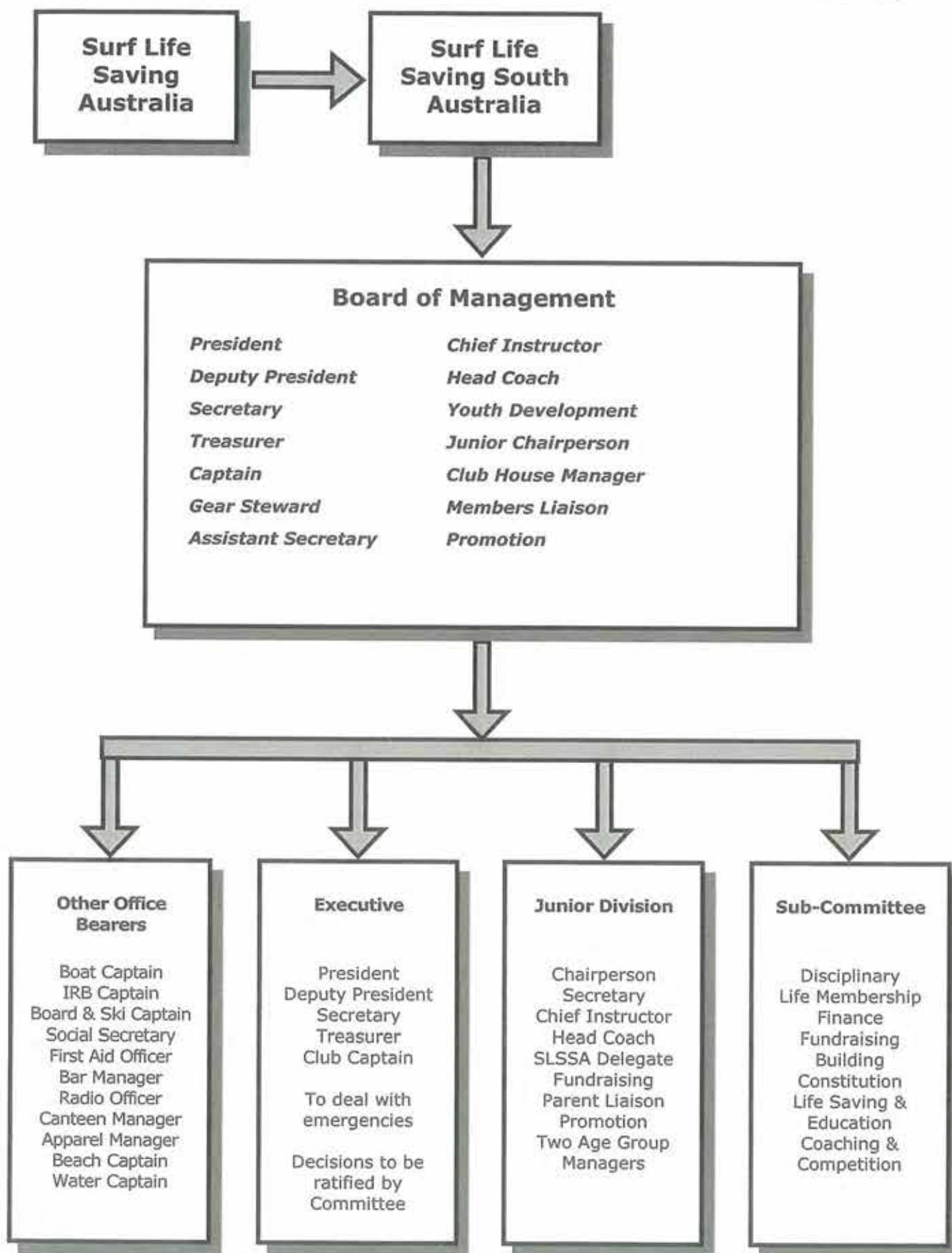
Sexual: when someone in a position of power to the child or young person uses their power to involve the child/young person in sexual activity of any nature.

Neglect: if you fail to provide for the child/young person's basic needs, including safety.

All reports are strictly confidential.

The Management Committee of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc encourages everyone to report any suspicion of child abuse either to the Child Abuse Report Line direct on 13 14 78 or to one of the CROs. Patrolling surf lifesavers are mandated by law to report. However, all other members of our Club also have a moral obligation to report.

President's Report



John Devitt

When sitting down to write this report it is always difficult to reflect on aspects of the season that make one season more memorable than any other, where to start, who to thank, statistics to quote, results to be proud of. I guess as many reports start off with what should ultimately be our main goal is to report that "no lives lost whilst we patrolled our beach".

South Port is a very special Surf Life Saving Club, to those of you that have not been involved in other Clubs, this one, our Club, prides itself on its traditions and history, we have many Life Members (indeed a couple of foundation members) still as willing participants in the day to day running of the Club that helps with these traditions. This helps build a very strong foundation for this Club to operate on and is something that needs to be protected at all costs. If we lose that very fabric, we risk losing the solid make up of our Club, and the force that drives us.

This season the Club has experienced a good membership growth and we will all have to continue to work hard to keep these new people and include them in all our activities, and indeed to attract more members. This growth has been at all levels from juniors to seniors and we welcome them all. Some of these members have come from other Clubs and we welcome you all. South Port is rapidly approaching its 50th year and I'm sure with the committee that's involved with the process of setting the celebrations into place it will be a year to remember.

At the 2005 Annual General Meeting we had discussions on the tenure of our position in the current location, mind you this process has been ongoing for many years now, thanks mainly to Chris Foord and past committees. This long and drawn out process has almost come to completion and by the time this report is read we should be able to say that we have now signed a long term lease with the City of Onkaparinga, with a maintenance agreement similar to the other Mid Coast Clubs. Keeping in mind that the way this works does not mean we stop doing things to our premises, it just means that items of capital could be taken care of by the Council, financially that will be of great benefit to us. Part of this process was the Building Audit undertaken by PMS at the direction of the Council and that presented us with an estimated \$200,000 worth of repairs and maintenance to undertake before the Council would consider giving us the maintenance lease. This presented us with quite a challenge and much discussion took place as to the best way to tackle this problem. Beau Lyons took on the job as Club House Director knowing full well what he was in for and I must thank him for doing so.

The results speak for themselves as you sit here at this AGM, have a look around and see the transformation that has taken place. The process is and will be ongoing, after all it's the very environment that we occupy that creates most of our maintenance issues, and would we really want to be anywhere else. My thanks to Don Alexander, Martin Chilman Mark Webster and Mary Carr for the work on the wood panelling, to Beau Lyons, Lyndon Mills, Derek Wix, , Jason McGaffin, Mike Etheridge, Ian Boys and Steve Peters for their work on the brickwork, tiling, and the glass bricks. Thanks must go to Dave Stagg for supplying the frames for the glass bricks.

The Mid Coast Group of Clubs continue to meet monthly and share ideas and support one another in their quest for services and assistance from the various bodies that effect our functionality. Through this group Dick Olesinski was able to get Mobil to sponsor the Nipperthon and supply each Club with a Patrol radio, this support amounted to \$10,000. This season the group has decided to take on the organisation of the Nipperthon and not throw some junior parents in the deep end and see what happens, cooperation and help will be needed from each and every Club to run this event as it should be. This coming season it will be at Port Noarlunga.

This season we also gained the support of a major sponsor through the business associations of Brian Johns of Sunbeam in the form of Mr. Addie Yeung and his partners from Top Level Industrial in Hong Kong. They kindly presented us with \$20,000. This sort of money is an enormous bonus to us and greatly appreciated in the ever tightening economy. We had the pleasure of Addie's company on Friday the 28th of March at the Club, and from all reports Addie enjoyed the evening. Details of the use of the money will no doubt be in the Treasurers report.

President's Report

We had another windfall this year, with the Club receiving the use of a Yamaha Rhino ATV for the second half of the patrolling season. We had to apply for the use of one of the four Rhino's that Shane Daw; State Manager of Life Saving Services in SA was able to get from funding from the State and Federal Government. Many Clubs applied for these ATV's with three of the four going to Mid Coast Clubs. This machine has been of great benefit to the patrols in the second part of the season and we certainly hope to keep the ATV for next season as well. I think our Patrol Captains have become more dependent on the Rhino than the Ute. This machine is reportedly worth in the vicinity of \$24,000. This is a significant contribution (over \$95,000) from our State and Federal governments to help with the patrolling of our beaches.

On the competition side of things I would like to congratulate all the members of the Club for their efforts this season, from the youngest Junior to the oldest Senior, probably an age span of almost 70 years. While we are not the biggest competitive Club, we achieve results that are the envy of many other Clubs.

Some credible results were achieved and I'll leave that up to the Competition Officer and Head Coach to report on these. But a couple deserve mention from the Aussies, congratulations to Thomas Gray for his Gold medal in the Under 17 Tube Rescue, and the March past team for another Gold, as well as winning the State title they also had a win in the Centenary carnival at Bondi in December.

On the Aussie titles, this is an extract from my report last season and I quote "Lyndon Mills also covered for us at the Nationals this year, because we had over thirty competitors, including March Past. The Club had to provide an IRB or Jet Ski driver with at least Level One Official accreditation. Every competitor in the Club should be very grateful of Lyndon for his efforts in WA. On this subject, we have to be very mindful next season if we have more than thirty competitors at the Nationals, we are up for the same commitment from one or two of our IRB drivers, don't just assume it will happen. It has to be taken into serious consideration."

Obviously it wasn't taken into to consideration, it was very lucky that Lyndon was going, he just wanted to be there as a spectator, but very, very kindly consented to cover for us, with Andy or Mandi Bedford filling in one day for him so he could relax with his family. Lyndon on behalf of the Club, Thank You.

So the challenge is on for the coming nationals, rest assured we will have over 30 competitors, and they do stop you competing until the water cover/Official quota required is fulfilled, just ask Grange, it is something that **EVERYONE** has to be aware of and sort out early in the season not at the last minute. Train all you like, have all the aspirations you like, but without the IRB/Jet Ski Driver/Official forget it!

We had another bonus this season with Andrew Bedford being chosen as the South Australian Life Saver of the Year and then going on in WA and being chosen as the Australian Life Saver of the Year, congratulations to you Andrew and welcome to South Port.

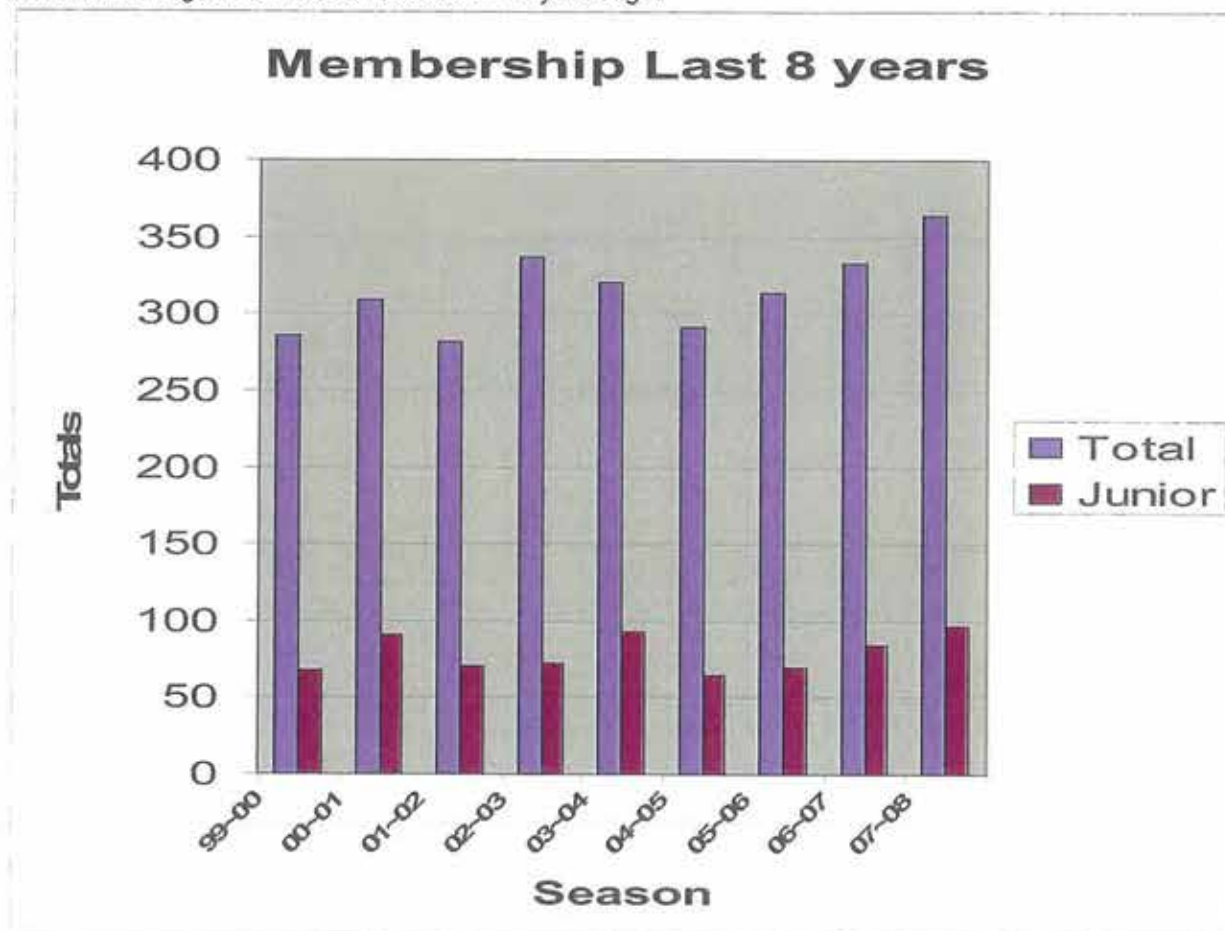

- Establishing a sound working relationship with the City of Onkaparinga.
- Securing of leases for the 5 Clubs.

- Mobil sponsorship which has resulted in the purchase of 5 surf boats and Nipperthon prizes.
- Working with the City of Onkaparinga to achieve the shared storage facility at Hunt Park.
- Colonnades sponsorship.
- Gaining of a number of Rec & Sports, Federal Government and Council grants.
- The impetus for a number of SLSSA projects has come from pressure from the MCG presidents e.g. The Facilities Management group, Jet Skis, Defibrillators, Scrutiny of SLSSA finances.

Income Statement

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities was \$17,998, compared to a profit of \$16,439 in the last financial year.

Balance Sheet

The total member's funds have increased from \$327,463 to \$345,324 this financial year.

Trading Income

Trading revenue was \$26,874, a slight drop from the previous year. Bar profit of \$20,818 decreased to \$21,063. During the year we had may price increases from our suppliers, which forced us to increase some of our bar prices, however we are still well below your normal hotel prices. Thanks to the many members who from time to time assist with serving behind the bar and helping to keep the shelves full.

We are again extremely grateful for the contributions of Vonnie Olesinski for her effort in passing on the donation to the Club from the canteen activities. She continues to a very difficult job, often on days when it is extremely uncomfortably in the canteen and we all appreciate her continuing efforts.

Mary Carr and Heather Zinnogger again took care of the clothing for the seniors and juniors and increased the profit, for two years in a row, to \$1,532.

Grants and Donations-Financial Dependency

The Club is dependent on the receipt of significant grants and donations to maintain its cash flows in operating activities and we sincerely appreciate the support of these businesses and organisations.

The competitors who were selected in the State Team from South Port were Thomas Gray, Caitlyn Gray, Shani Copley, Jake McKenzie, and the Open Men's Boat Crew consisting of Gavin Cragg, Jason Cloonan, Jeff Hegarty, Ben West and Chris Foord; all of these competitors competed extremely well.

States Middleton, where do I start? All the competitors competed extremely well which shows in the results. I would like to mention the events which stick in my mind. The Lifesaver Relay where the women's boat crew, Lisa Biggs, Kate Kryzs, Jenny Drake, Mary Carr and Don Alexander, led the race and came in on a wave from the cans which was spectacular to see, then Shaun Burnett paddled the board and tagged Zachary Ryan for the swim leg and Matt Lee paddled an awesome race in the ski leg and tagged Ben Goldfinch for the run to first place.

The other event was from Caitlyn Gray, as she wasn't going to compete in the open board or ski but then decided to and won gold in both these events, at that moment I was a proud parent. Lauren Etheridge and Caitlyn decided to compete in the double ski (both of them really didn't train much on the double ski together) and they came home with a Bronze Medal. All the competitors competed so well including the U14's who were in their first State Titles and came home with many medals. Well done to all.

The event that showed the most persistence was the U17 Ski Team of Thomas Gray, Zachary Ryan and Ben Goldfinch. The event was at the end of the day and conditions were deteriorating with Thomas leading the way followed by Ben, who lost his ski in difficult conditions and had to swim back to the shore and start again, finally tagging Zachary, to gain a third place. This was a moment for any spectator to feel the dedication that Ben showed not only to himself but also to the team.

Lastly the Nationals, which was held in Western Australia; we once again had many competitors compete and all did very well making it to the finals, the quarter finals or making it through several rounds. This is what we train for because we are now up against the best and we certainly made South Port proud.

We won two Gold Medals. Once again the March Past Team won a Gold Medal; it's quite an achievement winning as much gold as this team has done. Thomas Gray won gold in the U17 Rescue Tube, which was a special moment for both Michelle and I.

To summarise this report I would like to say WELL DONE to ALL the competitors this season and wish you all the best for the upcoming season. Thank you to everyone who has helped me this season, I have enjoyed being the head coach and being part of your achievements.

The season started 3 November 2007, at the traditional Port Augusta Outback Surfboat Series. Some good results with a 1st in the open men's, 2nd in the open women's, 1st in the reserves, 2nd in U23 men's, 2nd in U23 women's and a 3rd in the U19's. We also had a first in the mixed relay. So all together came away with over \$2,000 in prize money; a good start to the season and a great way for all the boaties and club members to get to know everyone a little better. We would like to thank the board and ski paddlers for helping out by competing for the Club on the day.

This year was the Year of the Surf Lifesaver and for the first time both a men and women's team would be competing for the State in the 2008 Interstates at Bondi in December 2007. Three State trials were held with the open men's team being selected and unfortunately the ladies missed out.

The overall Port Augusta Grand Prix series result were disappointing after leading all season only to be beaten by 4 points by Grange who performed better than our crews in the final racing of the season at the State Titles at Middleton; the result of not enough time training in the testing conditions on this particular beach.

The Club had four crews compete at the States at Middleton with the open men's missing the cut to make the finals. The open women's crew performed very well on the day and it was a disappointing third place, after leading the event, for Bristles, Jen, Lisa, Kate and Mary, but still congratulations to them for their effort on the day in some demanding surf conditions. They still managed to pick up a Gold Medal in the Lifesaver Relay. Beau's reserve crew had a disrupted season of training due to things beyond their control and missed the cut also. He had the mighty U23 crew into the final on the day and looking at a medal only to roll almost on the line for a DNF.

In the Masters divisions we had three crews competing all year in the Ian's Western Hotel masters series; with the South Port Seychell's crew in the Women's, Gina Mills, Karyn Kelly, Penny McKenzie, and Brigitte Richardson, swept by Andy Bedford gaining a second place. In the Men's division we had the South Port SOCCS, Normy Churchman, Rob Mooney, Michael Campbell, Ray Burnett swept by Adam Parkinson coming 6th overall, and the South Port Phantoms, Chris Foord, Paul Howse, Dick Olesinski, Mark Webster swept by Beau Lyons coming in 7th overall. You have to keep in mind that the crews these masters crews are rowing against have only just moved out of reserve grade and are a lot younger than our crews so well done.

In the Masters State Titles at Port Elliot we had a win in the 120 Men's, with Gavin Cragg, Jeff Hegarty, Ian Hodgen, Andrew Bedford and Chris Foord and the 220 Men's with Chris Foord, Paul Howse, Dick Olesinski, Mark Webster and Beau Lyons, a third place in the 200 Men's again with Normy Churchman, Rob Mooney, Michael Campbell, Ray Burnett swept by Adam Parkinson and another third in the 160 Women's crew with Gina Mills, Tracy Dohnt, Penny McKenzie, Brigitte Richardson and Andy Bedford. It was good to see more of the Masters competing after a few slack years.

At the Australian Championships in Perth the ladies open crew made it through to the sixth round just failing to make it to Sunday's racing; a much improved effort over the previous year with solid racing throughout the day and not coming in lower than third until the last race. This result also made sure that the Club held onto the State trophy for the Most Successful Club at the Australian Championships. The men's crew Gavin Cragg, Jason Cloonan, Jeff Hegarty, Ben West and Chris Foord, unfortunately didn't make it past the round robin.

The Surf Boat Trophy awarded at the annual presentation night went to Mary Carr. She has finally listened to her body and decided that the enough is enough and while she will continue to row and sweep she will not be available for the open ladies crew. Mary is an inspiration to all of us in the boat area not only does she row, do the gym work, stretch, tow, organise the training of other crews, including the women's U23 crew, but she is the main go-to person that has kept the ladies boat area strong for the Club for the past six or seven years; a deserving winner of the trophy.



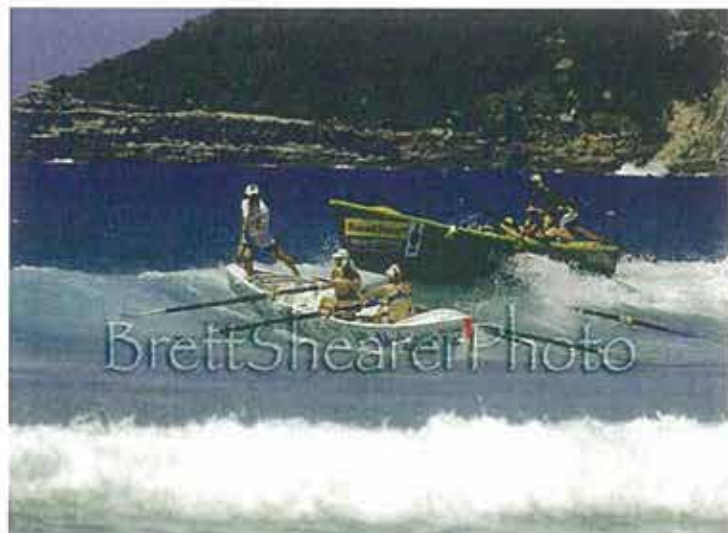

The boats and motors were inspected on the Friday and all passed, thanks also go to the team from Port Noarlunga for their help getting all the boats and motors carried through the area.

After attending the team managers meeting on the Friday night we were assured by the referee that he had visited all states and given input to the competition. Apparently all states in Australia are located along the east coast and there are only three. After celebrating the success in 2007 it was hoped that the same team might be available for an attempt at the 2008 Australian Titles. This concept was agreed by the team members. However, there were three circumstances which might arise that would affect this. Firstly, the coach was advised that more cancer had been detected and that he would need further treatment to hopefully deal with this. Secondly, both Jenny Whitmee and Katherine Hobbs were unsure as to whether they would be residing in Adelaide and would not know until December 2007. In Jenny's case it was a matter of whether she would move to Queensland whilst her husband Craig continued his work in that State and as to whether Katherine would move to Townsville after her marriage to Scott in December.

A light training programme was initially programmed for the two local carnivals prior to Christmas and was implemented. However, following the first carnival in November it was resolved by SLSC that a Centenary March Past Championship would be held at Bondi on 2 December 2007. Given the short notice it was realised that it would be an expensive exercise (approximately \$5,300) for the team to compete at Bondi but, as reigning World and Australian Champions, it was considered appropriate that we attend. The coach volunteered to pay the majority of the costs with each team member contributing \$100 and the Club generously assisting with a contribution of \$1,000. The rest is history and the team, in addition to its other titles, can now lay claim to being the Centenary of Lifesaving Champions. Competing at Bondi was a logistical masterpiece with Jenny coming down from Cairns, David Gardner from Maroochydore and the rest leaving very early from Adelaide and all returning to their respective destinations that same evening. "Real day trippers!"

The week after Bondi, Kath got married to Scott and went off to Townsville. She has, of course, kept in touch throughout the season. Jenny (at least temporarily) delayed a move to Queensland so this left us one short. We were pleased when Yvonne Olesinski joined the team and fitted in so easily. There were only four senior carnivals this season so it was opportune when the junior referee again asked Glenelg and us to compete at junior carnivals which we both did on one occasion.

The State Titles went as planned with the Club winning its 24th State Title.

Accommodation was arranged at Sullivans Hotel in Perth for the Aussies with a mini bus providing transport for training at Trigg Island. Once again the Trigg Club were very generous in their hospitality and over the past two years this has become a welcome base for the Team. Several training sessions were scheduled, one of which proved to be our best, notwithstanding that it was conducted in the middle of a three hour downpour in Perth which delivered 1½ inches (35-40 mm) of rain.

The team, at the coach's invitation, attended SLSC's Awards of Excellence Dinner at which he was inducted into the Hall of Fame and also at which Andrew Bedford was announced as Life Saver of the Year; these were significant achievements for the South Port Club.

Competition at the Aussies presented new challenges for all teams due to the restricted area available. Fortunately (with the assistance of our training), we overcame these difficulties and were again successful in winning our 9th Australian Open March Past Championship (all between the years 1995-2008) which clearly indicates the Team's excellence. This is a much higher winning ratio than even the famous Bundaberg Club between 1959 and 1991.

Transportation of our reel was made much easier this year to both Bondi and Perth due to the donation of special packing bags for transport of the disassembled reel arranged by our club President, John Devitt, whose effort and donation of \$1,500 was greatly appreciated.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 116:	Property, Plant and Equipment
AASB 1031:	Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of manufactured products includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction.

Fixed Assets

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.
