




**Name:** South Port Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated.


**Affiliation:** The Club is affiliated with Surf Life Saving South Australia.

- To be on call within the City of Onkaparinga on such days and for such periods as Surf Life Saving SA shall from time to time determine


- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction of life saving

# Secretary's Report





Normally the Secretary would give a brief synopsis of the events that took place throughout the season. This year I leave that to those who know their respective areas better than I, knowing they will convey all that is required.

I considered that this year I would look back over the last 44 seasons and show how our club has progressed. 
#### Rescues and First Aid

Over the years as our beach became known and was the place to be seen, our statistics in these two areas formed the basis of our objectives, have grown steadily. This increase shows how diligent we have become and how with our membership growth this was transferred into increased service to the community. It is still pleasing to note that as per our initial reason for being, "no lives have been lost on South Port Beach". It should also be noted that with our vigilance and service we have been called upon to conduct Resuscitation on only 5 occasions and all of these being in the 1960's.

Also many an older member will probably also tell you that the surf was always bigger in the olden

days. And if you are to believe the statistics it would hold true, as many a club member who was here in the 70's would attest that the surf seemed bigger those years. And yes we had a lot more rescues then that we do now. Or are we more vigilant and warn the public better today than we used to. I won't comment as I was here for both eras.

As to our First Aid statistics it is, as per our rescue numbers, ever increasing, as we continue to grow with the community. Again, we serve those who use our beach well and many a Patrolling member can give an account of a nasty gash or broken bone over the years.





#### Awards

# Secretary's Report

#### Summary

As a club South Port has a very proud tradition and is known across Australia. We have developed on both the home front in all facets of Surf Lifesaving and nationally as a strong competitor through March Past, Boats, Boards and Ski's. The time will come when we will also make a mark on the beach.

So what does this all mean to us?

Well since our beginnings back in the 50's our little club down south has:

- Registered 7,381 persons as members of South Port Surf Life Saving Club.
- Rescued 671 people from possible drowning.
- Given First Aid to 1,670 individuals.
- Trained individuals such that 1,981 awards have been given.

Also as a side issue, if you valued each person saved on today's dollar value, at say \$100,000 for insurance purposes, do you know we saved the economy or insurance companies \$67,000,000. Yes you read it right. Wouldn't it be nice just to get less than 1% of that to help surf life saving.

Not bad for a group of volunteers originally based around an old tin shed.

So have a read of our little report and look at the numbers contained within it and take time out to congratulate yourselves and the other members.

We have done it good for a long time. Let's keep doing it.

The overall financial position of the Club hasn't changed significantly during the past twelve months. One of the hardest parts of a Treasurers job is to have money in the bank to pay the bills. Even though we are turning over close to \$3,500 per week we never really seem to be able to get into a comfort zone with the finances.

Without Grants from the Government, Council and the Surf Life Saving Trust Fund, this year totalling \$21,681 we would find ourselves having to curtail many of our essential services. Donations from our members and supporters of \$24,401 make a very big contribution to our position and we a reliant on these two sources of funds.

There has been a change in some of our income supply this year over previous years, mainly in the area of Grants, Trading, Carnival Activities, Surf Boat Prize money and the expenditure of our Touring Teams.

#### Balance Sheet

The Members equity increased again this year by \$20,157, mainly due to cash assets, receivables, slight increase in inventories and \$12,406 increase in property plant and equipment.

Our Liabilities increased by \$10,057 which is the balance of the loan that was used to purchase the Holden Rodeo.

#### Revenue

Revenue increased to \$180,978, a marginal increase over the previous year, which allowed \$45,272 to be provided in investing activities.

#### Income & Expenditure

Profit from ordinary activities fell over the previous period from \$34,450 to \$20,157 with increased expenditure on Motor Vehicles and Entry Fees..

#### Trading

In last years report, I mentioned that Vonnie Olesinski produced a fantastic result with \$4,148 profit, well this year she has surpassed that to record a profit of \$8,135. It was a difficult season for Vonnie, at times she felt like giving it away but thankfully she didn't and with perseverance has brought about a financial result that in the past would have taken many years to accomplish.

To those members who helped Vonnie in the canteen, we thank you, however if Vonnie is to continue and we sincerely trust that she will, then more members will have to help, because it is a very demanding position on your own.

#### Clothing

For the first time in a few years the responsibility of clothing was split between Vonnie, with the seniors and Sharon Lohse, the juniors.

We have found over many years that it is very hard to make a profit on clothing and this year was no different. Both ladies put in a lot of time and effort to ensure that the members were able to purchase clothing suitable for the beach and it is no fault of theirs that we didn't make a profit.

#### Bar

David 'Wal' Watt took on the bar manager's role again this year. Sales were down on the previous period. However we managed to keep costs under control to produce a very creditable profit of \$20,111.

#### Audit

Barry Edgecombe, who has contributed many hours to ensure that the Audit was in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards, has been on the Audit team for three years. Of course no Club Audit could be finalised without the meticulous checking of Bob Mayo. Bob's contribution to the process is invaluable and his high standards should give all members confidence in the process.

Thanks to our Auditors, Fennell, Allen & Co. for the preparation and delivery of the Audit.

#### Conclusion

Many people have contributed to the financial well being of the Club, not only over the past twelve months but for years.

In particular, those members who consistently support our social activities, provide donations, use the bar as their pub, run the canteen and clothing, assist at carnivals and repair and maintain the Clubhouse. Without these fantastic members we wouldn't be where we are today.

#### Holden Surf Patrol Vehicle Program

The Holden Surf Patrol Vehicle Program is a National Initiative developed by Holden and Surf Life Saving Australia to enable Surf Life Saving Clubs, Branches and State Centres across Australia to purchase motor vehicles from a selection of the Holden 4x4 range on a discounted dollar for dollar subsidy basis. Our Club was successful in applying for a Rodeo LX 4x4 Single Cab Pick Up at a cost of \$13,545, plus on road costs of \$1,725, for a total of \$15,270.

Retail value \$31,460, donated value to the Club **\$15.740** 

#### Yamaha Surf Rescue Program

The Yamaha Surf Rescue Program is a national initiative developed by Yamaha and Surf Life Saving Australia to enable Surf Life Saving Clubs, Branches and State Centres across Australia to purchase discounted Yamaha surf rescue equipment. Our Club was successful in applying for a Yamaha Outboard Motor for \$1,480.

Retail Value \$3,300, donated value to the Club **\$1,820.** 

#### Junior Nipper Board

Mobil Refinery donates \$15,000 each year to the five Mid Coast Clubs, \$10,000 goes to one Club towards the cost of a new surf boat and the balance of \$1,250 is given to each of the other four clubs to purchase a Nipper Board and first aid equipment.

Value to the Club \$1.250

#### Junior Nipperthon

The Mid Coast Clubs hold a Nipperthon each year and donate a Nipper Board to one of the Clubs. This year we were the lucky ones.

Value to the Club \$891

#### Surf Boat Super Series

For the third year in a row South Port Boaties won the overall point score of the Port August Super Series to win a set of Croker oars valued at \$2,500. In addition we were placed first in three categories and won sweep oars valued at \$1,650 at Port Augusta. By coming first in the Super Series we also won another sweep oar at the Annual Australian Surf Boat Rowers League Luncheon, valued at \$550



# Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2003

#### NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The financial report covers South Port SLSC as an individual entity. South Port SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act.

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### (a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (b) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### (c) Property Plant and Equipment

The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of its premises, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and re-valued the Club's property, plant and equipment at \$223,526. After taking into consideration the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated, the Board of Management ratified a further revaluation decrement of \$20,000 to the Club's premises as at 30 April 2002.

The value of the Club's non-current assets, are reviewed annually by the Board of Management and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.

#### (d) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

#### (e) Revenue

Revenue from the sale off goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers

interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets

Revenue from rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of a service to customers. All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (f) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST



Again we were kept very busy with first aid treatment given to the public.



Many bandages, ice packs and bandaids were used during the season, therefore I am assuming that a number of first aid cases have not been documented. All members are urged to report all


first aid cases no matter how minor, this is very important as records must be kept for all first aid cases.







The season kicked off for the IRB's by providing water cover for the Surf Boat Super Series and only got busier from there.



Another season has come to an end with everybody enjoying the activities of the Club, in complete safety.






