Nipper Safe



Surf Life Saving South Australia has developed a program called Nipper Safe, which is a program designed to protect the younger members of our organisation.

Nipper Safe is a joint initiative between the SA Police and SLSSA and it has gone about training some of our members in such things as:

- what is a paedophile, how do you recognise one, what are their characteristics?
- what you should do if you are suspicious about anything you have seen;
- how to keep yourself away from any suspicion;
- what your personal responsibilities are as a mandated Reporting Officer.

Each Club has had carefully selected members complete a mandated reporting training course, as well as a short training course developed by SA Police and the Child Youth and Family Services, specifically for SLSSA. These people are called Club Reporting Officers (CROs).

If you, as a parent, member, age group leader, or whatever, have the slightest suspicion about any of the children you see at nippers, then you are encouraged to speak to one of our CROs. You are encouraged to speak to any of these people if you have any concerns about child abuse of any form.

The abuse could be:

Physical: physical injury resulting from

practices such as hitting, punching, beating or otherwise harming the child/young person.

Emotional: damage to a child's self esteem

or social competence through chronic negative behaviour

directed at them.

Sexual: when someone in a position of

power to the child or young person uses their power to involve the child/young person in

sexual activity of any nature.


Neglect: if you fail to provide for the

child/young person's basic needs,

including safety.

All reports are strictly confidential.

The Management Committee of the South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc encourages everyone to report any suspicion of child abuse either to the Child Abuse Report Line direct on 13 14 78 or to one of the CROs. Patrolling surf lifesavers are mandated by law to report. However, all other members of our Club also have a moral obligation to report.



President's Report



John Devitt

Well another season comes to a close, and I'm glad to report no lives lost at our beach whilst we patrolled. This year has been a learning curve for me in this position, there has been marked and wholesale changes to the way our State Centre functions. Some of these changes will affect the everyday running of the movement, but changes that were required, not for the sake of it. This amounted to a lot of behind the scenes work to try and gain the best outcomes for Surf Life Saving SA. I think at this point in time this has been achieved. There is still a lot of work to do and hopefully the new State Board of Management will be capable of doing so.

The Mid Coast Group is still working hard with the support of the Onkaparinga City Council to get the off site storage facility up and completed. There have been a few problems with this project that are not easy to overcome, but with due diligence by the group and Andy Furman from the Onkaparinga City Council I'm sure these will be resolved in the short term. Another issue that the MCG is looking into is the lease agreements (or lack thereof) for the Mid Coast Clubs, we at this stage are not included in this scheme for various reasons. The other four Clubs are pushing to have us included in this deal. At this point I would like to thank Chris Foord for his continued attendance as South Port's delegate to the MCG. Chris was involved with the initial formation of the Mid Coast Group over 10 years ago. This group plays such an important role in the liaison with the City Council and other elements within our area.

I don't know if all members are aware of the fact that we are responsible for all our own maintenance and repairs to the building and site we occupy. The other four Clubs are maintained by the City Council. This is another example of expense that we incur and the money comes from whatever funds we raise: membership; donations; sponsorship; canteen; and bar.

The Club Board of Management has looked into the installation of a maceration pump and risingmain to take our effluent offsite from our antiquated septic and into the sewerage system across the road. With the cost of this project estimated at the time to be around \$20,000 we decided to proceed to the design stage. At the time of writing this report we are currently looking at others ways to achieve a simple more environmentally acceptable result, we have to be very careful because of our location, with the

beach one side and the river on the other and being right in a sensitive dune area. We can't have the enviro-cycle system because of our location but there is another system that could be acceptable. We were a bit concerned at a cost blow-out with the rising-main: it's going to cost around \$7,000 just to get to the first plan drawing stage, with no assurance that SA Water will accept this. Their concerns are spillage, in the event of a problem, going into the dunes and or river/beach systems. So we are looking at an environmental system. I should be able to report more during the AGM.

Another issue we are currently pursuing is turning the Club into being solar powered. Currently one of our hot water systems is worn out and we looked at solar replacement for this. On consultation with M&S Campbell Plumbing & Gas, Mick suggested going solar. So to take this one step further we are investigating the options available to us in the form of State or Federal funding to facilitate this happening. With this in mind we need to look at what grants and funding are available and seek the assistance of any member who has the desire to help out.

Changing the subject completely now, this year we did not have the luxury of falling back on carnivals for revenue, so this year our turnover is down on previous years, but be warned next season the Club will have to look to conducting several carnivals in order to keep our much needed funds on the improve, so please consider, "what can I do to help". Don't leave it to others when we conduct these carnivals. They are extremely hard work, but a good revenue raiser, and can be a lot of fun if many members help out.

Some members might wonder at the Board of Management's reluctance to purchase as much new equipment for all of our competitors this season, after consultation with them we worked out what was needed with the understanding the Club was up for some major capital works expenditure and decided they could do with the absolute minimum this season.

Thanks to the following:

Mike Etheridge, the Club's Chief Instructor - Mike again has put so much time and effort into his job that it's not easy to pay homage to his efforts. Bones, a simple thank you never seems enough.

season, and still has been his usual inspirational self in his approach to the job. Thanks Andy, glad to see you back and at it again. Membership

Statement of Financial Performance

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities was a loss of \$2,879 this season compared to a profit of \$10,198 in 2003/04. This is a decrease of \$13,077 brought about by an increase in cost of sales, depreciation, borrowing costs, other expenses from ordinary activities.

Statement of Financial Position

The net assets of the Club have decreased slightly from \$278,503 in 2003/04 to \$275,624 this year. There was a minor decrease in total assets whilst total liabilities increased by \$1,215 due to a small increase in payables.

Statement of Cash Flow

The Club had \$47,121 in the bank at the end of the financial year, an increase of \$30,924 compared to the previous year. Cash provided by and used in investing activities was \$5,231 in 2004/05. Net cash provided from financing activities was \$5,362. This was for the repayment of the loan which we have with the SLSSA Trust Fund.

Income

Revenue decreased by \$18,657 compared to the previous season, mainly caused by the extra revenue gained by holding the Australian Open in February 2004 and in part to the lack of carnival activities on our beach. Considering the above comments, Beau and Karen Lyons have done a fantastic job with running the Bar this season. Vonnie Olesinski once again had the same problem as Beau and Karen with a lack of activities but has once again done a wonderful job providing income to the Club. Karyn Kelly, provided the Club Members with some great clothing this season. The income was the best for years. We are left with more stock than we would normally require and some outstanding accounts, but I'm sure that it will all even out shortly.

Donations and Sponsorship

Donations to the Club are down again this past season to \$3,300.

Mobil Refinery has once again provided \$10,000 to go towards the purchase of a new surf boat. This is the third time in five years they have

supported the Club with such a large Sponsorship and we are indebted to them for their continuing support.

Grants-Financial Dependency

The Club is dependent on the receipt of significant grants to maintain its cash flows in operating activities:

We sincerely appreciate the support of these organisations; when you look at the Detailed Statement of Income and Expenditure it is not hard to see how dependent the Club is on this income stream.

Conclusion

At the start of the season, after consultation with the competitors, the Club decided that the replacement schedule for craft would be slowed and that we would put some funds into maintaining our facilities. We have been having continuing discussions with the City of Onkaparinga on two proposals: to improve our septic system; and the development of the joint storage facility with the Mid Coast Clubs.

We realised that we needed to be careful how and when we spent our money, because the cost of both the above items has escalated in recent times, to such an extent that we are seriously looking at the proposals to see if there are cheaper alternatives.

We have recently been successful with three Grants from the Office of Recreation and Sport (they don't show in these accounts), to assist with the offsite storage facility and equipment for our competitors, all of which will assist in lowering the burden on members in the coming season.

Thanks to all of our members who provided support to the Club over the past season. There are so many ways to contribute in reducing our expenditure that even the smallest contribution of money or your time will be of long term benefit to the Club.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2005

NOTE 1 - STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (South Australia).

The financial report covers South Port SLSC as an individual entity. South Port SLSC is an association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporations Act. The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Club in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Inventories

Inventories consist of trading stock and are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Property Plant and Equipment

The Club's Board of Management re-assessed the value of its premises, plant and equipment as at 30 April 2000 and re-valued the Club's property, plant and equipment at \$223,526. After taking into consideration the realisable value of leasehold improvements in the event of the lease being terminated, the Board of Management ratified a further revaluation decrement of \$20,000 to the Club's premises as at 30 April 2002.

The value of the Club's non-current assets, are reviewed annually by the Board of Management and they are of the opinion that the book value, after allowance for the current year's depreciation charge, represents fairly their carrying values.

(d) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash on hand and at bank.

(e) Revenue

Revenue from the sale off goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

(f) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Adoption of Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards

Australia is currently preparing for the introduction of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) effective for the financial years commencing 1 January 2005. This requires the production of accounting data for future comparative purposes at the end of the current financial year.

The Board of Management is assessing the significance of these changes and preparing for their implementation. A separate IFRS subcommittee has been established to oversee and manage the transition to IFRS.

The Board of Management is of the opinion that the key difference in the Club's accounting policies which will arise from the adoption of the IFRS are:

Impairment of Assets

The entity currently determines the recoverable amount of an asset on the basis of undiscounted net cash flows that will be received from the asset's use and subsequent disposal. In terms pending AASB 136 Impairment of Assets, the recoverable amount of an asset will be determined as the higher of fair value less costs to sell and value in use. It is likely that this change in accounting policy will lead to impairments being recognised more often than under the existing policy.

Patrol Competition

During season 2004/05, internal patrol inspections were conducted. The patrol inspections are an integral part of monitoring our Club's performance in a simulated emergency situation. Each patrol was assessed on the same scenario, which included 2 patients, one suffering from a spinal injury and the other patient found to be not breathing with pulse present.

As a result of the patrol inspections, I have concluded that there is considerable work to be done with the structure of the patrol roster.

The key areas that require urgent attention for the 2005/06 season are:

- considerable adjustments to the structure of the patrol roster
- mentoring and training of current and new Patrol Captains and Vice Captains
- more patrolling members completing awards such as ARC, IRB drivers prior to the patrolling season beginning

In regard to Patrol Captains, it is imperative that the appointed Patrol Captains have good leadership and communication skills. The patrols that scored highly in the inspections had captains that had these attributes.

Members need to be encouraged to do awards such as ARC and IRB Drivers. It does not take long to do the training and each patrol should have a minimum of 2 qualified ARC holders and at least 1 IRB Driver with an experienced and certified IRB crew. The ARC award is very important due to the recent introduction of the spinal board and understanding how to use the stiff neck collars.

There were outstanding performances by Patrols 4, 5 and 9. All of these patrols were under the

leadership of younger members of our club. Mathew Burgess, Marquerite Botha and Brad Long are all to be congratulated on the way they directed their patrols.

There were a couple of disappointing situations that occurred toward the end of the season which included two patrols being missed and requiring members from other patrols to step in. Unfortunately due to Patrol 9 misinterpreting a rostered patrol date, their good performance and result at the inspection was downgraded to a zero. Another patrol that was required to patrol over the Australian Titles weekend also resulted with a zero for the competition, only a few of their substitutes turned up, not a good result for the Club or the patrol.

The Champion Patrol for Season 2004/05 is Patrol Number 5. Members include: Captain – Matthew Burgess, Pam Etheridge, Lyndon Mills, Donna Boal, Brioni Oliver, Matt Whitmee, Peter Whitehorn, Michael Goldfinch and Garry Eastham. There were very good performances and efforts by the following patrols of who deserve a special mention - Patrol 4 captained by B. Long, Patrol 9 captained by M. Botha and Patrol 8 captained by John Nearmy.

To improve the quality of patrols we plan to hold internal inspections over the whole season instead of only in the second half. 
South Port Surf Club has excelled again in the field of competition.



Clubhouse Manager's Report










Members Liaison Officer's Report




Hopefully this year can be built on next season and see if we can be on our way to the top again,
