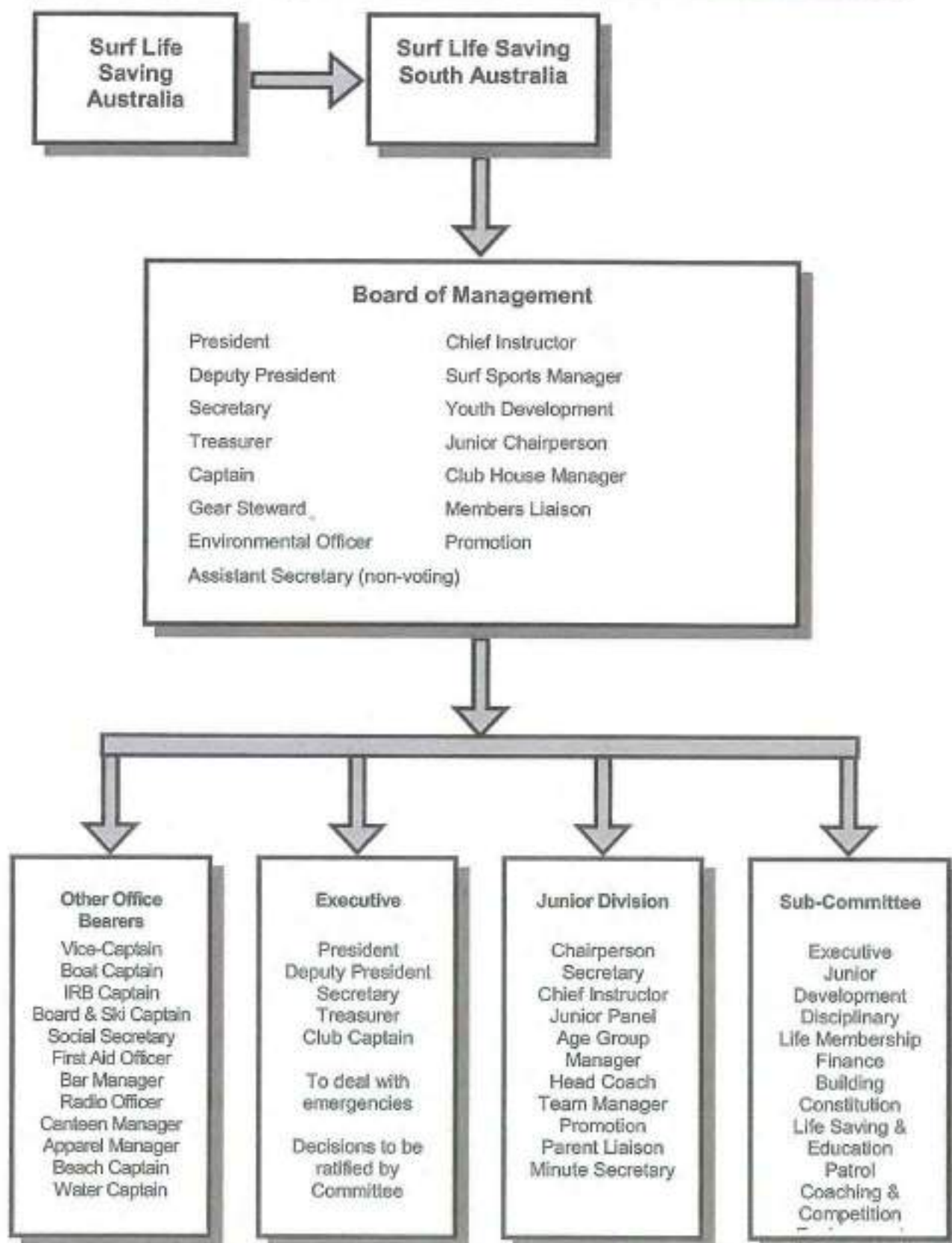
Procedures of note:

Woolworths presented a cheque for \$5000 to the Club for the purchase of a tent for the Juniors.

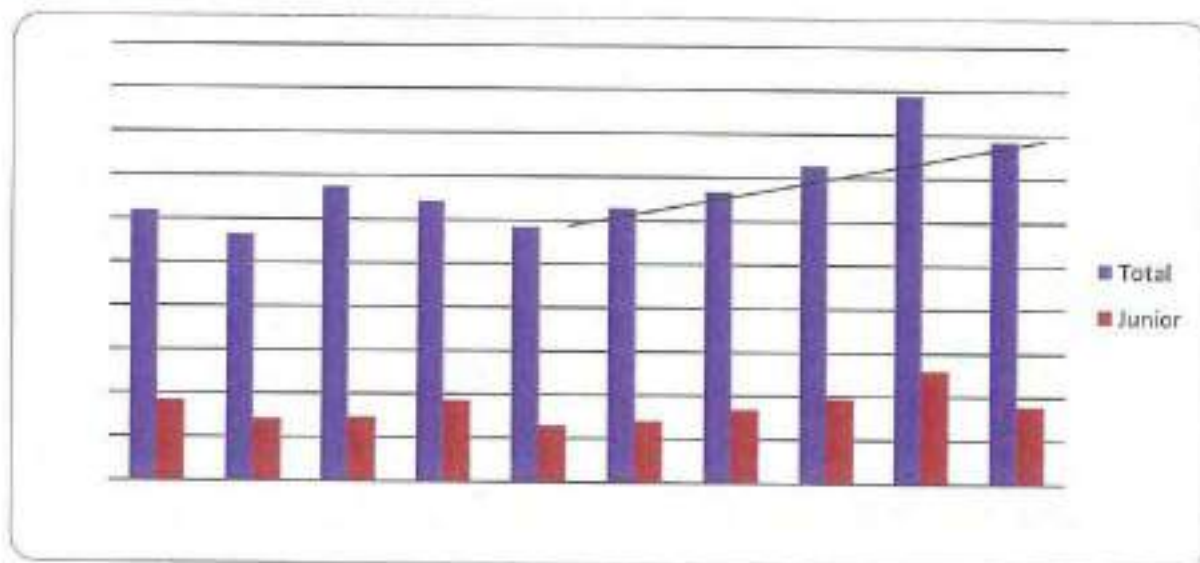
Secretary's Report

Income Statement

The consolidated net profit from ordinary activities shows a net profit of \$11,673.98. Member's funds stand at \$307,978.87.

Trading Income

Trading income was \$50,058, a big increase from the previous season of \$38,137.

Bar profit was \$39,781 which is the highest the Club has ever had in this area, and actually is higher than the turnover of ten or more years ago. The Colonnades Tavern has again been big supporters of the Club, for their annual contribution, supplying stock and providing many excellent prizes for our weekly raffles. Nothing is too much problem for them and they were particularly generous in giving the Club extra furniture for the 50th. I'd like to thank all of those members who have contributed their time to assist and lighten the load, especially to those who turned up for their bar roster.

Vonnie Olesinski provided us with a valuable donation of \$8,300, another record; this brings her contribution over the past nine years of holding the onerous job of Canteen Manager to \$57,988, a wonderful effort from Vonnie.

Mary Carr looked after the clothing for the third year in row and again turned in a profit of \$1,978. Making money out of clothing in the Club has been almost impossible over the years but to Mary's credit she has made a profit every year.

Grants

In the past the Club has normally has been dependent on Grants, however this season these funds have diminished, especially from SLSSA with a drop of \$23,500; so thankfully the trading profits have compensated to some extent.

It was a very busy season with great results coming second overall at Senior State Titles; our best result in over twenty years. It was great to see members compete in most areas - I can only see things getting better. Thanks to Ray Burnett for devoting a huge amount of time in coaching and encouraging members to compete.

IRB Competitors or The Dark Side as they like to be called, seem to be having a great time (I don't think their parents allowed them to play on bouncy castles as kids!). They have done the Club proud by performing well at 2009 State Titles (2010 States are still to be held) and both IRB Aussie Titles 2009 & 2010. Our Chief Instructor, Sharryn Campbell and her Training Officers, have done an excellent job again this season, with many Bronze, ARC, SRC's, IRB drivers and Crew etc being put through these awards successfully. I received excellent feedback from State Assessors on the quality of training.

Under the guidance of Yvonne Olesinski, the canteen and her faithful band of helpers have once again excelled. Considering what they have to work with and in, they have done an amazing job!

South Port hosted three carnivals this season, 1 Junior, 1 Senior and Senior State Titles. Thanks must go to catering, canteen, patrol, IRB area, work force and water cover. This season has witnessed South Port Juniors, Seniors and Masters at the pointy end of the success stick in many and varied areas of surf sports.

These areas include;

- Surf boats – continue to lead the field. Medals at State and National level.
- Surf ski - an established area of success with an influx of outstanding youth resulting in medals at National and State levels.
- Boards – a larger squad this year which allowed the formation of many relay teams matching it with and beating the best.
- March Past – well, they just keep on being the best around.
- Champion Lifesaver – a relatively new one with some great results. More development next season.
- Swim – we have some amazing swimmers who normally train more than anyone else. A very important part of the Taplin, Cameron and Lifesaver Relays.
- Beach – what a wonderful Senior State Titles at Glenelg under lights. Capped off by Gold Medals in the Open and Under 19 female relay teams.
- International Lifesaving pool competition. The event started at a State level last year and we continued to improve our skills this season with medals at State Titles a testament to this. An unfortunate clash with an I.R.B. carnival meant that our team was split between the two events. This event needs considerable development at club level.
- I.R.B. – this well run group is also up with the best this State has to offer and competes regularly at a National level. The squad has grown recently and the future appears to be bright.
- R&R – a small group of very dedicated competitors were often seen practicing their art at the club through the summer. There were very good results at States.

City of Port Augusta

This year only three crews travelled to Port Augusta for the traditional start of the season's competition. The Snappers took first place and the Snipers third place in the Open Men's Division and the Seagals came second in the Open Women's event to give us a total of \$950 in prize money for the weekend.

Ocean Thunder

After many years of wishing and hoping that a crew or two from South Port could gain entry into this event, the opportunity finally came for both the Men, comprising Ben West, Matt Lee, Jason Cloonan, Gavin Cragg and Jeff Hegarty, sweeping and the Women Crew, with Lisa Biggs, Lauren Priest, Alberta O'Leary, Kate Kryzs and Don Alexander competing. For the men it was hard work, as they had to go through four strenuous qualifying events in order to be able to compete in the four rounds at Dee Why, Sydney, in November, December, January and February.

The ladies were spared of the qualifying and it probably was the difference in the performances of both crews. While the men started well, by January they were feeling the effect of hard training and constant travel and didn't manage to get through any of the qualifying rounds. The ladies improved at each outing and certainly gained a lot of experience and confidence from the competition and managed to get through the qualifying in the last two rounds. No winners or prize money but the Club and the competitors were the winners.

Manly/Freshwater

Again both the men and women crews competed with an interesting day at Manly followed by some big seas at Freshwater, as the fantastic photo that ended the day for the men's crew proves.



Interstates

The Snappers, with Ben West, Matt Lee, Jason Cloonan, Gavin Cragg and Jeff Hegarty, sweeping, represented the State in the SLSA Interstates at Collaroy, coming in fifth place in the boat event

ASRL - Australian Open

South Port had three crews attend the Navy ASRL Open at Wollongong this year; Open Men's, "Snappers", Ben West, Matt Lee, Jason Cloonan, Gavin Cragg and Jeff Hegarty, "Snipers", Angus Boot, Lee Roberson, Ben West, Brett Fisher and Chris Foord and the Under 19 crew "Squid Ninjas", Darcy Warman, Tod McKay, Jordan Softley, Angus Reed, Brian Johns.

We arrived on the Friday afternoon to huge surf and very rough conditions. The decision was made to cancel the Interstate Challenge due to deteriorating conditions. There was a meeting scheduled for 6am on the Saturday morning and it was decided to go ahead with the event, but this decision was rescinded at about 8.30am with the Reserves crews on the beach ready to race. It was decided to move the event to Bulli.

Racing did commence at Bulli at about 11am in fairly ordinary conditions, the Snappers got knocked out of their heats, on the Saturday, the Snipers got through to the Sunday, but unfortunately that was it for them. The Under 19's were held over until Sunday and in their very first race ever the Squid Ninjas acquitted themselves very well in some testing conditions. All in all it was as very disappointing trip generally due to the conditions encountered, but a worthwhile trip for the Under 19's. These Club trips for all competitors are a must if they wish to take the next step in their endeavours.

Masters States

The most successful Masters Titles for a long time for the boats; with one Gold Medal and three Silver Medals.

The women's 160+ crew, of Sharyn Campbell, Mandi Bedford, Mary Carr, Anita Johns, with Brian Johns sweeping, managed to put it all together and win the event. Since the development of ECOsurf and the introduction of an Environmental Committee to the club last year, South Port has had an absolute cracker of a season.

The major highlight of this season was being the proud recipients of Keep Australia Beautiful, Australia's Cleanest Beach Award for 2010. The South Port Noarlunga community also received awards in many other categories including Resource, Recovery and Waste Management, Environmental Innovation and Protection, Water Conservation and Young Legends. We also got a distinction in the Community Action and Partnerships category! This great achievement could have only been made possible by club members doing their part for the environment by reducing their waste through recycling, conserving water, education through the use of posters and ECOsurf and encouraging others to do the same thing.

The partnerships the club has formed with the council, local high schools i.e. Christies Beach High School and environmental groups such as Coastcare also enabled us to win such a prestigious national award. Since winning this award South Port has received much media publicity through Channel 7 Sunrise, Channel 10 News, and The Advertiser and on numerous websites including Surf Life Saving Australia, Keep Australia Beautiful, and KESAB as well as travel and tourism organisations. We are even popping up other surf club promotions in Queensland and New South Wales! Well Done!

The club's environmental committee met on a couple of occasions throughout the season. During these meetings we discussed the possibility of swapping our existing hot water system and replacing it with a solar hot water system. A grant application to the council was made in the hope we get enough money to help fund the project, however the money we did receive was not nearly enough, so for now that project has been put on hold.

We have recently been successful in obtaining a grant from Surf Life Saving Australia, to assist in continuing and complementing some of the water conservation initiatives underway at the club.

Currently we are installing skylights with a grant we received from the council last season, these should be fully installed by the end of June this year and help us save a lot of power through reduced need to put lights on. We are also looking into other grant opportunities to help with funding for connection to the sewer system, which is in desperate need to be fixed.

At the May Board of Management meeting I proposed that a "to do list" should be made so it is possible to see what needs to be done first.

South Port SLSC is now seen as a leader in the use of our environmental initiatives and we need to use this leadership and continue to work together with the community as well as with the partnerships made to carry on 'doing our bit' for 'our patch' and also encourage others to do the same.

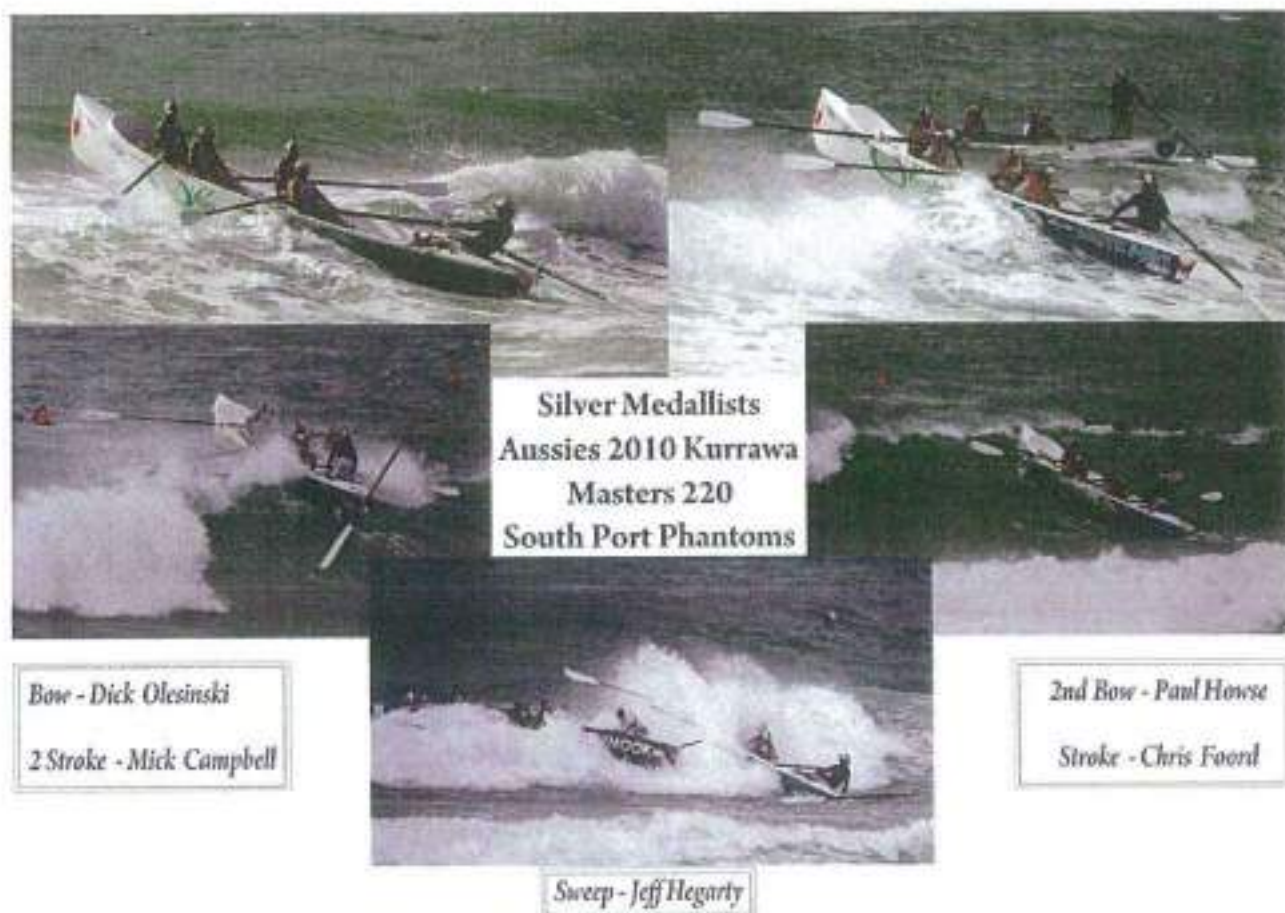

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2010**

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Income Tax

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income) and deferred tax expense (income).

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at reporting date. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

Deferred income tax expense reflects movements in deferred tax assets and deferred tax liability balances during the year as well as unused tax losses.

Current and deferred income tax expense (income) is charged or credited directly to equity instead of the profit or loss when the tax relates to items that are credited or charged directly to equity.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are ascertained based on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets also result where amounts have been fully expensed but future tax deductions are available. No deferred income tax will be recognised from the initial recognition of an asset or liability, excluding a business combination, where there is no effect on accounting or taxable profit or loss.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at reporting date. Their measurement also reflects the manner in which management expects to recover or settle the carrying amount of the related asset or liability.

Deferred tax assets relating to temporary differences and unused tax losses are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the benefits of the deferred tax asset can be utilised.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of manufactured products includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.



In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.


