Procedures of note:



President's Report

This season we experienced a membership growth which is pleasing, especially after a small set back in numbers last season. I think a lot of the increase this year can be attributed to a couple of factors, the school visits by Sue and Sam Goldfinch in the earlier part of the season certainly creates interest out there and the other obvious one is word of mouth. The opportunity to increase our membership is something that must always be one of our premier goals, and we must strive to keep this increase going.

Well now we begin the "quiet" winter months as some would presume, well this is the time of the year that our IRB Competitors hit the water, the Shivering Shags begin, we have four Christies Beach Road Market BBQ's to run, not to mention the Club Annual Dinner and Presentation night, the AGM and things to set in motion for the next season.

So it really is the "quiet" time.

This season has been a busy time for many members with patrols, junior training and carnivals, instructing new award holders, fitness training and competition. For some it is a time for reflection on what could have been, or indeed on what it should have been. Congratulations to all of our members, who have gained new awards, and to all of our competitors Junior and Senior; we have had some outstanding results this year. A special mention needs to be made of Jake McKenzie's efforts at the Australian Titles, to gain a Gold medal in the Under 17 Tube Rescue and follow that up with a Silver medal in the Under 17 Ironman, congratulations Jake, well done. Once again the March past team manage to gain yet another medal; first year for Anita Johns as Coach in her own right, a good effort. I'm sure Ray Burnett will elaborate on the performance statistics. At this point I would like to express my extreme disappointment that the Club could not compete in the Lifesaver Relay at the Aussies through no fault of our own, it's was a case of officials being officious and the Club has sent a detailed complaint to SLSA re this and several other issues that occurred at the Aussies.

The Mid Coast Group continue to meet on a regular basis and share ideas and support one another in our quest for services and assistance from the various bodies that effect our functionality. Once again through this group Dick Olesinski has been instrumental in getting \$10,000 sponsorship from Mobil yet again to be used to purchase patrol equipment and to fund the Nipperthon each year. Dick has also gained the support of the Seaford Central Shopping Centre this season with the help of centre Manager Brian Wadham. Brian has been a long-time supporter of Mid Coast Surf Life Saving and his support is much appreciated again. They have sponsored the reports in the Southern Messenger at the beginning of each month, as well as providing space for displays at the shopping centre; this helps create public awareness for Surf Life Saving in general. Through the prudent financial work of Treasurer Don Alexander, the Mid Coast group has been able to provide \$5000 funding for IRB Equipment each year to the Mid Coast Clubs, this is done on a draw basis, so each Club has its turn.

At the beginning of the season Mike "Bones" Etheridge was diagnosed with cancer and due to his ongoing treatment had to call on Andrew Bedford the Vice Captain to take over the role, thanks to Andrew for stepping up and doing the job for the season. The Club Captain's job is not an easy one, because you are all things to all people, like it or not. The role has become more onerous as the years have gone on and it now entails a 52 weeks a year approach with the constant change in directions of Surf Life Saving and the ever increasing necessity to upload data from the Club to Surfguard and staying on top of the constant bulletins and circulars that are sent out daily. These demands are also placed on the majority of the Board of Management to fulfil their roles.



President's Report

The support of the City of Onkaparinga has again been outstanding and due to the work of Bill McCrae we could be connected via a rising main to take our septic waste off site, this is slowly but surely coming to be a realisation. This is something that we initiated some years ago with a grant through the FMG of \$15,000 to have plans and feasibility studies done by engineers to look at the pitfalls associated with this dream. The costs at that stage were well beyond our capability, in excess of \$70,000. We had a meeting with Bill McCrae earlier this season and this work we had already accomplished was a great asset to Bill and allowed him to advance this project. It is still in the planning stages but things are looking positive and hopefully in the not too distant future it becomes a reality. On behalf of the Club I thank Bill for his efforts with this and many other issues that arise from time to time, it is greatly appreciated.

At the time of writing this report Dick Olesinski has been in constant consultation with Council on the upgrade to our board walk and hopefully by now you will have noticed changes that are underway, this process has been tedious because Council has to deal with many different agencies to proceed in our very sensitive environment. The Council also upgraded our security protection and is in the process of providing a new key system and switchboard.

This year we were fortunate to have given to us a \$20,000 gratuity in the form of a bequest of a past member, George Wortman. George sadly passed away in 2006 and was kind enough to leave us the money in his will. This proved a challenge to obtain and thanks must go to Gavin Cragg for his legal work to see the wishes of George carried through.




Secretary's Report

Membership

South Port finished 2nd in the Senior State Titles behind Grange and ahead of third placed Brighton, and this is a testament not only to our competitors but to Ray's professional approach to his position. As team manager of our touring team to Kurrawa I must commend the team for the manner in which they competed and behaved. To finish 34th in Australia at these Championships with over 200 teams competing was an excellent effort.

Rescues

With another 22 rescues this season, our total numbers of rescues exceeds 800 and this is an average of 16 rescues per year. This is truly an outstanding record. The patrol statistics detailed later in this report show how busy our members have been again this season. Well done to all our Patrols.

In the past two months Karen Lyons and Derek Wix passed away. Both were highly respected, hard working members of our Club whom we will miss greatly. Our deepest sympathy was passed on to both families and a large number of Club members attended both funerals.

Treasurer's Report

Income Statement

Trading income was \$34,886, a big decrease from the previous season of \$50,740. A number of factors contributed to the drop, including adverse weather conditions for scheduled carnivals, no State Titles, an increase in our costs which weren't passed on to our members and a large amount of stock carried over in the clothing area. Next financial year we will have to increase our bar prices to make them more realistic to our costs, but at the same time make it attractive for our members to make use of our bar facilities. To David Watt, who took on the position of Bar Manager; many thanks. The bar takes up a considerable amount of time to organise and keep clean and even though the bar roster does help, it is very demanding and Wai did a great job.

Vonnie Olesinski provided us with a valuable donation of \$4,400 from the canteen and does an outstanding job throughout summer in looking after the members and public with food and beverage and a friendly smile. She has now contributed over \$60,000 in profit over a number of years for the Club. Anita Johns was assisted by Karyn Kelly with the clothing and although there is a considerable amount of stock and some cash not banked prior to 30 April, Anita is confident the profit will improve next season. As has been mentioned in previous reports this is a difficult area to maintain an acceptable level of profitability.

Grants

The Club generally is dependent on Grants and this year is no exception. The City of Onkaparinga continues to support us and the other surf clubs in their area through the Mid Coast Surf Lifesaving Clubs Group. This year we received through SLISA a Grant in support of the National Rainwater and Greywater Initiatives, with MS Campbell & Plumbing completing the work. Recreation & Sport SA provided a grant of \$5,000. SLSSA passed on \$7,000 through their listed company Kahini Pty Ltd (for those unfamiliar with Kahini it is the SLSSA Trust Fund). SLSSA has approved a Distribution of \$4,000 which had not been received at the close of our financial year.

George Wortman, who passed away in 2006, had generously provided to the Club a Bequest of \$20,000.

The Aquatics continues to provide a valuable source of funds for the use of the Club to conduct the training and education of school pupils throughout Adelaide, which this year amounted to \$5,537.

A special thanks to Laura Greer, Donna Boal, Steph Baggalley and Sue Goldfinch, for organising many fundraising events throughout the year that were well supported by the members.

The cost of the canteen renovation was \$8,000, which came out of club funds and a much appreciated donation from the Shags, who also donated money for some additional chairs. All of the labour for the plumbing in the renovation was carried out by MS Campbell & Plumbing, the balance of the work carried out by members.

Having been involved with both the senior and junior side of the club it is pleasing to see the juniors coming up and the quality of the lifesavers joining the senior ranks. Both of our best first year patrol members (Senior and Junior) reflect this.






Total Rescues




Total First Aid

Surf Sport Manager's Report

Ray Burnett

Well, after completing the second year of a two-year tenure in the new position of Surf Sports Manager I have put together the following thoughts and statements.

- In a competition driven club the Surf Sports Manager role is large and diverse. Modern Surf Sports has so many different avenues and disciplines available with the result being a 12 month season without there being a real break for many of the competitors and coaches. It is difficult to maintain a serious commitment to all types of competition available. These include boats, beach, board, ski, swim, I.L.S. pool competition, I.R.B. R & R, March Past, First Aid, Champion Patrol and Champion Life Saver. There are Inter Club States, Interstates [State Teams], National [Aussies] and International [Worlds] competitions. Add to that that we have Juniors, Seniors and Masters.
- The job is too big for one person to have a significant impact in all of these areas so we need to fine tune the communication lines within an improved structure in the 'off season'[if we had one].
- We need to specialise in order to maintain excellence in chosen areas and to help avoid burnout in the personnel involved. This includes administrators and officials. Maintaining excellence may not be on everyone's agenda.
- Serious time and effort needs to be directed towards I.L.S. pool competition. It has rapidly become as important as the traditional events. Inclusion in State and National teams is highly dependent on a high skill level in this discipline. It has become an opportunity to gain an edge on rivals for team selection. South Port has purchased 'dummies' and specialist fins to assist competitors. Fins have become as important as boards and skis and we will need to acquire more. This should start to be introduced at a junior level.
- Development of young coaches has begun in earnest in some areas and we have some very good prospects. These are females and males in their 20's. The season coming will see a real swing towards them stepping up.
- The junior area needs more coaching support from appropriate qualified personnel.
- The club craft storage area will soon be going through a real upgrade allowing easier access and egress.
- Relevant parties should meet before the commencement of each season to review the previous season and set club goals for the next.

We have had some fantastic results again this season [too many to mention all].

- Second at Senior State Titles for two years in a row. This proved that it wasn't only because last year was at home in a decent wave zone. Pound for pound, our guys are clearly the best.
- Nationals in trying conditions at Kurrawa produced a 34th finish out of all the clubs in Australia. We were also the highest ranked S.A. club. [equal with Grange] AWESOME!
- Winning the Life Saver relay at States in a memorable very close finish.
- Bronze medal to the March Past team at Nationals with a relatively new team.
- I cannot finish without mentioning Jake McKenzie's efforts at Nationals. He won Gold in the Under 17 tube swim and Silver in the Iron Person. Many of you will be aware of just how good you need to be to do this at a National level. In particular the iron Person.

Well done to everyone involved and thank you for your help once again. 'We did good'.

Surf Boat Report

Our traditional start to the season for many years has been the carnival at Port Augusta, however last year the Council made some changes to the sports budget and cut their funding for surf boats. Thankfully through the ASRL, the Royal Australian Navy came to the rescue with a major sponsorship towards surf boat rowing in Australia. Our Club received over \$8,000 to support our crews in travelling to the ASRL Navy Open and the South Port/Coopers Classic.

Crews

The Snipers: Angus Boot, Lee Roberson, Brett Fisher, Jason McGaffin and Chris Foord (sweep)

The crew prepared themselves extremely well to perform their best at the pointy end of the season. Not getting caught up in peaking early for the selection trials in November and December; the first major event for the crew was the ASRL Navy Open at Wollongong in early February. They made it through Saturday's racing only to get eliminated in the Quarter Finals on Sunday morning. They followed up that with a win in the inaugural South Port/Coopers Classic race at South Port late February, winning a Carbon Fibre Sweep Oar for the Club in the process.

The State Titles was a repeat of the previous season winning all of their races and gold in the final, although unlike last year with six boats all on the same wave, this year they were clear winners. It was a good solid performance by the crew and they achieved their goal. They were also part of the winning Lifesaver Relay Team and the second place Surf Boat Relay Team. They competed in the Aussies only to have Brett sustain a back injury and be replaced in the last of the round robins by Angus Reed (squid ninjas) and although they failed to make it through to the next round it was fantastic that Angus made himself available so the crew could take part.

They put themselves up for most events again this season, including the selection trials held for the Australian Surf Boat Crew at an event at Stockton NSW, the SLSSA State Team and the ASRL State Team, although missing out on the first two they were successful in the latter. At the ASRL Navy Open they made it through to the third round on Saturday, before being eliminated. In the lead up to the States, Matt was replaced by Ben who went to stroke allowing Tom to move to the number three position. The team competed well at the States finishing a strong second to give the Club a one-two finish in the men's open final, a great result for the Club. They went to the Aussies, and competed through to the third round of the round robin.

The Shooters: Lisa Biggs, Lauren Priest, Kate Liersch, Kate Krzys, Don Alexander (sweep)

Another solid performance from the crew all season with the team selected in the SLSSA State Team, the ASRL SA State Team, and making it to the semi-final in the South Port/Coopers Classic (this is an all in event, men and women combined) in the lead up to the State Titles. At the ASRL Navy Open the crew made it through to Sunday's racing and made the Quarter Finals. After a second in the previous State Titles the crew was hopeful of going one better but it was not to be and they had to make do with another second after being pipped at the post. They were also part of the Surf Boat Relay Team, which came second. The crew also won the SLSSA Premiership Series for Open Women's Boats.

At the Aussies, the crew started well with a first, second and fourth in the round robin to finish 9th in the group. After a few more rounds they made it through to the semi-final. A good start saw them in with a chance of being in the top three to progress but the crew was hit by the large wave out the back and although they recovered they failed to make it through. A big achievement in making the semi-finals, as no other women's crews from SA have gone this far since 1997, the second year of women's boat rowing at the Aussies, so hopefully they can go one better next year.

Third time lucky; Matt Lee drops out of the Snappers crew, we move Tom to number two and Matt in three. Their sweep wanted them to row in open men's, but they all wanted a medal and chose reserve grade for the States. They went on to win all three round robins, semi-final and final, to take out the Gold Medal for Reserve Grade. Someone once said "training and preparation are over-rated". I don't believe it, but it worked with some very special people and Matt's experience and ability to get on really well with the boys.

The second year of racing for the boys with no changes in the crew, a rarity for South Port boat crews, and they certainly built on their previous season's base. They competed strongly all season winning the SLSSA Premiership Series for U19 Boats. They were selected to represent the State in the ASRL Navy Interstate competition and in the ASRL Navy Open made it through to the third round.

At last year's States in their first year they finished fourth and this year they came second with another second as part of the Surf Boat Relay Crew. At the Aussies they made the quarter finals, an excellent result in some difficult surf. As mentioned in the Snappers report, Angus stepped up to help them out at the Aussies and acquitted himself really well in spite of not having any prior rowing with the crew. Thanks to Angus's parents for their financial contribution in assisting the boys with their expenses this season.

Since the development of ECOsurf and the introduction of an Environmental Committee to the club last year, South Port has had an absolute cracker of a season.

The major highlight of this season was being the proud recipients of Keep Australia Beautiful, Australia's Cleanest Beach Award for 2010. The South Port Noarlunga community also received awards in many other categories including Resource, Recovery and Waste Management, Environmental Innovation and Protection, Water Conservation and Young Legends. We also got a distinction in the Community Action and Partnerships category! This great achievement could have only been made possible by club members doing their part for the environment by reducing their waste through recycling, conserving water, education through the use of posters and ECOsurf and encouraging others to do the same thing.

The partnerships the club has formed with the council, local high schools i.e. Christies Beach High School and environmental groups such as Coastcare also enabled us to win such a prestigious national award. Since winning this award South Port has received much media publicity through Channel 7 Sunrise, Channel 10 News, and The Advertiser and on numerous websites including Surf Life Saving Australia, Keep Australia Beautiful, and KESAB as well as travel and tourism organisations. We are even popping up other surf club promotions in Queensland and New South Wales! Well Done!

The club's environmental committee met on a couple of occasions throughout the season. During these meetings we discussed the possibility of swapping our existing hot water system and replacing it with a solar hot water system. A grant application to the council was made in the hope we get enough money to help fund the project, however the money we did receive was not nearly enough, so for now that project has been put on hold.

We have recently been successful in obtaining a grant from Surf Life Saving Australia, to assist in continuing and complementing some of the water conservation initiatives underway at the club.

Currently we are installing skylights with a grant we received from the council last season, these should be fully installed by the end of June this year and help us save a lot of power through reduced need to put lights on.

We are also looking into other grant opportunities to help with funding for connection to the sewer system, which is in desperate need to be fixed.

At the May Board of Management meeting I proposed that a "to do list" should be made so it is possible to see what needs to be done first.

South Port SLSC is now seen as a leader in the use of our environmental initiatives and we need to use this leadership and continue to work together with the community as well as with the partnerships made to carry on 'doing our bit' for 'our patch' and also encourage others to do the same.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2011

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current variations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:

Income Tax

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income). The association does not apply deferred tax.

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at the end of the reporting period. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of manufactured products includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.
