

President's Report

There were a number of rescues performed and many first aid cases attended to. Thanks must go to our patrolling members once again for a job well performed. The popularity of our beach is increasing and no doubt our patrols will continue to play their role on the beach. While thanking these members we must be mindful of the many members of our club that are involved in the Jet Boat, Jet Ski and Helicopter rescue services provided by SLSSA. These members also perform their Club their Club patrolling obligations.

This season our membership decreased slightly over last season which is disappointing and is something that collectively we need to work on, our sustainability is so dependent on increasing our membership. A few years ago Oily initiated a "Bring a mate" campaign that proved to be very successful, maybe this should be implemented in the coming season. It was interesting as a member of the Surf Sports Standing Committee to witness the selection for the venue for the Senior State titles, the Club had not put in an expression of interest to host the event, in fact we rarely do, but to a member of that committee it was a unanimous decision that we have the best venue to conduct the Senior States and duly asked to do so, and we accepted. Once again the surf was up and the conditions perfect and I take this opportunity to thank all our members that took on a role in the conduct of these titles, we received many glowing reports from Officials on the overall conduct of the event.

I would like to thank Ian Boys and Tony McKenzie for their tireless work and efforts throughout the season. Ian also picked up the bottles and cans from the Coast View Motel on a regular basis and it netted quite a deal of money. I wish Karyn Kelly all the best for the coming season as the new Junior Chairperson, Karyn will need all of our support and help to keep the momentum going within the junior ranks. There are several initiatives being mooted by the Youth Development panel at a state level that we need to address and keep up with.

There are many members that I would like to express my appreciation to for their efforts throughout the season, Anita Johns, Sharryn Campbell, award training and the conduct of the proficiency's for all patrolling members, March Past and R & R training and competing, just a quiet season really. Drew Bedford our Club Captain for his efforts this season made especially difficult with his employment taking him to Roxby Downs on a rotating shift basis. Drew was always there when needed managing the patrols and IRB commitments, I thank Adrian Votino and Bernie tanner because they were always on hand when asked. Vonnie Olesinski again this season did an outstanding job in the canteen, besides the hours Von puts in, in the canteen there are many hours spent shopping for bargains. To the Board of Management of South Port my sincere thanks for your work throughout the year, I'm not sure if people really know the workload that is taken on when getting involved in the management of the Club.

The Mid Coast Group of clubs continues to function as a working entity and makes dealing with the City of Onkaparinga a lot easier as they prefer to work through this group. This season the Mid Coast Group has again provided \$5000 to go towards IRB equipment and this season it was out turn. This is done on a draw basis and we were third on the list. Next season the group is looking to change the format of the Nipperthon and involve only the Mid Coast Clubs, and running a team type event for senior competitors as well alongside the junior event. We will need the input of the groups Sports Managers to facilitate this event. The hosting of this event will to South Port, Port Noarlunga and Christies due to the crowds and vehicle situation at Aldinga and Moans. Another initiative from the group is the support and sponsorship from the Seaford Central Shopping centre, organised by Dick Olesinski through his association with Brian Wadham the centre GM. The centre pays for the monthly page for the Mid Coast clubs in the Southern Times for the summer season.




Secretary's Report

Treasurer's Report

Income Statement

The financial year finished with very similar result to the previous year in spite of some rather large increases in some areas of our expenditure. Over the past five years our electricity bill has risen from \$3,300 to just over \$9,000 for a full year. Water costs have also risen dramatically not only for regular use but this year due to a broken line we received an invoice for over \$6,300. We have been allowed a 50% reduction but when you consider that last year our payments for water amounted to \$772, you can see that water and electricity are now a major drain on our finances. While membership income improved over last year, over the last five years our fees have increased by approximately 35%, nowhere near enough to cover our costs. Which makes us extremely dependant on the income from trading particularly the bar and canteen.

Thanks to Graham Joyce and all others who helped him from time to time behind the bar and to Vonnie Olesinski for her great contributions once again in the carteen. Unfortunately Anita John's efforts in the clothing area didn't allow a profitable year; she is not alone in that; the Club has not been able to turn this into an overall profit for the past fifteen years. Along the way there have been some wins but in the main we run at a loss, in fact the cumulative loss over that time has been over \$7,000. Clearly the time has come to take a new approach and I'll leave that up to the new committee to help arrive at a solution.

Grants

The Club generally is dependent on Grants and this year is no exception. The City of Onkaparinga continues to support our Club and the other surf clubs in their council zone through the Mid Coast Surf Lifesaving Clubs Group. SLSSA passed on \$10,000 through their listed company Kahini Pty Ltd (for those unfamiliar with Kahini it is the SLSSA Trust Fund). SLSSA paid a distribution to all Clubs \$4,000.

The Aquatics continues to provide a valuable source of funds for the use of the Club to conduct the training and education of school pupils throughout Adelaide.

There are also a number of current members, who either make donations or arrange for sponsorships from business that they are associated with, that make a big difference to our revenue, many thanks for the support.

It should be noted that the Shivering Shags contributed \$2,500 this year for Club improvements and we hope that the new Patron can continue or better this.

A special thanks to Laura Greer and her group for organising many fundraising events throughout the year that were well supported by the members. Laura is starting to turn Fundraising into a serious contributor to our funding and efforts are much appreciated.




Senior Chief Instructor's Report



Surf Sport Manager's Report

Following up on last year's report, I have reviewed the points made then as per below.

- We haven't been able to maintain a level of excellence in all areas of competition due to the size of our club with the personnel willing to be involved. In order to move forward in some areas we will need help from people not currently involved.
- There has been a slight improvement in the lines of communication between the different areas of competition within the club but this still has a long way to go.
- In the areas we really specialised in, we generally excelled. A great example is the dominance shown by our water competitors at home during State Titles. This dominance in the water came at a cost.
 There were not enough coaching resources to also run a beach programme through the year resulting in a significant loss of points from this area.
- Much more time has been spent coaching I.L.S. pool competition at Seaford Pool sessions and is now just another part of that programme. This should really be introduced seriously at a junior level.
- Young coaches were mentioned also. Shaun, Alex, Brendan and Lauren in particular helped share the load. Thank you to those guys. They are the future.
- · The junior area will need more coaching assistance this season.
- The craft area has been upgraded and the board area will be completed soon.
- As promised, there has been a season review completed. This document is before the Board of Management and will be attached to the newsletter in due course.



EcoSurf State Committee level

Coastal Ambassadors Program

At the start of the season, the state EcoSurf committee successfully ran a Coastal Ambassadors program, which I was lucky to be a part of the development process. This coastal ambassadors program was run alongside the 18-25year old Leadership Development Camp in Kangaroo Island. A group of approximately 10 SLSSA members from Somerton, North Haven, Brighton, West Beach, Seadliff, Henley, Normanville, Moana, Port Elliot and Whyalla were entitled to professional talks and demonstrations from the Kangaroo Island (KI) and Adelaide Mount Lofty Ranges (AMLR) Natural Resources Management (NRM) boards. On completion, Coastal Ambassadors are encouraged to take on a role within their respective club to spread the EcoSurf message link to nipper surf education, Club leadership and management, environmental officer (similar to South Port). We have had encouraging feedback from the participants and we are currently evaluating the program with prospect of holding more coastal ambassador programs in the coming seasons. On behalf of the South Australian EcoSurf committee I would like to thank both KI NRM board and AMLR NRM board, in particular Tony Flaherty and Kristy Manning, for their efforts and contribution to this program.

Coastal Gardens Project

Several clubs along the Adelaide metro coastline have been carefully selected to be representatives for the AMLR NRM Coastal Gardens Project. Somerton, North Haven, Port Elliot, Normanville, Chiton Rocks, Aldinga Bay, Brighton and West Beach surf clubs, as well as Surf Central (SLSSA Headquaters) will be prototypes to new native gardens where planting guides will be put in to show how you can create your own coastal garden. You should be able to see these gardens start to take form in June 2012. South Port's Hooded Plovers!


South Port beach has become a preferred breeding ground for the Hooded Plovers, with two chicks spotted in 2011. Hooded plovers are small beach nesting birds which nest on the sand between the high-water mark and the base of the sand dunes during spring and summer, which is also the busiest time of the year on our beaches. Currently, only 750-800 birds remain in SA, with less than 70 on the Fleurieu coast. Hooded plovers are listed as vulnerable under the National Parks and Wildlife Act, chicks and eggs are at risk from disturbance and trampling when people and their pets visit the beach. Disturbance of nesting adults can also affect the survival of chicks and eggs. People and their pets can unknowingly be their greatest threat.

To help with increasing the awareness of these little birds, the EcoSurf committee arranged with Emma Stephens, Coast Estuary and Marine Officer at AMLR NRM Board, to come down to South Port and give a presentation to our nippers, nipper parents and anyone else who was willing to learn more about our little fluffy guests. The response

to this was great, both nippers and nipper parents really enjoyed it and we look forward to having more guest speaker presentations on other hot topics in the future.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2012

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity,

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report

Ілсоте Тах

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income). The association does not apply deferred tax.

Current Income fax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income. Current (ax liabilities (assets) are measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the tower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of manufacturad products includes direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Overheads are applied on the basis of normal operating capacity. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any appuroutated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful rives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2012

Depreciation

The deprectation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the eshmated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the essociation reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Ay excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately to the income and expenditure statement.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or lass, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trace discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at this end of the reporting period and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.


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
