The Chairperson of an AGM, SCG or BOM meeting has a casting vote only and an unlimited authority on any question of order. The Chairperson will be the President unless an alternate has been appointed.

Change from:

Members who are eligible to vote and are unable to attend an AGM, SGM or BOM Meeting may appoint a proxy to act or vote on their behalf, in writing, signed and dated by the member unable to attend.

Change to:

Members who are eligible to vote and are unable to attend an AGM, SGM or BOM Meeting may appoint a proxy to act or vote on their behalf, in writing (including by email, SMS or Messenger to the Secretary) and dated by the member unable to attend.

Add: Members with voting rights can only exercise their own vote plus one (1) proxy vote only at a BOM, AGM or SGM. Both the member appointing their proxy and the appointed proxy must have voting eligibility. *This was approved by the members at the Sept 2019 SGM.*

Add: Absentee/Electronic Voting. Absentee/electronic voting will be accepted in writing via letter, email, text (SMS) message or via Messenger and shall be sent to the Club Secretary at mail@southportslsc.org.au by the cut-off date specified, which will be no less than seven (7) days prior to the AGM or SGM. Electronic voting will not be accepted if it is not directly sent to the Secretary using the methods listed above and within the specified time frame. All electronic votes will be copied by the Secretary who will bring them along to the meeting to be included when motions are read out and voted on.

A BOM member or other Officer of the Club is not liable to repay any money which that Board member or Officer did not personally receive and misappropriate.

b. The Club shall indemnify each and every Officer of the Club against all damages and costs (including legal costs) for which any such Officer may be or become liable to any third party in consequence of any act or omission in the course of performing their roles as an Officer of the Club, or any act or omission whilst acting on behalf of and with the authority, express or implied of the Club **OTHER THAN** to the extent such damages or costs were caused or contributed to by the relevant Officer's negligent acts or omissions.

The BOM requests permission to spend approx. \$120,000 for the completion of Wearing Street redevelopment scheduled to commence in Feb 2022.

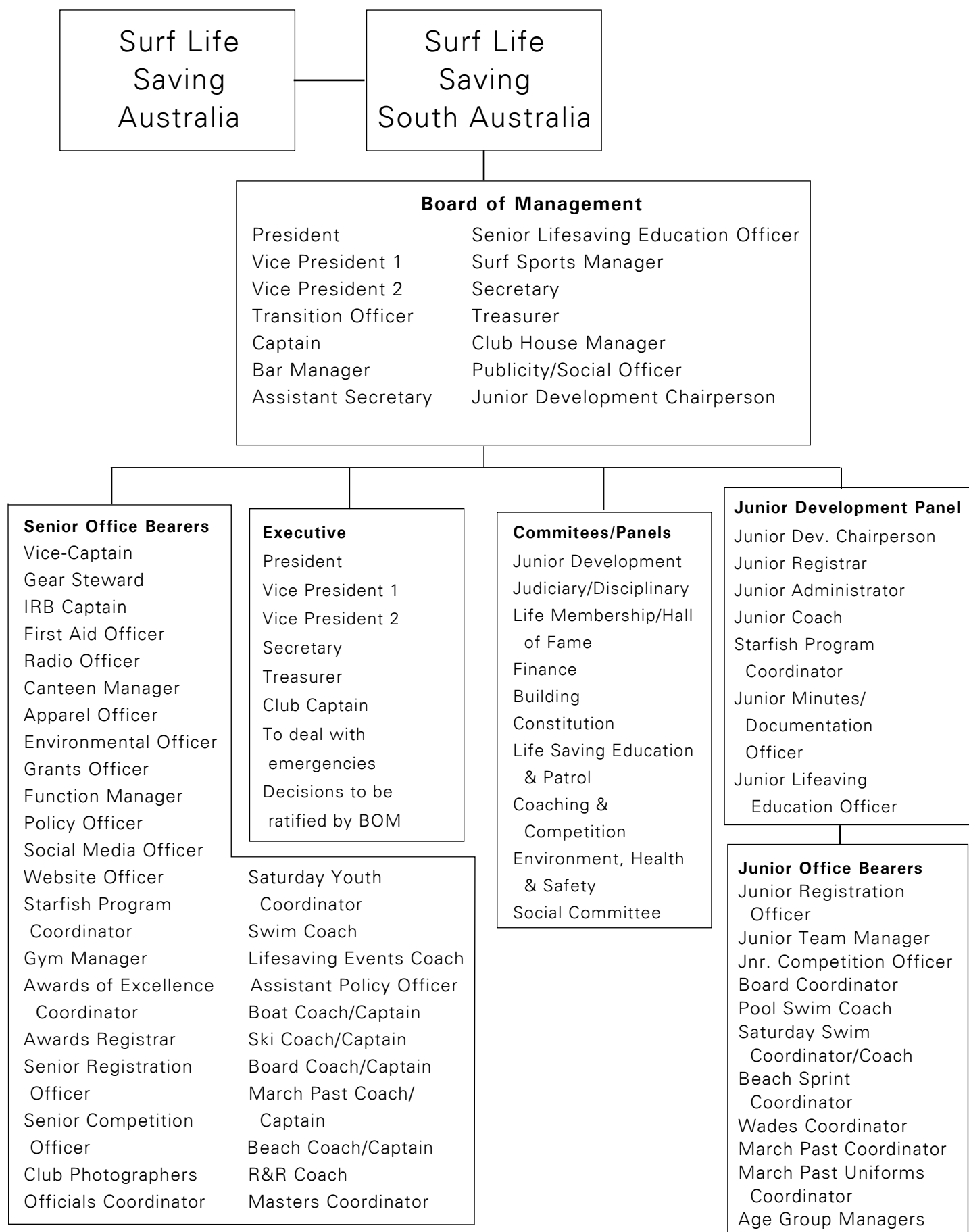

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Richard 'Olly' Olesinski OAM

It is with much pleasure I present this report after another COVID-19 impacted, but highly successful record-breaking season, where again importantly no lives were lost on our beach.

In fact, 17 lives were saved by our members, 454 preventative actions, this being persons stopped from endangering themselves and 48 first aid cases administered.

Many thanks to all our patrolling members that continued to ensure our high standard of patrolling and keeping South Port Beach safe for all swimmers, surfers and visitors.

Wow! What another fantastic record-breaking season it has been for our magnificent and rapidly expanding Club!

We continue to be dominated by the COVID-19 pandemic, but if nothing else, it has taught us to be masters of resilience and flexibility as we navigate through uncertain times that can change at the flick of a switch. It has brought us closer together, despite the physical social distancing requirements and restricted number limits and membership numbers can attest to that.

Last season we broke our membership record to have 487 registered members. In 2020/21 we have completely obliterated that record and have 597 members fully registered! It has been a good year financially for the Club all things considered. Audited financials are based on 1 May 2020 to 30 April 2021.

Cash and cash equivalents increased FY20 \$228,062 to FY21 289,830. I expect a large portion of these funds to be utilised next financial year towards the Wearing Street and Club building projects.

This season, with the help of Anna Fisher, we changed to Xero accounting software and online BAS lodgements. The Chart of Accounts has been tweaked as well as the Auditor changing the allocation of accounts into the financials. I expect next financial year all the accounts will 'line up' nicely.

In particular, a few highlights:

1. Sales: more detailed analysis of income is now provided using Xero, which demonstrates the importance of Bar Revenue.
 - a. Bar: whilst sales were down once again mainly due to Covid-19 restrictions (\$79,452), the bar still made a healthy profit of \$40,428. Thank you to Marsha Smith, the Bar Flies and all the volunteers for making this possible.
 - b. Apparel: Sally Botha has once again done an amazing job of decking out our members in South Port gear to the tune of \$18,933 in sales. Whilst a small loss was made this year (\$1,746), this can be solely attributed to the adjustment of closing stock now being based on cost value rather than sale value. Had we not adjusted this figure there would have been a clear profit. Great job Sally!
 - c. Canteen: another great year for the canteen with sales of \$9,753 and a profit of \$5,572. Well done Donna Logan and Rose Orr!
 - d. Carnivals: The Club hosted a senior carnival as well as Senior State Championships days 2 & 3 Profit from these events were approximately \$13,500. Please note that the carnival/bar/canteen/carnival BBQ figures may be a little skewed as some expenses/profits/stock was shared.
2. Revaluation of Assets [current year balance sheet adjustment]: between August and December 2019 a full audit of Assets was undertaken, thanks to all those who assisted in working through gear, boat and gym sheds. As a result, an update to our insurable values and market value of all assets was achieved. In particular:
 - a. Wearing Street – write down from \$82,671 to \$20,000 – noting that with the approval of the Wearing Street development this will incur a further write down in next financial year.
 - b. Property, Plant and Equipment – write up from \$314,073 to \$464,262.97 – to align SurfGuard/insurable value and to provide a full record of assets it was agreed that a Revaluation of Assets, with no tax impact, was appropriate. Xero is set-up to undertake monthly depreciation and all future assets will be able to be tracked.
3. Fundraising: income for FY21 \$40,629 less COGS \$20,473 – previous years separated income and expenses. The net position is similar. Well done to all involved.
4. Grants: as expected, we did not receive as many Grants but still fared well.
5. Sponsorship and donations: were down this season, however it has been challenging year for many clubs with less opportunity to hold events and functions. Thanks Rebecca Brook and those who were able to support.
 - a. Large sponsors, donations, grants:

6. Sundry Revenue: adjustment to Trade Debtors as at 30 June 2020 to align with known monies owed.
7. Operating Expenses: with the change to Chart of Accounts there is a significant amount of realignment:
- a. Competition: includes Tour Team Expenses, Training and State Team Subsidies and Travelling Expenses, and Carnival Entry Fees (including Juniors)

We have also paid a deposit for a new IRB to be delivered next season. The largest single adjustment to these accounts was the decision to revalue assets as mentioned previously.

This was another successful season due to the commitment of our volunteer lifesavers.

The Club again this year has made a concerted effort to upgrade all of our equipment not only for patrol but for competition as well. There is still more to come!

Thankfully no lives lost, however we still need to be vigilant.

This season we achieved our core objective to ensure zero preventable drownings in our waters. We did this by performing 17 rescues, responding to 48 first aid incidents and undertaking 454 preventative actions. This is a considerable undertaking for our Club and meant that beach goers were able to enjoy our beach and return home safely to their families at the end of the day. Each year the river and river mouth are becoming more popular and for the coming season we will need to adjust the way we patrol by increasing surveillance to these areas.

Each season we see new SRC and Bronze Medallion holders begin patrolling. It is also pleasing to see the commitment and diversity that they bring not only to patrol but the Club in general.

I would like to thank the patrol captains for continuing to lead their teams in challenging circumstances in the face of COVID-19. Thanks also to those who committed to additional patrols. This season again presented some unique challenges.

Again, State Centre came to us to hold Senior State titles. State Centre continually say we do it the best and that competitors prefer South Port. We accepted the challenge, with the Club coming together to hold the Senior States Championships, and what a success it was. Not only did we have some great results across all ages and areas of competition we also made a reasonable profit. Without you, none of this is possible. It was pleasing to see Juniors numbers increasing again this year. This is largely due to the great Junior Committee Panel and the family environment that South Port offers.

Junior States saw some magnificent results with personal bests achieved by all. Along with a bag of medals for the Club.

Juniors are our future and without them no club can survive.

I would also like to acknowledge the commitment of my fellow committee members who have worked tirelessly this season to lay the foundations for the future.

At the Senior State Titles South Port had all areas well represented, coming away with medals in each area. Congratulations to all the medal winners and special mention to the 7 competitors in the board, ski, and swim who won a medal for the first time. A number of the athletes have come through Nippers and worked very hard to achieve these goals.

- Wendy's Kitchen catering for our meals on Sunday sessions and functions.

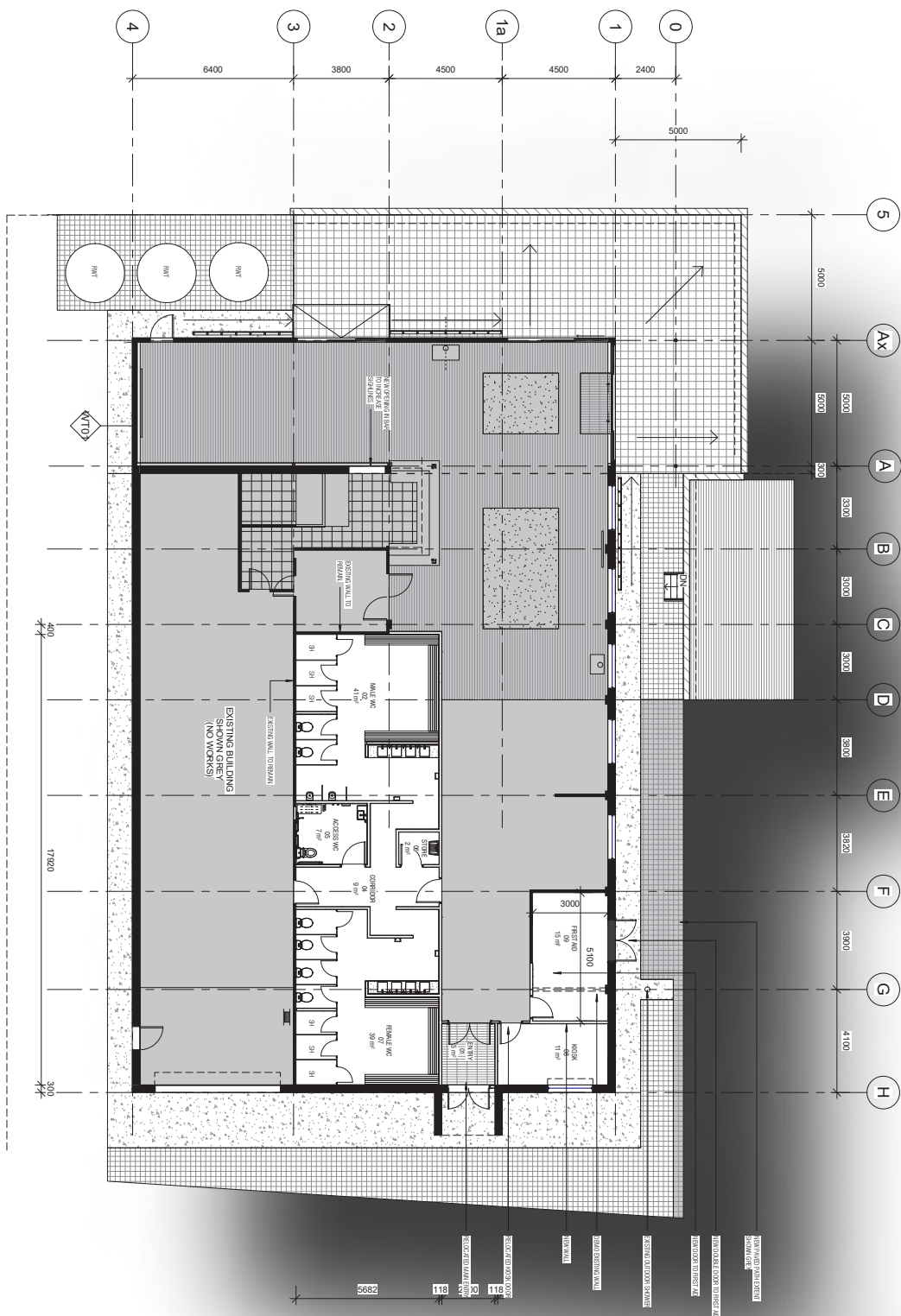

2020/21 saw the Club reducing waste, plastics and green, i.e., food waste. We now have a separate Food Waste Bin in the Club kitchen.

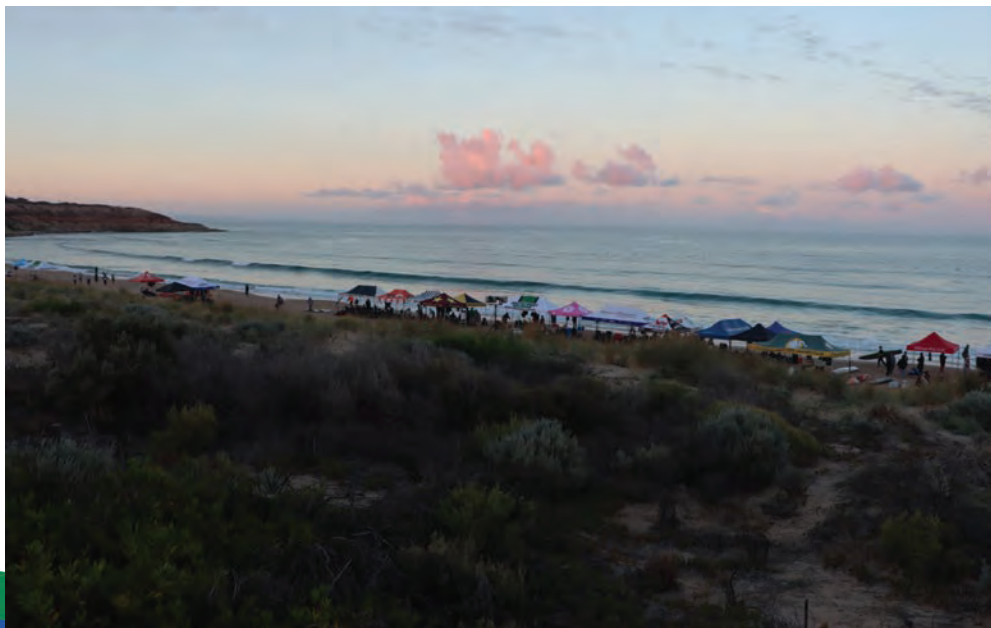
Single use drinks i.e., water in plastic bottles will no longer be available for purchase from our Club.

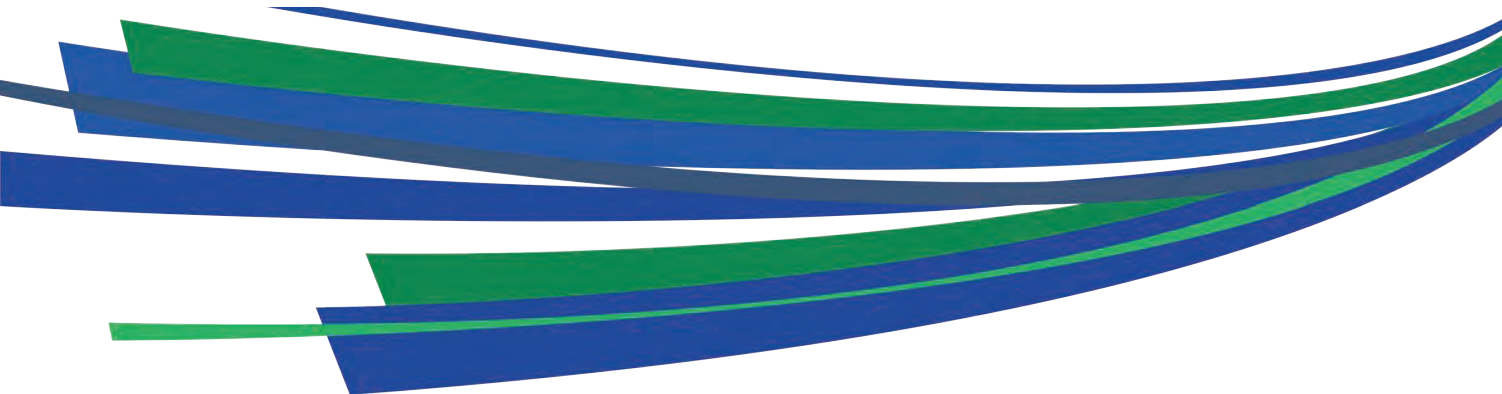

Youth Member of the Year - Leo Oliver

Congratulations to Leo Oliver who took out Youth Member of the Year at the Surf Life Saving State Awards!

Leo Oliver has been a member of South Port since joining in December 2014. He has come through the Nipper ranks as the only boy in his age group of only 6 members the whole way through right, up until under 13's where he finally had another lad join the group. He has a level of maturity and responsibility that far outweigh his 14 years and he has a kind and thoughtful nature and is respectful of everyone around him. It is these qualities that make him popular with his peers and was reflected in them choosing him as our Junior Club Captain last season. He is one of the first members to put his hand up when there is a call for help needed around the Club and although he is no longer a Nipper, he continues to provide mentorship and support to our junior members in many ways. Leo is also extremely helpful inside the Club and is a regular volunteer in our kitchen when we have meals on at the Club. Leo was keen to start patrolling that he completed his SRC training while he was still 12 and sat the exam as soon as he turned 13. He did his first patrol that same day. He completed 51.5 hours in 2020/21, with a number of those hours being water cover for Nippers most Saturdays. He also provided water cover at junior carnivals. He is also a keen competitor who competes in most surf sports disciplines and had a very successful Senior States Titles, winning a bronze medal in the U14 board race and was part of the Gold medal winning under 23 March Past team.

Leo's most important and significant achievement came in December 2020, when he and two other U15 members used the skills they had learnt at the Club to save the life of a snorkeler who had been dragged out to sea in dangerous windy conditions. The calm and controlled manner in which he risked his own life to save another with the support of his mates was extremely brave and was worthy of being deemed SLSSA's rescue of the month for December 2020. It is a gross understatement to say Leo's actions the day of the rescue saved this man's life in such perilous conditions. His commitment to patrolling and the skills he has learned gave him the confidence to handle the rescue in a manner that had a favourable outcome for all involved.

Leo's commitment to supporting our Nippers the way he does has a huge impact on our juniors. They look up to him as a leader of our Club and he is only 14 years of age. He provided fantastic assistance with water safety.

Leo's support around the Club in other areas besides patrols and Nippers is also highly commendable given what he already does at the Club. He is there helping carry equipment on and off the beach whenever it is required and as mentioned, he is a regular helper in the canteen and kitchen. His polite and respectful manner has seen the Club receive quite a bit of feedback from members of the public who cannot sing his praises highly enough for the outstanding service he provides. He is an invaluable asset to us.

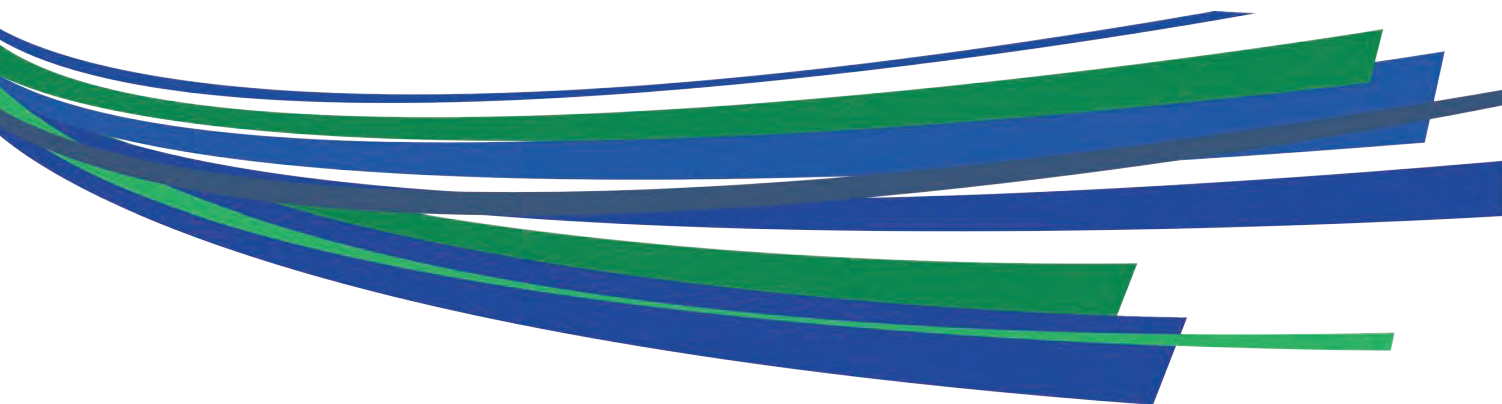



Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all of the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.






