





PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Richard 'Olly' Olesinski OAM

After another COVID-19 impacted, but highly successful record-breaking season, I'm pleased to report that again importantly no lives were lost on our beach.

Over the past busy season, 8 lives were saved by our members, 877 preventative actions, this being persons stopped from endangering themselves, over 400 more than the previous season and 74 first aid cases administered. All this achieved under severe duress with our toilets and changerooms being renovated for most of the season.

Many thanks to all our patrolling members who continued to ensure our high standard of patrolling and keeping South Port Beach safe for all swimmers, surfers and visitors.

As reported in previous seasons, our patrols continue to be challenged with increased local population growth. It's more than evident that many more community members are making South Port their beach to enjoy with beach visitation numbers continuing to increase.

Our patrol statistics continue to substantiate the need for us to be where we are and for ALL of us, managing the challenges to ensure that we remain sustainable into the future.

With again many highlights the past season none of which would have been achieved if it was not for our numerous volunteers.

Major highlights included:

- Continuing to maintain healthy membership numbers with 555 members, which included 149 Junior members.
- Operating successfully with the majority of the season being impacted on by the Club's toilets and changerooms being redeveloped. HUGE thanks to the City of Onkaparinga and Federal Government support to ensure our members and visitors have access to modern facilities.
- Wearing Street gym, emergency services and training area facility nearing commencement for construction.
- The Club's BarFlys continue to work behind the scenes to keep the Club neat and tidy, and stocks delivered – many thanks to all involved.
- Continuing to build on the successful Surf Babies and Little Lifesavers program – a great way of having past members get involved again with their young children.
- Competitively the Club continues to improve greatly, in particular within our youth area. Big thanks to Kylie Cederblad for her guidance of our growing group of senior competitors.

Congratulations to our new bronze medallion recipients and our Juniors continuing their surf life saving journey and completing their Surf Resuscitation Certificates. The Juniors are our future and we look forward to assisting you, particularly through the transition area, again well managed by Aaron Oliver and helpers.

Thanks also to the Board of Management and to all members who took on Committee positions the past season. The Club desperately needs more members to volunteer to help share the workload and I look forward to some new faces getting involved as with new members, new ideas naturally evolve.

Congratulations to all of our competitors, Juniors, Seniors and Masters who continue to wear the South Port cap proudly and did their best in representing the Club. It was pleasing to see members be successful at the Australian Championships and in particular Zalika Cederblad and Sadie Proctor winning a Silver Medal

in the U17 2Km Relay Beach event, the Club's first Australian medal in the beach area. To all our coaches, thank you for your commitment to helping South Port be a well-recognised competitive Club throughout the nation.

Thanks again to Junior Chairperson, Danni Hansen and her team of helpers together with Age Group Managers and Assistants that guided our Juniors throughout another busy season.

Sincere appreciation to our Officials who continue to ensure our members are able to compete. I encourage any of our members, in particular parents, to put their hands up to help in the important area of health and well being activities.

In closing, thanks again to all of our members and sponsors for your support. As a Club, I believe we are well placed to maintain growth to keep South Port Beach safe for all and to continue to be successful into the future.

Well, it was another year of disruption due to COVID-19 though we've managed as a Club to continue to survive and thrive financially, even with my hands on the financial helm!

Audited financials are based on 1 May 2021 to 30 April 2022.

At the end of FY22 we are in a strong position with \$300,323 sitting in the bank and cash equivalents which is a modest increase on last FY21 \$289,830. These available funds continue to position the Club well for future development of our members activities and will cover major expenditure such as the new shed at Wearing Street, which Council say will get underway later this year (hopefully) and upgrade building works around the Club.

The audited accounts included in this Annual Report provide a detailed overview of money in and out for those that are interested in the exacting detail of accountants. For those not so inclined below is a highlight package but noting this report has been written before the audit has been finalised so it is possible some minor adjustments will be made here and there in final numbers if you decide to compare it with the audited report...but you'll still get a good idea where the Clubs money comes and goes!

1. Sales:
 - a. Bar: Sales for the year were \$61,533 and while down once again mainly due to Covid-19 restrictions the bar still made a healthy profit of \$33,065. Thank you to Marsha Smith, the Bar Flies and all the volunteers for making this possible.
 - b. Apparel: Sally Botha has once again done an amazing job keeping South Port ahead in the fashion stakes to the tune of \$19,334 in sales and a profit of \$122. Note that while this may appear a modest profit (which is calculated on standard annual accounting methods... (well the way Bristles did it anyway!) it is worth noting we are currently holding \$11,928 in apparel (at cost) which when sold in the future goes directly to our bottom line as profit.
 - c. Canteen: the canteen operations were greatly curtailed this year due to Club renovations (and COVID) though Donna Logan did a great job providing a small service for Nippers on a Saturday and still managed sales of \$2,385 and a profit of around \$750. (Note the canteen was run in part through bar this year so these breakdown figures may not be exact but you get the idea!)
2. Fundraising: income for FY22 \$17,945 less costs \$8,438 = \$9,506 profit – drop from last year due to COVID restrictions however still making money on fundraising activities (e.g., Nippers bbq/raffle \$5,064, 100 Club, footy tips, wine wall, Sunday sessions \$3,992). Well done all involved.
3. Grants, Sponsorship and Donations: A total of \$76,289 was received this season. This came from both large sponsors and several smaller sponsors being both members and/or friends of the Club. Big thank you to all and make sure you all continue to support the Club sponsors big and small!



MARKETING & SPONSORSHIP OFFICER'S REPORT



- Outside security camera upgrade by the Onkaparinga assets team.




ENVIRONMENTAL (ECOSURF) REPORT



Alex has been a member of South Port Surf Life Saving Club since 1991. He grew up participating in the Nipper program, competing as a Senior/Master competitor and now he is supporting his 2 children through the Nipper Program. He is the Junior Coach, Senior Board/Iron Coach, Coach Mentor and assists with Ski Coaching, active patrolling member (146.50 current season) and Senior/Masters competitor.
